Kingsley has four hits, Turgeon extends hitting streak to 17 straight in 6-2 victory

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Senior **Chris Wojick (Uncasville)** pitched the first five innings for his fourth win in as many decisions and senior first baseman **Tyler Turgeon (Norwich)** extended his hitting streak to 17 with two hits and two RBl to power the No. 7 nationally-ranked Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 6-2 non-conference victory over Salve Regina University Thursday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Eastern (16-3) pulled away from a one-run lead by scoring twice in the seventh inning on a leadoff home run by senior leftfielder **Rob Perry (Manchester)** and RBI single by Turgeon, and added an insurance run in the eighth on an RBI single by senior centerfielder **Shane Kingsley** (**Beacon Falls**).

Wojick (4-0), who ranks third all-time at Eastern with 68 pitching appearances, allowed seven hits and two runs over the first five innings. He fanned four without a walk and hit two batters.

With four hits, Kingsley recorded his fourth game this year of at least three hits to raise his batting average to .356. Kingsley led off the Eastern first with a single and scored the first run of the game on senior DH **Jim Schult's (Wappingers Falls, NY)** sacrifice fly, doubled with two out in the second and in the fourth and stroked his RBI single in the eighth. Kingsley had his four hits against three different pitchers.

The first of Turgeon's two RBI singles in the first extended his hitting streak to 17. Perry and senior catcher **Chris Cannata** (**Southington**) also had two hits each in Eastern's 12-hit attack. In addition to his first-inning sacrifice fly, Schult reached safely three times, scored twice and stole three bases to make him 11-for-11 this season. Schult doubled to lead off the third and scored, walked leading off the fifth, and walked and scored in the seventh. His double was the 199th hit of his four-year career.

Trailing 3-0, Salve scored both of its runs after there were two out and none on in the fifth to trim the Eastern lead to one on consecutive hits by the top three hitters in the order: senior shortstop Alexander Melcher, sophomore rightfielder Devin Flynn, and senior third baseman Tom Glynn before Wojick got a ground ball to freshman shortstop **Danny O'Connell** (**Braintree**, **MA**) to strand the tying run at second.

Eastern fielded without an error for the seventh time this season and upped its season total to 20 double plays with four. In the first, sophomore third baseman **Joe Balowski (Berlin)** fielded a ground ball to begin an around-the-horn double play, and Kingsley caught a fly ball and doubled off a runner at second in the fourth before pitchers **Andrew Merritt (Norwalk)** and **Evan Chamberlain (Amston)** induced comebackers to initiate 1-6-3 twin killings in the seventh and eighth innings, respectively.

MERRITT PITCHES EASTERN TO 5-4 VICTORY OVER BABSON

Sophomore surrenders one earned run in seven innings; Turgeon hits in 20th straight

MANSFIELD, Conn. - Sophomore righty **Andrew Merritt (Norwalk)** allowed only one earned run over seven innings and senior **Robert Perry (Manchester)** and sophomore **Drew Accomando (Monroe)** each drove in two runs in a four-run fourth inning that lifted the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 5-4 win over Babson College Monday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

The win is the seventh straight for Eastern (19-3), ranked No. 1 in New England. The game was the eighth of eighth of nine straight home games for the Warriors. Babson (20-9), in the midst of a stretch of eight games in seven days, is ranked No. 3 in New England.

Making his second career start, Merritt (2-0) allowed eight hits while fanning seven and walking two in a career-high seven innings before departing on the winning end of a 5-4 lead. After junior righty Evan Chamberlain (Amston) pitched a scoreless eighth, first-year sophomore transfer Mike Riemer (Ellington) stranded the tying and go-ahead runs in scoring position by striking out freshman Chris Warren to end the game to earn his second save. After retiring the first two batters of the ninth, Riemer hit cleanup hitter Chris Kucher, who then advanced to third on a single by sophomore Conor Kortmann. Pinch runner Joe Nixon then took second on defensive indifference before Riemer struck out Warren on a game-ending 1-2 pitch.

Merritt, a first-year transfer, loaded the bases in the first without an out but worked out of the jam by striking out two batters and ending the inning on a ground ball to short. Leading 1-0, Merritt gave up a game-tying solo home run in the fourth to Kortmann before Eastern touched complete-game loser Trevor MacNeill (Hanover, MA) for four runs in the fourth after there were two out on four this and two walks. Batting ninth, Accomando plated the first two runs with an opposite-field single to right, and Perry drove in two more with a two-run single to left-center to make it 5-1.

