ECSU BASEBALL WINS LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP Warrirors sweep Rhode Island College to take second regular-season title

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Senior outfielder **Jon Krot (KILLINGLY)** and freshman shortstop **Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA)** each had five hits and senior catcher **Anthony Formato (BRIDGEPORT)** drove in four runs as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team clinched the Little East Conference regular-season title with 16-2, 13-6 wins over Rhode Island College Saturday.

Eastern (29-10) completes the conference regular season with 12 wins in 14 outings -- one game ahead of Massachusetts Dartmouth and the University of Southern Maine.

Against RIC, Krot was 5-for-8 with four runs, Tempesta 5-for-6 with three runs and two RBI and Formato 2-for-6 with four RBI and three runs. Tempesta's hits give him 55 this year -- the most by a rookie since Sean Risley recorded 62 in 1983. Senior DH **George Davis (PROCTOR, VT)** was 4-for-5 with a pair of home runs in the nightcap. Davis finished the regular season with 12 home runs -- equalling the most in a season since Basilio Ortiz in 1991.

Eastern hosts the six-team, double elimination Little East Conference tournament Thursday-Sunday at its new stadium. Eastern, UMass Dartmouth, Southern Maine and Plymouth State -- the top four finishers in regular-season play -- drew first-round byes. In Tuesday's play-in games, fifth-seeded UMass Boston hosts eighth-seeded Western Connecticut State University and sixth-seeded Keene State hosts seventh-seeded Rhode Island College. The winners advance to Thursday's play.

Pairings and times for the tournament will be announced Monday.

ECSU BASEBALL RALLIES TO DEFEAT SPRINGFIELD COLLEGE 9-4 Scores eight in final three at-bats to record program's 1,000th win

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored eight runs in its final three at-bats to rally past Springfield College 9-4 Wednesday and record the 1,000th win in the program's 50-year history.

Trailing 4-1, Eastern got one back in the sixth, took the lead 6-4 with four in the seventh and added three insurance runs in the eighth off complete-game loser Craig Persiani (5-3).

Freshman righty **Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI)** earned his first win since April 10. Chadwick improved his record to 5-2 after relieving starter **Adam Murphy (LEBANON)** after consecutive one-out home runs in the fourth. Chadwick faced one batter in the eighth, giving up a single, before junior righty **Scott Chiasson (NORWICH)** got the final six outs in saving the team's second straight win. It was his fifth save of the season and 13th in two years.

Senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini (OXFORD)** and senior DH **George Davis (PROCTOR, VT)** each drove in runs in the seventh and the Warriors picked up four hits in the eighth, freshman shortstop **Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA)** tripling in the first run and scoring on a double by junior third baseman **Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA)**. Lungarini drove in his second run of the **MARLBORO, MA**.

Tempesta was 3-for-5 and scored three runs while senior leftfielder **Jon Krot** (**KILLINGLY**) was 2-for-4 with two runs, and store we bases. Krot also stole two bases to move within one of tying the single-season steal record of 35. Lungarini was 2-for-5. With his third hit, Tempesta became the first ECSU freshman to record as many as 50 hits in a season since Basilio Ortiz had 50 in 1989.

The wins snaps a season-high two-game losing streak for Eastern (27-10), which recorded its 1,000th victory against 448 losses and five ties.

TUFTS SCORES SEVEN RUNS IN SECOND, HOLDS OFF ECSU Warriors strand five in final three innings in 9-6 baseball loss

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Brian Symmons and Joe Surprenant each drove in two runs when Tufts University scored seven runs in the second inning -- six coming after two were out -- in a 9-6 baseball win over Eastern Connecticut State University Monday.

Eastern drops to 26-10 with the loss while playing its fifth game in three days. Tufts is 17-13.

The Jumbos had seven hits – four in succession – and scored seven runs in the second to take a 7-0 lead before ECSU battled back, scoring two in the seventh and one in the eighth. Suprenant's second home run of the season with two out and a runner aboard in the second gave Tufts a 3-0 lead and Symmons followed later with a two-run single to give the Jumbos a 6-0 lead and chase ECSU freshman starter **Bill Cook** (NORTH KINGSTOWN, RI).

