ECSU ELIMINATED FROM NCAA NATIONAL BASEBALL TOURNAMENT Montclair State advances to finals with 5-0 triumph

BATTLE CREEK, MI -- Freshman lefty T.J. Costello and senior righty Frank Dippold combined to hand Eastern Connecticut State University its first post-season shutout since 1975 as Montclair State College advanced to the NCAA Division III National Baseball Tournament final with a 5-0 victory Monday.

Montclair (36-11) is the lone remaining unbeaten club in the original field of eight and needs one win Tuesday over Wis.-Oshkosh (28-14) to win its second national title. Oshkosh has one loss and needs a pair of wins Tuesday to win its second national title.

Eastern (29-11-2), managed 11 hits off Montclair pitching but stranded 13 runners and hit into three double plays in finishing in a tie for third in its seventh national tournament showing. The Warriors won national titles in 1982 and 1990.

Junior righty Keith MacDonald (2-2), making his first postseason appearance this year for Eastern, allowed only five hits before being chased in the sixth but walked five, hit a batter and threw a wild pitch. Three of the four runs scored off MacDonald were scored by runners who were walked.

Montclair, which has beaten ECSU four times in five post-season meetings with Eastern, scored twice in the first on RBI hits by Mike Micucci (double) and Ralph Yezza (infield single) and made it 4-0 in the sixth by scoring two runs after there were two out and no one on base. MacDonald alked two batters and gave up an RBI single to Butch VanDunk before giving way to freshman righty Bob Aronson.

Costello (4-3) allowed eight singles while fanning three and walking five before being replaced by Dippold, who recorded the final four outs to gain his tenth save of the year, sixth in post-season play.

Senior catcher Lou Lanni had three hits for Eastern, sophomore shortstop Joe Funaro adding two hits and a walk and senior second baseman Jose Soler two hits. Junior centerfielder Rob Hausmann had a hit and walked twice.

ECSU STAYS ALIVE IN NCAA NATIONAL BASEBALL TOURNAMENT Warriors defeat Anderson 9-7; One of four teams still alive

BATTLE CREEK, MI -- Senior righthander Matt Sosnowski of Meriden limited Anderson University to four runs in his longest career outing to help lift Eastern Connecticut State University to a 9-7 victory in an elimination game of the NCAA Division III National Baseball Tournament Sunday.

The win is the second in as many days after an opening loss in this double-elimination tournament for Eastern (29-10-2), one of four teams still alive in the original field of eight. Anderson, making its first national tournament appearance in its first year affiliated with the NCAA, finishes at 31-15.

The Warriors face Montclair State College Monday, regardless of the outcome of the Red Hawks' Sunday night winners' bracket game against Wisconsin-Oshkosh. The starting time of the Eastern-Montclair game is dependent upon the outcome of that game, however.

Against Anderson, Eastern scored four times in the fifth inning to take a 7-1 lead but had to hold on as the Ravens closed a 9-1 gap with three in the eighth and three in the ninth.

Sosnowski (3-1) gave way to junior righty John Gieras with a 7-3 lead with two outs and a runner on in the eighth. Gieras got a ground ball to end the eighth but gave up three runs in the ninth -- two coming on all-America Chris Hoeppner's two-run home run -- before fanning Neal Harper with a runner on first.

Sosnowski, who had never pitched more than six-and-one-third innings in his two-year Eastern career, allowed only one run on six hits through seven innings before tiring in the eighth. He fanning three and walked two.

Eastern scored a pair of unearned runs in the second on John Giudice's leadoff double, two errors and a walk and made it 9-1 with four runs in the fifth, one in the sixth and another in the seventh.

Giudice keyed the four-run fifth with a two-run home run -- his seventh of the year -- while sophomore Joe Funaro and senior Mike Susi also contributed RBI singles.

Giudice finished with two hits, two RBI and three runs scored while Funaro had his first two hits of the tournament and two RBI. Susi scored two runs.

Anderson, the Mideast Region champion, committed six errors which led to only two unearned runs, thanks to three double plays. It left nine runners on base.

Junior righty Keith MacDonald (2-1, 3.69) is expected to make his first post-season appearance as the starting pitcher against Montclair State. The Red Hawks defeated Eastern 7-4 May 1 at Willimantic.

SUSI SHUTS OUT CALIFORNIA LUTHERAN 1-0 IN BASEBALL NATIONALS Soler single in ninth plates only run as Warriors stay alive

BATTLE CREEK, MI -- Senior right-hander Mike Susi of Waterford handed California Lutheran University its first shutout in 164 games Saturday in lifting Eastern Connecticut State University to a 1-0 win in an elimination game at the NCAA Division III national baseball tournament.

