EASTERN BASEBALL ROUTS KEENE TO GAIN LEC SPLIT

Warriors bat around in two innings in nightcap in game stopped after seven innings

MANSFIELD, Conn. – The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team racked up 14 hits off five Keene State College pitchers to post a 15-4 victory in the second game of a Little East Conference doubleheader stopped after seven innings due to the ten-run rule Saturday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Eastern (15-6, 3-2 little east) batted around in the second and fifth innings to back the six-inning effort of senior righty **Matt Fontaine** (**Cranston**, **RI**) as the Warriors gained a split.

In the first game, Keene (11-10-1, 2-2 little east) overcame a three-run deficit by scoring four times in the top of the fifth off three different Eastern pitchers on the way to an 11-8 win, with junior DH Peter Burgio (Bolton, CT) igniting the outburst with a leadoff home run. The Owls scored three times in the inning after there were two out on a two-run single by No. 3 hitter Bobby Doyon (Keene, NH) and a run-scoring single by senior cleanup hitter Anthony Cipolla (Glastonbury) to snap a five-game losing streak at the hands of the defending LEC playoff champion Warriors.

In the nightcap, every hitter in the Eastern lineup had at least one hit and scored at least one run and eight different players drove in at least one run to back Fontaine (3-0), who allowed five hits and four (earned runs) while fanning six and walking six.

In the eight-run second inning of the second game, junior first baseman Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA) scored twice with a leadoff home run and a hit-by-pitch. Junior DH Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY) singled twice and scored once, sophomore catcher Steve Cammuso (Rutland, MA) plated a run with a sacrifice fly and senior second baseman John Parke (Middlefield) and junior rightfielder Tyler Turgeon (Norwich) each stroked RBI doubles.

In the first game, Doyon and Cipolla combined for six hits and five RBI as seven of the Owls' 12 hits off five Eastern pitchers were good for extra bases. No. 8 hitter Greg Bates (Salem, NH)drove in three runs with a sacrifice fly and a two-run double when the visitors tacked on two key insurance runs. In addition to Burgio, senior leadoff hitter Keith Patnode (Keene, NH) homered, while Parke, Schult and Turgeon all smacked home runs for the Warriors, ranked No. 13 nationally and No. 3 in New England.

On the day, leadoff hitter Parke had five hits, including two doubles and a home run, scored five runs and drove in four. Turgeon also doubled twice and homered among his four hits. He scored four times and had two RBI. Senior outfielder **Chris Thomson (Montville)** added four hits and Schult and senior shortstop **Travis Bass (West Hartford)** both contributed three hits and three RBI.

Eastern visits Western Connecticut State University Sunday at 1 p.m. in a Little East Conference game.

EASTERN BASEBALL BOPS SPRINGFIELD BY 28-4 COUNT

Seven players have multiple hits and eight have multiple RBIs in 24-hit assault

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Senior second baseman **John Parke** (**Middlefield**) and junior first baseman **Tyler Turgeon** (**Norwich**) combined for seven hits, seven RBI and seven runs scored to spark a 24-hit attack off five pitchers which carried the No. 13Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 28-4 rout of Springfield College Wednesday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked third in New England and 13th nationally in Division III, Eastern (14-5) unloaded season-highs for runs, extra-base hits (14) and total bases (49) en route to its sixth win over Springfield (9-12) in as many seasons.

The Warriors sent eight batters to the plate it the first inning and nine in the second in racing to an 8-0 lead. An eight-run sixth inning featured five hits and was highlighted by the first of two home runs in the game by Turgeon and a bases-clearing single by junior leftfielder **Robert Perry (Manchester)** (he was thrown out between first and second after falling and injuring himself while running out a drive into the ga). In a nine-run eighth inning, Eastern sent 13 batters to the plate. Five of its six hits were good for extra bases, with Turgeon belting a two-run home run, freshman third baseman **Joe Balowski (Berlin)** doubling twice, and freshman shortstop **Drew Accomando (Monroe)** tripling.

All-America senior infielder **Melvin Castillo (Danbury)** broke his second career record in a week, setting a new standard for total bases. He tied Dwight Wildman's ('04) record of 447 with a two-run double in the second and set a new mark with a one-out single in the fourth. Castillo, already the career home run and RBI leader, has 448 total bases. Castillo has hit safely in his last two games after having a 16-game hitting streak snapped Monday; It marked his 15th game this year with more than one hit and eighth with more than one RBI.