Trailing 8-3, Eastern scored twice in the seventh on RBI singles by freshman shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) and senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini (OXFORD**) but stranded two runners. In the eighth, the Warriors scored another to pull to within 8-6 on Tempesta's third RBI hit of the game but again left two. Senior rightfielder **JonGersz (WALLINGFORD)** had an RBI single in the fifth inning as he became the seventh player in program history to record as many as 200 career hits.

Symmons drove in four of Tuft's runs, plating runs in the seventh and ninth with sacrifice flies. Lead off hitter Dan Morse was 2-for-4 and scored three runs for the winners while clean up hitter John Flack was 2-for-5 with two RBI coming in the second.

Tempesta finished 3-for-5 with three RBI and two runs while leadoff hitter **Jon Krot (KILLINGLY)** was 2-for-5 and senior centerfielder **Steven Rembisz (VERNON**) 2-for-4 with two runs scored. Krot tied an ECSU record with four stolen bases in the game.

Mark Marengi (5-5) fanned ten and allowed nine hits to gain the win while Zack Brown went the final two innings to earn his first save.

ECSU, SOUTHERN MAINE SPLIT BASEBALL DOUBLEHEADER Warriors, Huskies trade one-run Little East Conference decisions

GORHAM, ME — Junior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) and senior second baseman Chris D'Amato (BRISTOL) combined for five RBI in the first game as junior right-handed pitcher Scott Chiasson (NORWICH) picked up his fourth save as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team edged the University of Southern Maine 7-6 in the first game of a Little East Conference doubleheader Sunday.

Southern Maine (21-14, 9-3) earned a split by winning the nightcap 8-7. The hosts built a 7-1 lead in the second game before ECSU (26-9, 10-2) battled back, scoring two in the ninth but leaving the tying run on second base.

Eastern remained atop the conference standings, leading Southern Maine by one game. Both teams have two regular-season conference games remaining.

In the first game, junior righty **Brian Rivers** (**BRIDGEWATER**, **MA**) worked into the seventh inning to gain his fifth win against two losses, allowing five hits and five (earned) runs while fanning seven and walking three. Chiasson, who had pitched ten and two-thirds innings in a 4-3 loss to Plymouth State Saturday, was summoned with one out and runners on first and third and ECSU leading 7-5 in the ninth. Chiasson got a fly ball to left for the second out but walked two batters to force in a run. A ground ball to D'Amato at second base ended the game.

Podlesney, who collected his 100th career hit with a fifth-inning single in the first game, was 2-for-4 with three RBI in the opener while D'Amato was 2-for-3 with two RBI and a run scored. Senior outfielder **Bunty Ray (BRISTOL)** was 3-for-5 with two runs scored.

In the nightcap, Greg Michaud hit a two-run home run in the fifth as the hosts took a 7-1 lead. ECSU got three back in the sixth on an infield error and two ground ball outs. With ECSU trailing 8-5 in the ninth, Podlesney's third hit of the game drove in D'Amato and an error plated a second run before senior catcher **Anthony Formato** (BRIDGEPORT) was retired on a ground ball to end the game with two runners aboard.

In the second game, Podlesney was 3-for-4 with two RBI and senior outfielder **Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD)** was 2-for-5.

Eastern, ranked second in New England, host Tufts University Monday at 7 p.m.

ECSU BASEBALL SPLIT LITTLE EAST BASEBALL DOUBLEHEADER Warriors belt eight home runs in second-game win over Plymouth State

PLYMOUTH, NH -- Senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini (OXFORD)** became the seventh baseball player in Eastern Connecticut State University history to hit three home runs in a game as the Warriors collected 15 extra-base hits in a 23-11 Little East Conference win over Plymouth State College Saturday in splitting a doubleheader.

In the first game, junior righthanded pitcher **Scott Chiasson (NORWICH)** pitched into the 11th inning in his second career start but Plymouth (15-15, 5-5) spoiled the effort in a 4-3 win. The Panthers tied the game 3-3 by hitting back-to-back home runs to open the ninth inning and George Gauthier's two-out RBI single plated Jason Blye from third base with the tie-breaking run in the 11th.

Chiasson, who had pitched seven innings in his first career start last Saturday in a 7-2 home win over Keene State, fanned seven and walked four. Chiasson finished one out shy of equalling the record for innings pitched in a game set by Gary Kinel against Keene State May 9, 1970.

