# ECSU BASEBALL CATCHES RIC WITH LATE COMEBACK 12-9 Warriors need win over Anchormen Sunday to share LEC crown

PROVIDENCE, RI -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored eight runs in the seventh inning to wipe out a six-run deficit and post a key 12-9 Little East Conference victory over Rhode Island College Saturday.

The second-game of the scheduled doubleheader was washed out by rain and is scheduled to be played Sunday at noon at Providence.

For Eastern (23-13, 11-2), a win Sunday over the Anchormen (10-20, 4-9) will give it a share of the conference regular-season title with the University of Southern Maine and will make it the host for next weekend's six-team, double-elimination conference tournament.

If it finishes in a tie for first place with Southern Maine, ECSU would host the tournament and be accorded the No. 1 seed based on a tie-breaking formula. Southern Maine entered play Saturday one game ahead of ECSU in the conference standings but split a home doubleheader with Plymouth State, winning the opener 13-1 but falling in the nightcap 4-1. Eastern's sweep of Plymouth State April 3 at the ECSU Baseball Stadium would be the deciding factor in making ECSU the top tournament seed and host.

Trailing 9-2 after four innings and 9-3 entering the seventh inning Saturday, the Warriors exploded for eight runs in the seventh on eight hits. Freshman leftfielder **Jason Holowaty** (**COLUMBIA**) had two hits in the inning -- including a tie-breaking two-run double -- while junior rightfielder **Alex Krajewski** (**MANCHESTER**) and senior first baseman **Keith Millen** (**VERNON**) each had a hit and a walk in the frame. Krajewski, who opened the inning with a single, scored the first and last runs of the inning. Millen hit a two-run opposite-field home run -- the first home run of his career -- to account for the first two runs of the inning. The Warriors opened the inning with four straight hits and after a strikeout, put together three more in a row before senior catcher **David Yaconiello** (**TOLLAND**) tied the game 9-9 with a sacrifice fly.

With the game and the bases loaded, Holowaty stroked his second hit of the inning — a two-run double down the right field line — to plate senior outfielder **Derek Karcich** (**CLINTON**) from third and Krajewski from second to give ECSU an 11-9 lead.

Sophomore righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) picked up his second win of the year in the longest relief outing of his career. Chadwick, the team's third pitcher, allowed four hits and two runs over the final six innings while fanning six and walking one. Chadwick entered with a runner on first base and no one out in the fourth inning and ECSU trailing 6-2. The Anchormen eventually scored three runs in the inning to push the lead to 9-2 before ECSU got one back in the fifth on senior third baseman Lance Podlesney's (MARLBORO, MA) RBI triple.

Chadwick allowed only two hits over the final five innings, facing only one batter over the minimum. He was aided by two ECSU double plays.

Millen and Podlesney each had three hits in ECSU's 16-hit attack while Holowaty, sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA), sophomore DH Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) and Karcich each had two. Hebert drove in three runs with an RBI double in the fourth and two-run single in the seventh while Millen, Holowaty and Podlesney each finished with two RBI.

Freshman shortstop Frank Kuras had three hits and four RBI for the hosts. Kuras highlighted a four-run Rhode Island first inning with a two-run single and added an RBI double and later scored in the third to make it 6-0.

## ECSU BASEBALL ROLLS PAST WESTERN CONNECTICUT 12-3 Warriors improve to 10-2 in Little East Conference with victory

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Seniors Derek Karcich (CLINTON), Scott Gomarko (ROCKY HILL) and Keith Millen (VERNON) each had two hits in their final regular-season home games as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated Western Connecticut State University 12-3 Wednesday in a Little East Conference game.

Eastern (22-13) improves to 10-2 in the conference with the victory and finishes its home regular season with ten wins in 14 outings. Western (4-19, 1-11) lost to Eastern for the 44th time in 46 meetings all-time.

Western scored twice in the first inning off ECSU freshman lefty **David Olson** (WATERFORD) but the Warriors responded with four in the bottom of the inning and added four more in the second and two in the third to open up a 10-3 lead. Olson upped his north record to 4-0, allowing all three runs and all four hits in working the first six innings. He fanned eight and walked five. One of the runs was unearned. Senior righty **Jason Wolfradt** (BRISTOL) retired the final nine batters in order — four by strikeout — to record his first save of the season.