Babson cut the deficit to one run with three unearned runs in the sixth and seventh on a total of three hits (two infield hits), a walk and infield and outfield errors. Sophomore Trevor Boyce's infield single plated the first run and two scored on a dropped outfield fly ball.

Perry, Accomando, senior **Tyler Turgeon (Norwich)** and junior **Steve Cammuso (Rutland, MA)** each collected two hits off MacNeill (3-2), who allowed only one other hit in the game. A junior lefty, MacNeill fanned two and walked two in his first complete-game effort of the season. Turgeon extended his hitting streak to 20 games with a leadoff single in the second.

No. 3 hitter Billy Miller had three of Babson's ten hits, with senior Dave Ahern, Kortmann and Boyce each adding two. Kucher scored twice.

Four pitchers combine on seven-hitter in 3-1 win; Turgeon hits safely in 21st straight game

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Senior righty **Chris Wojick** (**Uncasville**) pitched five scoreless innings for his fifth win without a loss and senior first baseman **Tyler Turgeon** (**Norwich**) extended his hitting streak to 21 with a second-inning single

as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team won its eighth straight game, 3-1, Thursday afternoon in a Little East Conference game against Western Connecticut State University at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked No. 1 in New England and No. 7 nationally, Eastern (20-3/5-0 Little East) finishes 8-1 in a stretch of nine straight home games before playing its next seven game on the road. Western (10-10/2-3 Little East) had a four-game winning streak ended in dropping its 67th decision to the Warriors in 73 games in this series.

Ranked No. 7 nationally, Warriors commit four errors that lead to six unearned runs

MANSFIELD, Conn. – On the day the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team was rewarded with a No. 7 national ranking on the heels of an eight-game winning streak, the Warriors gift-wrapped a 12-9 victory to Manhattanville College Tuesday afternoon in the homeopener at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Having fielded at nearly .970 through the first 14 games, Eastern (12-3) committed four errors that led to six unearned runs as the Warriors kicked away a 7-2 lead in losing to Manhattanville (10-4) for the first time in five games in this series.

The loss comes two days after Eastern had posted a perfect 8-0 record in Arizona that lifted it into the No. 1 ranking in the first New England poll and No. 7 rating in the first ABCA national poll, and vaulted it from 24th to 13th in the fifth weekly D3baseball.com national rankings.

Trailing 7-2, the Valiants stunned Eastern with a six-run fifth inning. A leadoff error got things going for the visitors, and junior first baseman Chris Nardozzi applied the key blow with a bases-clearing double that cut the Warriors lead to 7-6. Nardozzi later scored the tying run on an RBI single by sophomore catcher Johnny LoVetere and a ground ball plated senior second baseman Alex Braverman with the go-ahead run.

Eastern answered by tying the game with a run in the bottom of the inning on senior rightfielder **Shane Kingsley's (Beacon Falls)** two-out RBI double, but the Valiants snapped an 8-all tie by scoring four times in the ninth on five hits and Eastern's fourth error of the game. Four consecutive singles followed the first out of the inning.

Batting eighth, freshman shortstop **Danny O'Connell (Braintree, MA)** drove in four runs for Eastern with a two-run triple in Eastern's five-run second and two more in the third with a single that upped the Warriors' lead to 7-2. Senior DH **Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY)** led Eastern with three hits to improve his average to .458, with Kingsley, senior first baseman **Tyler Turgeon (Norwich)**, sophomore third baseman **Joe Balowski (Berlin)** and O'Connell all had two in Eastern's 13-hit attack.

In his first start at Eastern, first-year sophomore righty **Andrew Merritt (Norwalk)** did not allow an earned run through the first four innings before a hit, two walks, and a sacrifice fly led to his undoing in Manhattanville's six-run fifth. Sophomore righty **Matt Purnell (Stafford Springs)** was the most effective of five Eastern pitchers. Purnell was inserted as the third pitcher in the fifth and pitched 2 2/3 innings without allowing a hit and only one walk. He fanned four.

MESA, Ariz. – Senior rightfielder **Tyler Turgeon (Norwich)** became the seventh player in Eastern Connecticut State University baseball history to hit for the cycle in pacing a 24-hit attack as the Warriors opened an eight-game Arizona trip with a 22-4 victory over Springfield College Saturday evening at Gene Audry Park.