Eastern (28-10-2) remains alive in the eight-team, double elimination tournament and will face the loser of Saturday's winners' bracket game between Montclair State College and Anderson University (7:30 p.m. start) Sunday at 3:30 p.m.

Lutheran (32-9), the nation's No.-1 ranked team throughout the regular season, is eliminated after losing two games in a row for the first time in 148 games. The Kingsmen had beaten ECSU 13-3 March 25 the UC-San Diego Invitational and La Jolla, CA. ECSU avoided losing its first two games in seven national tournament appearances.

Susi stranded nine Kingsmen in scoring position (ll in all) and relied upon numerous standout defensive plays -- including two by leftfielder James Core in the ninth -- to post his third straight complete game victory in the team's last eight games.

Senior second baseman Jose Soler, batting .200 in post-season play, stroked a two-strike RBI single to left in the top of the ninth inning to break the deadlock. Soler, the No.-9 hitter, drove in senior catcher Lou Lanni from second base with his first hit of the game, off Lutheran reliever Louis Birdt.

Eastern, which left the go-ahead run on third base with one out in the eighth, chased starter Mike Winslow in the ninth, eventually handing the senior all-America righty his first loss in nine decisions.

Lanni walked to open the ninth and moved to second on a wild pitch with one out. Junior first baseman Mike Guillet walked on four pitches, the final pitch coming from Birdt. Birdt got two quick strikes on Soler before giving up a line single to left which easily scored Lanni.

"I knew if I got a run, I wasn't going to give one up," said Susi.

The shutout by Susi was the program's first nine-inning one since Rusty Greene blanked Aurora 4-0 in the third round of the 1990 national tounament on May 27 of that year.

Susi equalled his career-high with ll strikeouts while walking seven, two intentionally. He allowed only six hits, four of which were doubles. He gave up back-to-back hits only once, those coming in the fourth on singles.

A bruise on his right wrist suffered in last week's New England Regional tournament had made Susi questionable for pitching duty Saturday.

"The wrist bothered me (Saturday) morning but it wasn't really that bad once I got on the mound," said Susi, who lowered his ERA to 1.47 in six northern appearances and to 2.19 in seven games overall. "I just gutted it out. I wasn't going to let it bother me," added Susi, who threw 162 pitches. "As the innings went by, I knew they couldn't touch me."

Susi, who allowed hits to only two of the final 22 batters, got a pair of diving catches from Core in left in the ninth to preserve the win, the first coming at the base of the fence to rob leadoff batter Carlos Cardenas for the second out.

Lutheran, which featured eight seniors in its starting lineup and a .337 team batting average, was foiled time and again by an ECSU defense which has made eight double plays in five postseason games.

In the second, Lanni gunned down Scott Sebbo attempting to steal second after scooping the ball backhanded out of the dirt; in the third, Susi picked Cardenas off second base following the latter's leadoff double and prior to an enusing double; in the fourth, Susi got Eddie Lample to hit into an inning-ending double play, started by sophomore shortstop Joe Funaro; in the fifth, senior third baseman Richie Clegg's diving stab of a line drive off the bat of Rawley Jacobson stranded the go-ahead run on second; in the sixth, Funaro stranded the go-ahead run on second when he came up with a bad-hop ground ball off the bat of Lample and fired to Guillet.

"The defense did it again," noted Susi, "but the play Richie Clegg made was the most spectacular, unbelievable play I've ever seen. We knew they (Lutheran) could hit the ball -- they're a great team. The balls they made outs on were hit hard."

Seven players had one hit each for Eastern. Every player except Lanni and Guillet struck out, as Winslow and Birdt combined for 12 strikeouts.

Senior righty Matt Sosnowski (2-1, 2.40), who started and won the New England Regional title game against Southern Maine 5-3 last Saturday, is expected to open on the mound Sunday.

ECSU BEATEN 8-4 IN OPENING ROUND OF NATIONAL BASEBALL TOURNAMENT Oshkosh wipes out four-run deficit, scores six in seventh

BATTLE CREEK, MI -- The University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh wiped out an early four-run deficit, scoring sixth runs in the seventh inning, to defeat Eastern Connecticut State University 8-4 Friday in the opening round of the NCAA Division III National Baseball Tournament.

The loss drops Eastern (27-10-2), the New England regional champion, into a losers' bracket game of the eight-team, double-elimination tournament Saturday against the loser of the Ithaca California Lutheran game. That game was scheduled to begin at 5:30 p.m. Friday.