Parke was 4-for-7 (his second four-hit game this year) with three RBI and five runs scored. He had two triples and a double. Turgeon was 3-for-6 with four RBI and two runs scored. He homered twice. Senior outfielder **Chris Thomson (Montville)** hit his third home run in as many games, giving him five home runs in his two-year Eastern career in only 87 at-bats.

Senior lefty pitcher **Mike Tingley** (**Rockvile**) left the game with a no-hitter in the fifth inning (he walked five and hit a batter) and on the long end of a 8-1 lead, falling two outs shy of his second win of the year (pitchers need to pitch five innings of a nine-inning game in order to be credited with a win). Junior lefty **Bill Roveto** (**South Windsor**) pitched 2 2/3 middle innings of relief to gain his second win in as many relief appearances this season.

Roveto is 2-0 in seven career appearances, following his father, Rob, who was 14-0 in his two-year career in the early 1980s which also included a save in the championship game of the 1982 national tournament. Turgeon is the son of Eastern's former shortstop, Mike, who hit 12 home runs in his three-year Eastern career before signing with the Chicago Cubs as their sixth-round draft pick in 1977. Tyler Turgeon played the 2008 and 2009 seasons at Division I Quinnipiac University.

CHURCH DOMINATES MONTCLAIR IN FIRST HOME START

Thomson, Dewing drive in five runs in Eastern baseball's 6-2 victory over Red Hawks

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Freshman righty Benjamin Church (Rochester, MA) pitched a two-hitter over his seven-inning stint in his first home start and Chris Thomson (Montville) and Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA) combined to drive in five run as the No. 13 nationally-ranked Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated Montclair State University, 6-2, Tuesday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

In his third collegiate start, Church (2-0) pitched four hitless innings after givng up a leadoff infield single in the second and a one-out double in the third. He fanned a career-high nine and walked three in the longest stint of his short career.

Thomson homered for the second time in as many games, boasting Eastern (13-5) into the lead for good, 2-1, with a two-run home run that followed a leadoff walk by **Robert Perry** (**Manchester**). Thomson's run-scoring double made it 3-1 in the sixth, Dewing stroked a two-run double to center with two out in the seventh to make it 5-1, and **Jim Schult** (**Wappingers Falls, NY**) came off the bench to belt his fourth home run – a solo shot in the eighth – that pushed the lead to 6-1.

Thomson was the only player with more than one hit, going 3-for-4 to improve his batting average to .400. Dewing now has 32 RBI on 26 hits. Senior All-America **Melvin Castillo (Danbury)** reached base all four times he came to bat with a hit, two walks (one intentional) and a hit-by-pitch. He doubled into the right field corner leading off the sixth and scored on Thomson's double and drew an intentional walk and scored on Dewing's two-out double in the seventh.

Against Church, Montclair (9-7) managed to hit only five balls out of the infield, none over the first three innings. The Red Hawks, scratched out the first run of the game in the second on an infield single by Kevin Bond (Cedar Grove, NJ), walk and infield ground ball. A one-out double in the third by leadoff hitter James Bionde (Pompton Plains, NJ) was the team's only other

hit off Church, who retired 12 straight after that hit until issuing a one-out walk in the seventh to Michael Boggi (Towaco, NJ).

Senior lefty **Wes Dutton (Waterbury)** fanned three over the final two innings to close out the win. He aided his own cause when Montclair was scoring a run in the ninth by picking off a runner and getting strikeouts for the other two outs of the inning.

Eastern stole five bases in the game – at least one coming in all four innings in which it scored runs. The Warriors were caught only once, that coming in the fourth when Thomson overslid second base after leading off the inning with a single.

EASTERN BASEBALL DRUBBED BY WESTERN NEW ENGLAND, 11-6 First-year sophomore pitcher Evan Chamberlain a bright spot for No. 11 Warriors

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team fell behind by nine runs and never fully recovered as Western New England College defeated the Warriors for the third straight season, 11-6, Monday at Trelease Park.

Ranked No. 8 in New England, Western New England (15-4) won for the eighth time in the last nine games while Eastern (12-5) has split four games since returning from Arizona. After losing 36 of the first 38 meetings between the programs, the Golden Bears have knocked off the Warriors the last three times the programs have met.

No. 3 hitter Joe Griglun and lead batter Ryan Dudzinski each reached base four times and each drove in four runs for Western New England, ranked No. 8 in New England. Griglun had two doubles, a single and hit-by-pitch and leadoff hitter Dudzinski had a bases-clearing double in the fourth and also singled, walked and reached on an error.

Senior Chris Thomson (Montville) drove in three runs for Eastern – ranked No. 3 in New England and No. 11 nationally – with a pinch three-run home run in a six-run sixth inning and junior Tyler Turgeon (Norwich) reached safely three times with two hits and a walk and drove in a run. The home run was the first of the season and the third of Thomson's two-year Eastern career.