Karcich drove in three runs in the first two innings with an RBI double and two-run single while Millen scored twice and drove in two runs with a triple in the second and double in the third. Gomarko plated one run in the first with a double.

Michael Mastropeitro had two of Western's hits and also walked and stole three bases.

Eastern, ranked sixth in New England, wraps up its regular season Saturday with a Little East Conference doubleheader at Rhode Island College at noon.

WETHERELL PITCHES ECSU BASEBALL PAST SUFFOLK 8-3
Junior allows three runs over first seven innings in Warriors' win

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Junior righty **Jay Wetherell (MILFORD)** allowed nine hits and three runs over seven innings and four players had at least two hits as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated Suffolk University 8-3 Sunday.

Ranked sixth in New England, Eastern (21-13) improves to 17-6 up north by defeating the Rams in the first meeting ever between the clubs. Suffolk (24-14), the top seed in last year's ECAC New England Division III tournament, falls to 19-10 up north.

Making only his fourth start of the season, Wetherell won its second northern game in as many decisions, preventing any extra base hits. Against a team which brought a .332 average into play, Wetherell gave up only one run through the first six innings and carried a five-run lead into the seventh before the Rams got two back in that inning With the score 6-3 and runners on first and second, freshman rightfielder **Jared Holowaty** (**COLUMBIA**) made a diving each of a sinking line drive by Eric Correira to end the threat.

Holowaty, who had a 20-game hitting streak snapped in the second game of Saturday's 7-2 loss to Massachusetts Dartmouth, had two hits and drove in the team's final run with an eight-inning suicide squeeze bunt. Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) and freshman second baseman Kevin Rival (NEW BRITAIN) each had three hits in the Warriors' 13-hit attack while Holowaty and senior outfielder Derek Karcich (CLINTON) had two each. Karcich drove in two runs with singles in the first and fifth innings while senior catcher David Yaconiello (TOLLAND) plated two, one coming on a double in the fifth. Senior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO,MA) scored twice and hit his third home run of the season — a leadoff blast in the seventh which chased Suffolk relief pitcher Ryan Pavao after just one pitch.

Defensively, Eastern committed just one error -- when Rival's throw to second on a ground ball bounced off the head of Suffolk runner Jeff Russell -- and turned three double plays. Two of the double plays came when Suffolk runners were caught off first base on fly ball outs.

Wetherell (2-2) fanned three, walked two and hit two batters before giving way to senior righty **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**), who got the final six ous -- three by strikeout. Czerwinski walked two but did not give up a hit.

Russell and Jared Leach each had two hits for Suffolk, which got only three hits, one run and two RBI out of its 3-4-5 hitters.

Eastern faces host Tufts University Tuesday at 3 p.m.

## ECSU BASEBALL SPLITS LEC DOUBLEHEADER WITH UMASS DARTMOUTH Warriors drop into second place in Little East Conference with second-game loss

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore righty Jason Hinchliffe shut down the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team on three hits as the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth posted a 7-2 second-game win in a Little East Conference doubleheader Saturday.

In the first game, Eastern pounded out 14 hits -- 13 of them singles -- in an 8-7 come-from-behind win which was not secured until senior righty **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**) fanned UMass cleanup hitter Eli Munkholm with the bases loaded in the ninth inning.

The split, coupled with the University of Southern Maine's sweep of Keene State, drops ECSU (20-13, 9-2) into second place in the conference, one game behind Southern Maine. UMass is 12-19-1, 6-6 in the conference.

Hinchliffe carried a no-hitter and 7-0 lead into the eighth inning when ECSU freshman leftfielder **Justin Waz (DEEP RIVER)** -- who had replaced starter Alex Krajewski in left -- recorded his first career hit and broke the no-hitter and shutout with an RBI double. The hit plated pinch hitter **Keith** Millen (VERNON), who had walked with one out. Hincliffe fanned ten and walked four in pitching his second complete game of the season.

The No. 2-5 hitters in the UMass lineup each had two hits in the ten-hit Corsair attack, sophomore first baseman Brian Ronayne collecting two of his team's three home runs, driving in three runs and scoring two. Junior leftfielder Manny Santo drove in three runs with a home run in a five-run seventh inning which chased ECSU freshman righty Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS).