With the wind blowing out in the nightcap, Eastern (25-8, 9-1) torched three Plymouth pitchers for eight home runs and seven doubles. Behind Lungarini, senior outfielder **Jon Krot (KILLINGLY)** hit his first two home runs of the season and senior DH **George Davis (PROCTOR, VT)** hit his ninth and tenth of the season -- the most since Basilio Ortiz totalled 12 en route to national Player-of-the-Year honors in 1991. Senior outfielder **Bunty Ray (BRISTOL)** also homered for Eastern, which finished one home run and two total bases shy of the single-game record set May 3, 1982 against Western Connecticut State University. ECSU had 57 total bases yesterday.

Krot was 5-for-7 with four RBI in the nightcap while Lungarini, Davis and senior outfielder **Jon Gersz** (WALLINGFORD) each had four hits. Lungarini and Davis each had five RBI.

Eastern visits second-place University of Southern Maine Sunday for a 1 p.m. doubleheader. Southern Maine is 8-2 in the conference, one game behind ECSU. Both teams have four conference games remaining.

MURPHY'S SIX-HITTER LIFTS ECSU BASEBALL OVER TRINITY Junior lefty blanks Bantams over final eight innings 6-1

MANSFIELD, Conn. — Eastern Connecticut State University junior left-handed pitcher Adam Murphy (LEBANON) limited Trinity College to six hits in recording his first career complete game as the Warriors posted a 6-1 baseball decision Wednesday.

The win is the 24th against seven losses for Eastern, ranked second in New England and 13th nationally. Trinity (18-8), ranked seventh in New England has lost five of its last seven.

Murphy (5-1) took over the team lead in wins with the triumph, his first career complete game in 12 starts. Murphy held the Bantams scoreless after giving up a two-out first-inning home run to No. 3 hitter Christian Burchfield. Murphy, who fanned six and walked only two, never allowed more than one hit in any inning.

Eastern managed only six hits off Trinity's Christian Sheehan (2-3), who also went the distance, but put together three of them in scoring three times in the fifth to improve upon a 3-1 lead.

Senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini** (**OXFORD**) knocked in four of ECSU's runs with a sacrifice fly in a two-run fourth and a three-run double in the fifth.

ECSU junior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) hit his sixth home run of the season in the second to tie the game 1-1 and the Warriors took the lead for good with two runs in the fourth. Senior rightfielder Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) led off the inning with a walk and while stealing second base, hustled all the way home when the throw from Trinity catcher Jake Miles sailed into center field. Lungarini's fly ball to center plated Podlesney, who had walked.

Eastern closes out regular-season Little East Conference play this weekend, visiting Plymouth State College Saturday for a doubleheader and defending national chmpion University of Southern Maine Sunday for two.

ECSU BASEBALL ROUTS FRAMINGHAM STATE 15-0 Lance Podlesney leads 17-hit attack with 5 hits, 4 RBI

FRAMINGHAM, Mass. – Junior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) boasted his season's average to a team-high .454 by going 5-for-6 as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team routed Framingham State College 15-0 Tuesday.

Podlesney led a 17-hit attack as the Warriors upped their overall record to 23-7, 15-3 up north with their sixth win in as many tries against Framingham (13-10-1).

Podlesney, this past week's Little East Conference Player-of-the-Week, stretched his current hitting streak to eight games (17-for-29, .586). He has hit safely in all but four of the 28 games in which he has appeared this season. Against Framingham, he scored twice, stole two bases and drove in four runs with an RBI single and a two-run double in a ten-run fourth and an RBI single in the sixth. His current batting average is one point higher than the ECSU single-season record, set by Brian Mercado in 1990.

Senior leftfielder **Bunty Ray** (**BRISTOL**) reached safely five times with three singles and two walks. He also stole two bases, scored three runs as the leadoff hitter and drove in one. Senior **DH George Davis** (**PROCTOR**, **VT**) added his team-leading eighth home run of the year leading off the second while senior rightfielder **Jon Gersz** (**WALLINGFORD**) drove in three runs with a two-run single and bases loaded walk in the fourth.

Freshman righty Bill Cook (NORTH KINGSTOWN, RI) combined with two relievers on a five-hit shutout. Cook fanned four and walked two in winning his fourth game against one loss.