First-year sophomore **Evan Chamberlain (Hebron)** – the third of five Eastern pitchers – pitched 2 2/3 scoreless innings in his debut, giving up only one hit. Chamberlain allowed a single, sacrifice fly and hit a batter after being summoned in the fourth, but didn't' surrender a hit and allowed only one baserunner over the next two innings.

Western New England junior righty Zach Cloft shut out Eastern over the first five innings and was eventually charged with two runs on three hits before being lifted while the Warriors were batting around in the sixth and scoring six runs on Turgeon's RBI double and Thomson's home run, three walks and a hit batsman. He fanned five and walked five.

MANSFIELD, Conn. – **Chris Cannata's (Southington)** fourth hit of the game drove in the tying and winning runs with two out in the bottom of the ninth inning and lifted the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 7-6 Little East Conference victory over the University of Massachusetts Boston Saturday in the first game of a doubleheader and the Warriors went on to sweep the Beacons at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Two singles and an error loaded the bases for Eastern (12-4, 2-1 little east) in the bottom of the ninth, and with two out, Cannata drove a 2-2 pitch within two feet of a grand slam, the ball bouncing high off the left-center field wall and plating pinch runner **Drew Accomando** (Monroe) and John Parke (Middlefield) with the game-winning runs that kept righty Will Musson (Wethersfield) perfect (7-0) in two years of conference competition.

In the second game, **Melvin Castillo (Danbury**), Parke and **Shane Kingsley (Beacon Falls)** combined for 12 hits, nine RBI and seven runs in a 10-6 victory that was the 1,300th in the career of 42nd-year-head coach **Bill Holowaty** (1,300-478-6).

In the second game, Castillo was 5-for-5 with four runs scored, Parke 4-for-4 with a double, grand slam home run, six RBI and three runs scored, and Kingsley 3-for-4 (he also reached on an error) with three RBI as the trio reached safely in all 13 of its at-bats.

Right-handed starter **Matt Fontaine** (**Cranston**, **RI**) improved to 6-1 lifetime against conference opponents by winning the second game. Fontaine (2-0) pitched six innings, allowing two earned runs on four hits.

One day after blowing a five-run ninth-inning lead in a 9-6, ten-inning loss, Eastern made Musson the complete-game winner when it rallied for its two unearned runs in the ninth inning of the opener. With one out, **Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA)** and pinch hitter Kingsley singled around an UMass Boston (9-8, 0-2 little east) infield error against reliever Tony Damon (San Bruno, CA). Damon got a strikeout for the second out and was up in the count to Cannata before the No. 9 hitter turned on an inside fastball on a 2-2 count and drove it off the wall for his second double of the game.

Castillo and Parke each had two hits in Eastern's 14-hit attack in support of Musson (2-0), who gave up seven hits and only one walk and fanned seven in recording his second career complete game at Eastern.

Trailing 4-2 in the first game, Boston surged in front by scoring three times in the sixth and tacked on an insurance run in the seventh to make it 6-4. Tim Fontaine (Worcester, MA), who hit two solo home runs in the second game, drove in two runs in the three-run sixth with a two-out single.

In addition to Fontaine's two home runs in game two, Drew Tambling (Sterling, MA) socked a two-run home run and finished with two hits and three RBI.

The winningest coach in any sport at any level in New England intercollegiate athletics, Holowaty is the winningest active coach in Division III baseball. He ranks third all-time nationally among Division III baseball coaches, trailing only Gordie Gillespie and Don Schaly. Gillespie won 1,816 games at four different schools over a span of 51 years through **2009**, **while** Schaly carned 1,438 wins over 40 seasons at Marietta College through the 2003 season.

EASTERN BASEBALL PLAYS GIVE-AWAY IN TEN-INNING LOSS TO WESTERN In setback, senior All-America Melvin Castillo becomes program's all-time leader in RBI

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Senior shortstop Scott McNeil's two-out, three-run double in the top of the ninth inning capped a five-run rally for Western Connecticut State University and the Colonials scored three in the tenth on one hit, a walk, two hit batsmen and an Eastern Connecticut State University infield eerror in a 9-6 win in the Little East Conference opener for both schools Friday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked No. 14 nationally, Eastern (10-4, 0-1 little east) had an eight-game winning streak snapped in losing to Western (5-7, 1-0 little east) for the sixth time in 71 meetings in its first home game of the season. Eastern was the pre-season favorite to win the conference after claiming last years LEC tournament title, Western being rated sixth.