In the first game, Eastern scored three runs in the seventh inning and another in the eighth to take 8-6 lead into the ninth, where Czerwinski survived two singles, two walks and a sacrifice fly to record his second save and make a winner of junior righty **Steve Stonoha** (**DERBY**).

ECSU sophomore DH Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) and freshman leftfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) each had three hits for Eastern, Hebert driving in three runs, two coming when he put ECSU ahead for good with a two-run double down the left field line in the seventh. Holowaty scored three runs, including two of the team's runs in its final two at-bats. Senior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) drove in two runs with a sacrifice fly in the first and RBI single in the seventh.

In the first game, the Corsairs amassed 12 hits off three ECSU pitchers, with Ronayne picking up three and Munkholm, Santo and freshman rightfielder Brian Pereira adding two. Pereira drove in three runs with a two-run home run in the fifth and an RBI single in the seventh.

Eastern hosts Suffolk University Sunday at 1 p.m.

### BRIDGEWATER STATE ROUTS ECSU BASEBALL 11-1

Every starter contributes at least one hit in Bears' victory

BRIDGEWATER, Mass. -- Three-four-five hitters Jeff Cloonan, Ryan Faria and Justin Twieraga combined for six hits and four RBL and scored five runs as the Bridgewater State College baseball team routed Eastern Connecticut State University 11-1 Thursday.

The Bears (18-10-1) scored two runs in an inning five times in their eight at-bats, reaching four of ECSU's fived pitchers for at least one run. ECSU (19-12) sophomore righty **Michael Chadwick** (**SOUTH KINGSTOWN**, **RI**) allowed only three hits in working the first five innings but walked four -- three of them coming around to score -- and was tagged for five earned runs.

The loss is the fifth in 20 northern games for Eastern, ranked sixth in New England. Unranked Bridgewater improves to 12-5-1 up north.

Bridgewater played only nine position players in the game, with each collecting at least one hit. Faria, batting cleanup, reached base four times with two hits, a walk and hit-by-pitch, drove in three runs with a single in the third and two-run double in the eighth and scored twice. No. 5 hitter Brian Silva plated three runs, two coming on a double in the seventh. Cloonan and Twieraga each had two hits, Twieraga scoring twice and Cloonan scoring once and driving in one run.

Bridgewater sophomore lefty Kevin Cadres (6-1), the team's No. I pitcher, set down ECSU on three hits and no runs over seven innings. He fanned 11 and walked four. Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) had three of ECSU's six hits and drove in the only run with a single in the ninth.

Eastern hosts Massachusetts Dartmouth Saturday in a Little East Conference doubleheader at noon. The game is a re-match of last year's NCAA Division III Northeast Regional championship round, won by Eastern.

## ECSU BASEBALL BLASTS SPRINGFIELD COLLEGE 10-2 Freshman Olson wins third straight decision, Tempesta hits grand slam

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. — Freshman left-handed pitcher **David Olson (WATERFORD)** won his third straight decision by allowing only four hits over eight innings and sophomore shortstop **Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA)** highlighted an eight-run sixth inning with a grand slam as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team blasted Springfield College 10-2 Wednesday.

The win is the sixth in the last eight games for Eastern (19-11), which defeated Springfield (23-12) for the third straight year. The Warriors are ranked sixth in New England.

Olson (3-1) won his third northern decision without a loss by allowing the Pride only four hits and two runs over the first eight innings. Olson fanned five, walked two and hit a batter.

Leading 2-1, Eastern broke the game open when it sent 12 batters to the plate and scored eight runs on five hits, two walks and an error in chasing starter Todd Lynch (6-2). Tempesta drove in the final four runs of the inning with a one-out grand slam to left-center — his third home run of the season.

Tempesta finished with three of ECSU's 12 hits, driving in the four runs and scoring a run on the home run. Junior Jay Wetherell (MILFORD), sophomore Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) and freshman Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) each added two hits. Freshman catcher Troy Timney (BRATTLEBORO, VT) drove in three runs with a ground ball in the second and two-run single in the eight-run sixth.