Junior righty Dave Chiasson allowed only four hits through five innings and took a 4-0 lead into the sixth. In the sixth, Tim Jorgensen hit a two-run home run to cut the Oshkosh deficit in half and the Titans (26-13) took control with six runs in the seventh on six hits and a pair of ECSU outfield errors.

Junior righty Chad Kopitzke (7-2) overcame a shaky start to post his eighth complete game in as many starts for the Midwest Regional titlists. Kopitzke, who had surrendered only three earned runs and 17 hits in 51 innings up north (0.53 ERA), allowed only one of the final 13 batters he faced to reach, and that runner was erased on a double play in the seventh. Kopitzke allowed nine hits while fanning six. He did not walk a batter while hitting one.

Joe Funaro and John Giudice drove in runs with ground balls to stake Chiasson to a 2-0 lead and Mike Guillet's sacrifice fly plated Richie Clegg (leadoff double) to make it 3-0 in the fourth. The Warriors upped the lead to 4-0 in the fifth on Giudice's RBI double.

Jorgensen, whose play was limited this year due to off-season shoulder surgery, hit his second home run of the season to right with one out to make it 4-2 in the sixth. Brian Bott reached safely to open the inning when his bad-hop ground ball to second hit Jose Soler in the face.

Jorgensen finished with three of his team's 12 hits, complementing his home run with a key RBI single in the seventh.

The Titans chased Chiasson in the seventh. Chad Kubiak singled to open the inning and advanced to second when leftfielder James Core misplayed the ball. Chiasson was lifted in favor of junior righty Sean Robertson (3-0) after Brent Pattridge moved Kubiak to third with a sacrifice bunt.

Making his first pitching appearance in two weeks, Robertson gave up an RBI single to No.-9 batter Kevin Ulwelling to make it 4-3, then gave way to freshman relief ace Bob Aronson after giving up another single and a walk to load the bases.

Jorgensen greeted Aronson with a single to right, two runs scoring when the throw to the plate got past senior catcher Lou Lanni. Leading 5-4, the Titans added three more on Aaron Richartz' two-run double over the bag at first and a bouncing RBI single up the middle by Craig Lieder.

Lieder and Kubiak each had two hits for Oshkosh, which did not commit an error.

The loss was ECSU's first to Oshkosh in three decisions in national tournament play. The Warriors had defeated the Titans 7-4 in the second round en route to the 1990 national title here.

The six runs matched the most allowed by ECSU in one inning this year.

ECSU SENIOR MIKE SUSI NAMED BASEBALL ALL-AMERICA Waterford resident named second team utility

BATTLE CREEK, MI -- Eastern Connecticut State University senior Mike Susi of Waterford was named the 33rd baseball all-America in the program's history when he was selected to the NCAA Division III second team by the American Baseball Coaches' Association (ABCA) Wednesday.

Susi, a two-time first-team all-New England choice, was named at the utility position. He has played outfield, designated hitter and served as a right-handed pitcher this year.

In 38 games this year, Susi is batting a team-leading .390 with six home runs, 35 RBI and a team-leading 93 total bases. On the mound, Susi has won five of six decisions with a 2.72 ERA -- second among starters. Up north, Susi is 5-0 with a 1.85 ERA in 34.0 innings.

Last weekend, Susi was named Most Outstanding Player at the NCAA Division III New England Regional Tournament. In three ECSU wins, he had three hits, four RBI, a double and home run and threw a complete-game two-hitter in a 4-1 second-round win over UMass/Dartmouth.

Susi becomes the program's 28th NCAA Division III all-America since 1976. Last year, the program did not have an all-America choice for only the fourth time since 1976.

In his 76-game, two-year ECSU career, Susi is batting .385 with 15 home runs and 75 RBI. His average is the third-highest career one in the program's history. On the mound, he has won nine of 11 decisions with a 3.54 ERA in 81.3 innings.

The Warriors, 27-9-2, open play here Thursday in the double elminination NCAA Division III National Baseball Tournament Thursday at 1:30 p.m. against Midwest Region champion Wisconsin-Oshkosh.

SUSI HITS, PITCHES ECSU PAST UMASS/DARTMOUTH

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. - Senior Mike Susi of Waterford drove in three runs with three hits -- including the 100th of his career -- and tossed a complete-game four-hitter as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated the University of Massachusetts at Dartmouth 7-2 Tuesday.

The game was the final one for ECSU (2-3-2) in California and the win gave the Warriors third place in the four-team tournament.