Leading 6-1, Eastern (4-2) broke the game open by chasing senior lefty Mark Grant (1-1) by scoring ten runs on seven hits in the sixth en route to its seventh straight win over Springfield (5-2). The Warriors sent 14 batters to the plate in the sixth and collected seven hits and were aided by three walks and a hit batter. In addition to Turgeon in that inning, sophomore second baseman **Drew Accomando (Monroe)** had two hits with a single and an RBI double and scored twice.

In the game, Turgeon drove in four runs and scored four and also walked in five plate appearances. He doubled and scored in the second, walked in the fourth, singled and had an RBI triple and scored twice in the sixth and hit a two-run home run in the seventh. He becomes the fourth player in the last five years to hit for the cycle.

Batting 7-8-9 in the order, Turgeon, Accomando and freshman **shortstop Danny O'Connell** (**Braintree**, **MA**) combined for 11 hits and ten RBI and scored nine runs in the game. O'Connell matched Turgeon with four this. He was 4-for-4 with three RBI and two runs and Accomando had three hits (two doubles), three RBI and three runs scored.

The four-hit game was the third in the last 24 games for Turgeon, a second-year transfer from Quinnipiac University. With four multiple-hit games this year, O'Connell leads the club with a .579 batting average (11-for-19) and in RBI with seven, and Accomando has a team-high eight runs scored.

Four Eastern players recorded their first career hits at Eastern: sophomore Chris LoRusso (Stamford) and freshmen Brendan Lynch (Wethersfield), Ben Richards (Northbridge, MA) and Mitch Plourde (Ellington).

Senior righty **Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY)**, the last player to hit for the cycle two years ago against Chicago, won his 11th career game in 12 decisions as the first of three Eastern pitchers. Schult (2-0) allowed three runs and eight hits in six innings, fanning five and walking one and leaving with a 16-3 lead. In his debut, freshman lefty **Jose Santiago (Windham)** pitched a 1-2-3 ninth inning with a strikeout.

Eastern faces No. 7 Johns Hopkins University Saturday at 12:30 p.m. ET at Snedigar Park in Chandler.

EASTERN BASEBALL'S RALLY FALLS SHORT IN 4-3 SETBACK

Against Farmingdale, Warriors scrap back from early deficit to put tying run aboard in ninth

FARMINGDALE, N.Y. – The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rallied for two runs in the top of the ninth but couldn't push across the tying run in a 4-3 non-conference loss to Farmingdale State University Sunday afternoon.

Trailing 4-1, Eastern (3-2) scored twice in the ninth on two walks, a wild pitch and RBIs from sophomore third baseman **Joe Balowski (Berlin)** and freshman shortstop **Danny O'Connell (Braintree, MA)** but couldn't push across the tying run. O'Connell was thrown out stealing after driving in freshman first baseman **Mike Vaccarelli (Wolcott)** with a two-out single to end the game.

Senior righty **Jim Schult (Wappingers, Falls, NY)**, junior righty **Michael Hepple (Newington)** and sophomore righty **Matt Purnell (Stafford Springs)** combined on a four-hitter in 6 2/3 innings of relief but the Warriors couldn't bounce back from a 4-0 deficit after three innings. Making his first start of the year, junior righty **Mitch Furber (Oakdale)** was lifted with one out in the second inning after walking three and allowing four hits and two runs. Schult got a strikeout and fly ball to leave two runners aboard in the inning Eastern's four pitchers walked ten and hit a batter. Two of those runners eventually scored.

Eastern was limited to eight hits (seven singles) by junior righty C.J. Bula and senior lefty J.R. Lott, who did walk seven batters. Lott took over for Bula with two out in the eighth and two runners aboard and got a fly ball to center to end the threat and keep Farmingdale's (6-6) three-run lead intact.

Balowski and O'Connell each had two hits and drove in a run while senior catcher **Chris Cannata** (**Southington**) doubled and singled and scored a run. The multiple-hit game was the third straight for O'Connell, now batting a team-leading .467. Schult is 6-for-11 in the last three games after starting the season 0-for-6. The hits were the first of the season. Senior outfielder **Shane Kingsley** (**Beacon Falls**) walked twice in the leadoff position but was stranded at second both times. Vaccarelli's run in the ninth was the first of his career.