Western scored eight of its runs in its final two at-bats. Of the eight runs, three scored after being hit by pitch, two after walks and one after getting aboard on an error.

Until the top of the ninth inning, the game was dominated by starting pitchers **Jim Schult** (Wappingers Falls, NY) of Eastern and Josh Murray of Western. Until the last inning, the only runs allowed by either starter were solo home runs by Eastern All-America senior third baseman **Melvin Castillo (Danbury)** on the first pitch he saw in the fourth and a game-tying shot by Western senior first baseman Dan Baccaro in the sixth.

Eastern broke a 1-1 tie by scoring five runs in the bottom of the eighth to take a 6-1 lead, but Western sent ten batters to the plate in the top of the ninth. Eastern pitchers allowed three hits in the inniing, walked two and hit two. Senior centerfielder Dan Amarante and senior pinch hitter John DiGiovanni drove in the first two runs of the inning before McNeil unloaded a long bases-clearing double to dead center to tie the game. In the tenth, sophomore leftfielder Anthony Ruffo was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to give Western a 7-6 lead and late-inning sophomore infield replacement Tim Nelson plated two more with a single.

With his one-out home run to right-center in the fourth, Castillo became the program's all-time leader with 196 RBI. The home run extended his program record to 41. Sophomore catcher **Steve Cammuso (Rutland, MA)** had two doubles among his three hits for Eastern, while Castillo and junior first baseman **Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA)** each had two hits. Dewing's RBI single drove in the first run of Eastern five-run eighth inning, and Cammuso added a two-run, bases-loaded single.

Senior righty Steve Bainer stranded the tying run at the plate to gain the save for Western. With two outs and two on, he got left-handed-hitting junior **Tyler Turgeon (Norwich)** on a gameending foul fly to the catcher after Turgeon had fouled off five pitches with the count full,

Schult left the game in the ninth with a 6-1 lead after hitting the first two batters and getting a ground ball out. He fanned six and walked only one and gave up five hits and did not figure in

the decision. In his first appearance of the season, the 6-foot-5 inch tired in the eighth after pitching seven strong innings. He allowed only four hits with six strikeouts and only one walk before hitting the first batter of the eighth, then surrendering four consecutive singles with one out after Eastern junior leftfielder **Rob Perry's (Manchester)** bases-loaded RBI single made it 3-1. Senior righty Jeff Gordon of Western hit a batter to force in the third run of the inning, and Cammuso stroked the first pitch he saw into left field for two more runs to make it 6-1.

ANOTHER ROUT COMPLETES EASTERN BASEBALL SPRING TRIP

A 19-5 winner, Warriors average 14 runs in winning final eight games in Arizona

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – For the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team, a fast finish overshadowed a slow start.

Saturday, the Warriors closed out their Arizona spring trip on an eight-game winning streak with a 19-5 thumping of Hamline University at Sagauro High School.

After dropping its first two games in Arizona last week, Eastern (10-3) averaged 14 runs a game in rolling to wins in its final eight games on the spring trip. The Warriors scored at least 13 runs in six of those eight triumphs.

Against Hamline (5-11) No. 8 hitter Joe Cousineau (Newington) and No. 9 hitter Steve Cammuso (Rutland, MA) combined for seven hits, four RBI and four runs scored, John Parke (Middlefield) had three hits and four RBI. Tyler Turgeon (Norwich) had two hits, two RBI and two runs and Melvin Castillo (Danbury) two hits, three RBI, two walks and three runs. Travis Bass (West Hartford) had two hits, three runs and an RBI.

Leading 8-5, Eastern scored 11 runs in its final two at-bats on 11 hits to pull away. The Warriors batted around in each of those innings. Turgeon had two RBI singles and scored two runs in those frames; Castillo reached twice on an RBI single and hit-by-pitch and scored twice; Parke and **Andrew Dyer (Topsfield, MA)** each had two-run singles, and Cousineau had a single double and two RBI.

The second of five pitchers, **Chris Wojick (Uncasville)** won his second game in three decisions by pitching four innings, allowing one run and two hits with two strikeouts and two walks.

Warriors extend winning streak to seven with sweep

MESA, Ariz. – Fourteen different players collected hits and 13 drove in a run or scored one as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rolled over Carleton College, 20-1, 18-2, Friday afternoon at Gene Autry Park.

The wins are the sixth and seventh straight for Eastern (9-3), ranked No. 14 nationally. The Warriors have won their last seven in Arizona since dropping their first two.