Eastern, ranked second in New England, hosts seventh-ranked Trinity College (18-7) Wednesday at 7 p.m. in the first scheduled night game. Junior lefty Adam Murphy (LEBANON), a winner of four of five decisions this year, is the expected starter.

UMASS DARTMOUTH EDGES ECSU BASEBALL 6-5 Ronavne highlights six-run fifth inning with grand slam

MANSFIELD, Conn.— The University of Massachusetts Dartmouth baseball team scored all six of its runs in the fifth inning — freshman Brian Ronayne snapping a tie with a two-out grand slam to dead center — as the Corsairs edged Eastern Connecticut State University 6-5 Sunday.

UMass Dartmouth (19-7), ranked third in New England and 22nd nationally, salvanged the final game of the three-game set. Eastern (22-7), ranked second in New England and ninth nationally, swept Saturday's Little East Conference doubleheader 9-7, 16-5. Sunday's game was a non-conference one.

Trailing 2-0, the Corsairs chased ECSU freshman righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) in the fifth. After the first two batters reached safely, Chadwick was relieved by ECSU junior righty Scott Chiasson (NORWICH) with a 1-1 count on No. 9 hitter Manny Santo. Chiasson (3-1) fanned Santo but gave up an RBI single to leadoff hitter Jeffrey Cross and walked cleanup batter Eric Alberto with the bases loaded and two outs to force in the tying run. Ronayne, who was fanned twice by Chadwick earlier in the game, drilled Chiasson's 1-0 delivery over the 407 mark in straightaway center field to give UMD a 6-2 lead.

Eastern, which lost for only the second time 12 home games, chipped away with a run in the sixth on senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini's** (**OXFORD**) second RBI hit of the game (a single) and pulled to within 6-5 with two more in the eighth after there were two out and no one on base. Senior centerfielder **Steven Rembisz** (**VERNON**) plated the first run with an RBI single to left and the second run scored when No. 9 hitter **Chris D'Amato's** (**BRISTOL**) fly ball off UMD reliever Steve Pereira was dropped in shallow right. Pereira, however, left the tying run on third by retiring the side on a ground ball to shortstop and survived an inning-opening error leading off the ninth — leaving the tying run at second base — to record his first save.

Cross, Patrick Schultz and Alberto each had two hits for UMass while Lungarini and senior catcher Anthony Formato (BRIDGEPORT) each had two for Eastern. Formato also reached twice on walks. Senior rightfielder Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) drilled his fifth home run of the year leading off the fourth to give ECSU a 1-0 lead and Lungarini made it 2-0 with a double after an error allowed junior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) to reach safely. It was Podlesney's double which had set up Lungarini's RBI single in the sixth.

Bob Haskins (4-1) pitched into the seventh inning to record the win for the Corsairs. Haskins allowed all five runs (three earned) and all nine ECSU hits while fanning four and walking three.

ECSU BASEBALL REMAINS UNBEATEN IN LITTLE EAST Warriors pound out 32 hits in sweep of Massachusetts Dartmouth

MANSFIELD -- Senior catcher Anthony Formato (BRIDGEPORT) hit home runs in consecutive innings to highlight a 19-hit explostion as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team completed a Little East Conference sweep of the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth with a 16-5 win Saturday.

In the first game, three ECSU pitchers combined on a five-hitter and seven different players drove in at least one run in the Warriors' 9-7 triumph.

Eastern, ranked second in New England and ninth nationally, improves to 22-6 overall, 14-2 up north, 10-1 at home and 8-0 in the conference. UMass Dartmouth, ranked third in New England and 22nd nationally, falls to 18-7 overall, 5-3 in the conference.

In the second game, Eastern built a 10-0 lead after three inning and coasted to the victory. Formato hit his fourth and fifth home runs of the season while senior third baseman Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) and senior DH George Davis (PROCTOR, VT) also homered. Gersz was 2-for-6 with two runs and five RBI and senior first baseman Glenn Lungarini (OXFORD) 3-for-5 with three RBI. Formato added a double and finished 4-for-5 with three runs and two RBI.

In the nightcap, eight of ECSU's 19 hits were good for extra bases. Junior righty Scott Czerwinski (SOMERS) won his third game in four decisons this year. Czerwinski, making his first start and appearance since Apri 2, allowed two hits and two earned runs while walking two and fanning none over the first six innings.