The win is only Farmingdale's second in seven games this year against New England opponents. The Rams are e 2-3 against Little East Conference teams after splitting with Eastern (the Warriors won 8-3 Saturday) and losing twice to the University of Southern Maine by lopsided scores this weekend and defeating Keene State College, 5-1, eight days ago.

Eastern faces Springfield College Friday at Gene Autry Park at 6 p.m. ET in Mesa, AZ in the first of eight games in nine days in Arizona.

Dimon (2-0), who pitched the last two seasons at Community College of Rhode Island, pitched 6 1/3 innings and allowing only three hits and two runs Saturday. He walked eight and fanned two and left with a 6-2 lead. Dimon outdueled Farminigdale junior righty Chris Phelan (2-1), who entered the game unbeaten with a 1.06 ERA and 13 strikeout in 17 innings.

Eastern (3-1) never trailed in the game and scored four times in the sixth to snap a 2-2 tie. Eastern tied the program record with three triples in the inning from senior DH Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY), senior first baseman Andrew Dewing (Swampscott, MA) and sophomore second baseman Drew Accomando (Monroe). Accomando then tripled down the right field line to plate Cammuso and freshman shortstop Danny O'Connell (Braintree, MA) successfully sent home Accomando with a suicide squeeze to make it 6-2.

Junior righty Evan Chamberlain (Amston) pitched 1 2/3 hitless innings in relief of Dimon, fanning two and walking one.

Schult was 3-for-4 with a double, triple, stolen bases, two runs scored and an RBI. Senior leftfielder Robert Perry (Manchester) and O'Connell each had two hits.

Phelan gave up nine of Eastern's 12 hits over the first six innings. He fanned six and walked one and was charged with six runs.

It is the third straight season that the Warriors have collected three triples in an inning. Bottom of Eastern order accounts for six of team's seven hits against Cougars

UNION, N.J. -- Eastern Connecticut State University senior centerfielder **Joe Cousineau** (**Newington**) scored the team's first run and drove in the go-ahead run in the top of the fourth but the Warriors were limited to seven hits in dropping their season-opening baseball game to Kean University, 5-3, Sunday afternoon at Jim Hynes Stadium.

Ranked N. 4 nationally in the pre-season, Kean (4-0) won its fourth game this season in five days, defeating No. 26 Eastern (0-1) for the third straight time and fourth time in five contests in this series. Eastern is a four-time national champion, Kean the 2007 national titlist.

Kean sophomore righty Kevin Herget (1-0) pitched his first career complete game in his ninth career start, striking out ten and walking only one in his first start of 2011. As a freshman, Herget was 7-1 with a 4.38 ERA a year ago for the 39-12 Cougars, seeded second in the 2010 NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional Tournament.

After singling and later scoring Eastern's first run on an error in the top of the third inning, Cousineau, put the Warriors up 3-2 in the fourth with an RBI single. With Eastern trailing 2-1 entering the inning, junior catcher **Steve Cammuso (Rutland, MA)** tripled with one out and scored on a wild pitch. Sophomore shortstop **Drew Accomando (Monroe)** and first-year junior transfer second baseman **Angelo Buscemi (Marlboro, NY)** followed with singles ahead of Cousineau's RBI single. The hit was the first in the Eastern career of Buscemi, who had two hits in two years at the Division I level in 2009 and 2010.

Kean led 2-0 on two doubles and an Eastern throwing error before Eastern senior righty Jim Schult (Wappingers Falls, NY) retired a batter in the bottom of the first. After the Warriors tied the game in the top of the fourth, Kean scored the tying and go-ahead runs in the bottom of the inning against junior righty Michael Hepple (Newington), who sustained the loss despite retiring only one batter. Both runs were driven in on a single by by Kean sophomore shortstop Nick Ramagli before junior righty Evan Chamberlain (Amston) was summoned to get an inning-ending ground ball double play.

Denied his tenth career win, Schult was the first of six pitchers used by Eastern. Sophomore righty **Matt Purnell (Stafford Springs)** and first-year junior righty transfer **Jim Dimon (Seymour)** made their Eastern varsity debuts without allowing a run. Purnell walked one without allowing a hit and Dimon gave up two hits and two walks with one strikeout.

Cammuso, Accomando, Buscemi and Cousineau – the bottom four hitters in the order – combined for six hits and an RBI and scored all three of the team's runs.