## ECSU, SOUTHERN MAINE SPLIT BASEBALL DOUBLEHEADER Warriors score two in ninth inning to take second game 6-5

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Sophomore DH Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) and junior first baseman Jay Wetherell (MILFORD) each stroked RBI singles in the ninth inning as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rallied for a 6-5 win over the University of Southern Maine Saturday and a split of their Little East Conference doubleheader.

In the first game, Southern Maine snapped a 3-3 tie with seven runs in the ninth inning to record its 17th straight victory. The two teams entered play with perfect 7-0 conference records. Eastern is 18-11, 14-4 up north, Southern Maine is 22-10, 17-3 up north.

Southern Maine, ranked fourth in New England, scored twice in the eighth inning of the second game to take a 5-4 lead but the Warriors rallied in the ninth with three hits and a walk to make a winner of senior reliever Scott Czerwinski (SOMERS). Czerwinski (3-2) had replaced starting freshman brother Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS) with two outs in the top of the fifth and two runners on in a 2-2 game.

With two out and freshman leftfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) on first in the ninth, senior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) walked to move the tying run into scoring position. Hebert then plated his second run of the day with a game-tying RBI single to left and Wetherell delivered his second game-winning hit in eight days and second RBI of the game with a single to right-center. Wetherell, who has logged 20.6 innings as a pitcher this year and has only 28 career at-bats, hit his first career home run to put ECSU ahead 3-2 with two outs in the sixth. The hit for Hebert was his first in eight plate appearances on the afternoon.

Sophomore righty Mark Russell (5-2) allowed eight hits in recording the complete game for Southern Maine in the opener and sophomore first baseman Jody Curcuru and freshman catcher Peter L'Italien each drove in three runs. L'Italien was 4-for-4 with a double, home run, run scored and also reached on a walk while Curcuru was 3-for-5 with two runs scored. In the ninth, L'Italien was 2-for-2 with a home run and double and three RBI. His leadoff homer in the inning snapped a 3-3 tie.

Trailing 3-0 in the first game, Eastern tied the game in the sixth on a two-run single by Tempesta and Hebert's ground out. In the ninth, starting senior lefty **Adam Murphy** (**LEBANON**) gave up L'Italien's second home run of the season to open the inning and was replaced two batters later. Three subsequent pitchers allowed three hits and four walks and also hit a batter as Southern Maine sent 13 batters to the plate in scoring its seven runs.

In the doubleheader, Holowaty was 5-for-8 with a walk and three runs scored while sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) had three hits, including a triple, and four RBI. He also tied the program season record when he was hit by a pitch (in the first game) for the ninth time. Podlesney had three hits, walked twice, scored two runs and drove in a run with a sacrifice fly.

### ECSU BASEBALL DROPS 3-2 DECISION TO TRINITY COLLEGE

No. 2 regionally-ranked Bantams rally for three runs in eighth

HARTFORD, Conn. — Sophomore righty Jarrett Bayliss scattered four singles and the Trinity College baseball team rallied from two runs down with three runs in the eighth inning for a 3-2 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Wednesday.

Ranked second in New England, Trinity (21-4) survived five errors to defeat Eastern (17-10), ranked sixth in New England. The loss was only the third in 16 northern outings for Eastern and snaps a four-game winning streak.

Eastern sophomore righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) allowed only four hits through seven innings and carried a 2-0 lead into the eighth before the Bantams took the lead by scoring three times on three hits and an ECSU error. Junior third baseman Jayson Barbarotta knocked in the first run with a one-out single. Barbarotta moved to third when junior rightfielder James Klocek reached on an infield error and scored the tying run when junior catcher Jake Miles greeted ECSU senior righty Scott Czerwinski (SOMERS) with a single to center.

With runners on first and second, junior first baseman Brian Powell then grounded the ball to first base but the Warriors could not get an out when they attempted to turn a 3-6-3 double play, allowing Trinity to load the bases. Junior second baseman Todd Brodeur's sacrifice fly to center then plated Klocek from third with the go-ahead run.

Bayliss, a second-team all-New England pick as a freshman allowed only one hit -- an infield single by freshman rightfielder **Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA)** -- over the final six innings. Bayliss fanned 12 and walked three. Both of the runs he allowed were unearned.