In the first game, Eastern built an early 5-0 lead but the Corsairs battled back to tie the game 7-7 in the eighth. Brian Sullivan tripled and scored two batters later on Jeff Cross's sacrifice fly. Eastern regained the lead with two runs in the bottom of the inning on two-out RBI singles by Gersz and junior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA). Junior righty Scott Chiasson (NORWICH) got the final four outs to record his third win without a loss.

Cross, John Connole and Eric Alberto each drove in two runs in the first game for UMass Dartmouth while Cross added two more in the nightcap, as did Pat Schultz, who matched Cross with a two-run home run. The Corsairs committed nine errors in the doubleheader.

ECSU BASEBALL DROPS 8-6 DECISION AT BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY Warriors erase 6-1 deficit before falling to NE's top-ranked team

ECSU BASEBALL WINS SIXTH STRAIGHT NORTHERN DECISION Wolfradt pitches five scoreless innings in relief in 14-7 win

MANSFIELD – Junior righty **Jason Wolfradt** (**BRISTOL**) gained his first pitching victory at Eastern Connecticut State University with five scoreless relief innings as the Warriors won their sixth straight game since returning from California with a 14-7 win over Westfield State College Tuesday.

ECSU BASEBALL ROUTS WESTERN CONN. IN THREE GAMES Warriors fall one hit shy of program game record in final win

DANBURY, Conn. — Senior centerfielder Steven Rembisz (VERNON) and senior catcher Anthony Formato (BRIDGEPORT) each had four hits in a 28-hit attack which carried the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 25-8 rout of Western Connecticut State University Sunday and a sweep of a three-game weekend set.

MANSFIELD -- Junior left-handed pitcher Adam Murphy (LEBANON) allowed only a third-inning single over eight innings and junior third baseman Lance Podlesney's (MARLBORO, MA) team-leading third home run of the season provided the only needed offense as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team blanked Bridgewater State College 2-0 Thursday in the team's second shutout win of the day.

Eastern (10-4), ranked fifth in New England, christened its new baseball facility by routing Wesleyan University (8-8) 12-0 earlier in the afternoon behind junior righty **Scott Czerwinski's (SOMERS)** four-hit, seven-inning performance.

Murphy struck out three and walked three.

Podlesney broke a scoreless tie by leading off the fourth inning with the first home run at the park and senior centerfielder **Steven Rembisz** (**VERNON**) scored on wild pitch in the seventh to make it 2-0. Rembisz had walked to open the inning, was sacrificed to second and moved to third on an outfield fly ball.

Czerwinski (2-1) never allowed more than one hit over the first seven innings. He struck out four and walked one.

Podlesney led a 14-hit attack by going 4-for-4 with three RBI and two runs scored while senior first baseman Glenn Lungarini (OXFORD) drove in four runs with a two-run double in the fifth and a two-run single in the sixth. Senior DH George Davis (PROCTOR, VT) added two hits and two RBI and freshman shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) two hits. Senior rightfielder Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) tripled and walked twice and scored three runs.

ECSU BASEBALL SPLITS PAIR IN FINAL CALIFORNIA GAMES Murphy, Chiasson combine to shut out Southern Cal College in opener

COSTA MESA, Calif. — Junior lefthanded pitcher Adam Murphy (LEBANON) allowed only two hits over six innings and junior righty Scott Chiasson (NORWICH) picked up his ninth career save to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 3-0 shutout of Southern California College Saturday in the first game of a doubleheader.

In the nightcap, Kevin Moore and Greg Schrieber each drove in a run in the first inning in the Vanguards' 5-2 win.

Eastern (8-4) winds up its California trip with five wins and three losses. Southern Cal is 18-15.

In the first game, Murphy won his third game in as many decisions this year, limiting the Vanguards to a pair of first-inning hits -- a leadoff triple and a two-out single. Senior rightfielder Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) drove in two of ECSU's runs with a third-inning double and a seventh-inning single. Senior second baseman Chris D'Amato (BRISTOL) staked ECSU to a 1-0 lead in the second when he plated senior centerfielder Steven Rembisz (VERNON) from third with a ground ball to second. Rembisz had doubled and moved to third on a wild pitch. Gersz, freshman shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) and senior leftfielder Jon Krot (KILLINGLY) each had two hits in ECSU's nine-hit attack.