Sophomore righty Michael Hepple (Newington) went the first five innings to gain his first win of the season in the opener and first-year sophomore transfer Mitch Furber (Montville) pitched the first four innings of the second game to earn his first win at Eastern. Neither allowed an earned run and each gave up four hits. Hepple struck out seven, Furber none.

Senior outfielder Chris Thomson (Montville)had three hits, five RBI and scored three runs; first-year junior transfer Tyler Turgeon (Norwich) had five hits, five RBI and scored four runs; senior infielder Travis Bass (West Hartford) had five hits, scored four runs and drove in three; senior All-America infielder Melvin Castillo (Danbury) had four hits, scored three runs and drove in two; junior first baseman Andrew Dewing (Swamscott, MA) had three hits, scored five runs and drove in four; senior infielder John Parke (Middlefield) had three hits, four RBI and scored three runs; and junior outfielder Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY) had two hits, scored five runs and drove in one. EASTERN BASEBALL'S 13-HIT ATTACK OVERWHELMS MIDDLEBURY Schult's pitching and hitting sparks Warriors to 14-3 victory over Panthers

CHANDLER, Ariz. – Junior **Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY)** didn't allow an earned run over the first six innings and sparked a 13-hit attack with two hits and two RBI as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team crushed Middlebury College, 14-3, Wednesday afternoon.

Ranked No. 14 nationally, Eastern (5-3) has won three in a row and pushes its record in Arizona over the .500 mark to 3-2 after two opening losses. Now 3-2, Middlebury was coming off a 10-6 win over the University of Southern Maine in its Arizona opener.

The Panthers scored two unearned runs off Schult (1-1) in the second but the Warriors bounced back to tie the game by the fifth, then batted around in scoring six runs in both the sixth and eighth innings to pull away. Senior All-America third baseman **Melvin Castillo (Danbury)** highlighted the sixth with a three-run double that momved him into a tie for third place all-time with 186 runs batted in. He is nine behind Dwight Wildman's program record.

The two unearned runs were all that Schult would allow over the first six innings before junior righty **Chris Wojick (Unasville)** pitched two scoreless innings and sophomore righty **Andrew Petrucci (Branford)** was touched for an unearned run in the ninth. Schult fanned eight and dwalked four while Wojick struck out two without a walk as the Warriors improved to 4-0 this year against New England opponents.

Schult had two hits, including a double, and two RBI and senior second baseman John Parke (Middlebury) had two hits, both of them doubles, and scored three runs. Castillo, junior first baseman Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA) and senior rightfielder Chris Thomson (Monville) also contributed two hits each.

In addition to serving up 13 hits, seven Middlebury pitchers walked seven, threw three wild pitches and hit two batters. There were also two Middlebury passed balls.

Through eight games, Schult is batting a team-leading .519 with six extra-base hits and 12 RBI; Thomson is at .444, Castillo at .424 with 12 RBI and five extra-base hits and Dewing at .419 with a team-high 20 RBI and seven extra-base hits.

EASTERN BASEBALL SCORES IN SEVEN INNINGS IN 13-5 VICTORY Freshman Ben Church allows only one (unearned) run through first five innings

CHANDLER, Ariz. -- Freshman righty Benjamin Church (Rochester,MA) pitched five strong innings for his first collegiate win in his first collegiate start and senior shortstop Travis Bass (West Hartford) and Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY) combined for seven hits, seven runs and four RBI as the No. 6 Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team routed Williams College, 13-5, Monday afternoon.

Eastern (4-3) evened its record in Arizona at 2-2 in defeating Williams College (1-2) for the third time in two years in Arizona. Williams had split a doubleheader Sunday against No. 11 University of Southern Maine, like Eastern a member of the Little East Conference.

The Warriors collected 15 hits off six Williams pitchers, scoring runs in seven of nine innings. Eastern totaled ten of its runs in its final five at-bats.

Church (1-0) allowed only one unearned run through the first five innings before being lifted after walking and hitting the first two batters he faced in the sixth. Church departed with a 7-1 lead and was ultimately charged with three runs, one of which was unearned. In his third career appearance, the 6-foot-2 inch righty fanned one and walked five.

Schult, now batting .500, contributed to runs in the first five innings when Eastern scored. He hit a two-run home run in the first -- his third of the season and 14th of his career -- singled when Eastern added a run in the third, moved a runner to third with a fly ball when the Warriors scored a run in the fifth, singled and scored in a three-run sixth, and drove in two runs with a double in the seventh. Schult was 4-for-6 with four RBI and two runs scored – his fourth game with at least two hits this season. Bass, who came on to pitch a scoreless ninth, was 3-for-5 and scored five runs -- one shy of the program game record.