Six ECSU pitchers couldn't prevent the loss in the nightcap, as Southern Cal scored four runs before chasing ECSU freshman righty **Michael Chadwick** (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) in the fourth. The loss was the first of the season after two wins for Chadwick, who allowed six hits while fanning two and walking one.

D'Amato and senior first baseman **Glenn Lungarini** (**OXFORD**) drove in ECSU's runs. D'Amato had an RBI single in the fourth and Lungarini a sacrifice fly in the seventh.

Eastern is scheduled to host Wesleyan University Wednesday at 4:30 p.m. as it opens play in its new facility in Mansfield.

ECSU WINS TWO GAMES AT CALIFORNIA INVITE, PLACES FIFTH Warriors hold on to defeat No. 9 nationally-ranked California Lutheran 12-11

The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored 28 runs and banged out 37 hits -- including 12 extra-base hits -- to win two games Sunday and place fifth at the California Invitational.

The Warriors (6-2), ranked 16th nationally in Division III, defeated ninth-ranked Cal Lutheran (15-4) for the first time ever in regular-season play (eight games), outslugging the Kingsmen 12-11 at Whittier, Calif., before blasting Pacific University (OR) 16-4 later in the afternoon at La Verne, Calif.

In opening-round action Saturday, Eastern had shut out host Occidental College 7-0 behind the combined seven-hitter of junior righty **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**) and sophomore righty **Jay Wetherell** (**MILFORD**) but was beaten for the first time in four meetings all-time by Whittier 9-7 in a game also played at Occidental College in Los Angeles.

Against Cal Lutheran, junior righty **Jason Wolfradt** (BRISTOL) recoreded his first save at Eastern, getting Don Churchman — who had doubled and homered earlier — to fly out to right field to end the game with the tying run on second base.

Junior infielder Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) homered twice in the game to key an 18-hit explosion against four Cal Lutheran pitchers, while junior catcher David Yaconiello (TOLLAND) was 4-for-4 with two runs scored. Podlesney and freshman infielder Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) each had three hits, drove in three runs and scored twice. Tempesta had two doubles. Senior outfielder Steven Rembisz (VERNON) was credited with his 100th career hit at Eastern with a second-inning single.

Junior lefty Adam Murphy (LEBANON) gained his second win without a loss, against the Kingsmen. Murphy did not allow a run through four innings before Churchman homered leading off the fifth and the Kingsmen chased him in a five-run sixth.

Against Pacific (5-9), senior outfielders Jon Gersz (WALLINGFORD) and Derek Karcich (CLINTON) each had three hits and two RBI in a 19-hit attack, Gersz scoring three. Tempesta and senior DH George Davis (PROCTOR, VT) each had two hits. Davis drove in three runs, two coming on a fourth-inning home run, while Tempesta plated two and scored three.

ECSU WINS TWO GAMES AT SALISBURY STATE INVITATIONAL Jon Gersz drives in nine runs as Warriors defeat Old Westbury, Salisbury

SALISBURY, MD — Senior rightfielder **Jon Gersz** (<u>WALLINGFORD</u>) drove in nine runs with four hits as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated Old Westbury State 18-1 and Salisbury State University 10-1 Sunday at the Salisbury State University Invitational. ECSU BASEBALL SPLITS TWO GAMES AT SALISBURY Senior rightfielder Jon Gersz goes 6-for-10 in two games

SALISBURY, Md. -- Senior rightfielder **Jon Gersz** (WALLINGFORD) collected nine total bases with a double, triple and home run to spark the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a season-opening 12-7 win over Old Westbury State Saturday at the Salisbury State University Invitational.

In the second game, three ECSU pitchers walked ten batters as host Salisbury State won 7-1.

Gersz, a second-team all-New England pick as a junior, was 3-for-5 with three RBI and three runs scored in the opening win to lead a 12-hit attack as the Warriors scored eight times in the second to wipe out a 3-0 deficit. Gersz matched his first-game output by going 3-for-5 while junior Lance **Podlesney** (MARLBORO, MA) added two hits. His first-inning, two-out double plated Gersz to give ECSU a quick 1-0 lead. D'Amato went 0-for-4 and had a 21-game hitting streak snapped.

ECSU, ranked 16th nationally in Division III, meets Old Westbury at 9 a.m. and Salisbury State at noon Sunday.