Eastern took a 2-0 lead with single runs in the third and fifth innings. The Warriors scored in the third after there were two out and no one on base. An infield error started the inning and consecutive singles by Holowaty and sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) brought home a run. Eastern added its second run in the fifth without the help of a hit. Trinity committed two errors in the inning, the run scoring from second when Tempesta's ground ball to Brodeur at second was mishandled. In the ninth, Trinity's fourth and fifth errors of the game put a runner on second with one out but Bayliss got a fly ball to center and ground ball to second to end the game.

Holowaty and Tempesta combined to split ECSU's four hits while Miles and Klocek each had two hits for Trinity.

## ECSU BASEBALL DOWNS FRAMINGHAM 11-8, NOW 13-2 UP NORTH Warriors score 11 straight runs after falling behind in first inning

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Sophomore designated hitter **Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON)** drove in four runs and scored twice to pace a 14-hit attack which lifted the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to an 11-8 victory over Framingham State College Tuesday.

The win is the 13th in 15 northern games for Eastern (17-9) and fourth this year without a loss for the defending Little East Conference champions over an opponent from the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference. The Rams lost to ECSU for the seventh straight time and fall to 7-17 overall.

Framingham scored twice in the first inning off ECSU junior righty **Jay Wetherell (MILFORD)** but the Warriors answered with three in the bottom of the inning and put the game away with six in the second.

Wetherell (1-2), making his first start since March 27, scattered nine hits over the first eight innings in the longest stint of his career and left with an 11-5 lead. He fanned a career-high seven while walking three and hitting a batter.

Junior leftfielder Alex Krajewski (MANCHESTER) led ECSU with three hits, Hebert, sophomore centerfielder Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE) and sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) adding two. Hebert highlighted the six-run second inning with a bases-clearing double to right and later in the game added an RBI single.

The top four hitters in the ECSU starting lineup each scored twice and combined for seven hits and six RBI. For Framingham, No. 9 hitter Mike Joneas had three hits, including a three-run double in the eighth.

Ranked in a tie for sixth in New England, Eastern visits second-ranked Trinity College (20-4) today at 3:30 p.m. in a re-match of last year's second-round NCAA regional tournament game, won by Eastern, 6-5.

Senior righty **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**) may open on the mound for Eastern and is expected to be opposed by sophomore righty Jarrett Bayliss (7-1, 1.47). In his last start last Thursday, Czerwinski (2-2-1, 6.68) allowed 11 hits and nine runs in the Warriors' 17-5 home loss to No. 5 regionally-ranked Wheaton College.

KRAJEWSKI, PODLESNEY LEAD ECSU BASEBALL PAST WESTERN Each pick up four hits to back complete-game pitching of Olson in 20-2 win

DANBURY, Conn. -- Senior all-America Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) and junior leftfielder Alex Krajewski (MANCHESTER) each had four hits to pace a 21-hit attack as Eastern Connecticut State University crushed Western Connecticut State University 20-2 Sunday in Little East Conference baseball action.

The win is the tenth straight for Eastern (16-9, 7-0) over the Colonials (2-11, 1-6) and 31st in 35 Little East Conference regular-season games, dating back to the first year of league play in 1997. ECSU, ranked sixth in New England, is 12-2 up north with its third straight win.

Podlesney was 4-for-5 with four runs scored and three RBI while Krajewski recorded his first career four-hit game by going 4-for-6 with a double, two RBI and a run scored. Podlesney collected eight total bases by doubling twice, tripling and singling. Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) was 2-for-2 with a double, three RBI, two runs scored and a stolen base.

As a team, ECSU tied the program record of four triples, junior first baseman Jay Wetherell (MILFORD), freshman first baseman Jarcd Holowaty (COLUMBIA) and freshman catcher Troy Timney (BRATTLEBORO, VT) joining Podlesney in that department. Holowaty reached safely with three hits and a walk, scored three times and drove in two runs.

Freshman lefty David Olson (WATERFORD) pitched his first career complete game in his fourth start, allowing only two hits while fanning a season-high 11 and walking eight. The win is the second in as many starts for Olson (2-1), who was credited with a 28-1 win over Western New England College last Sunday at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

In pitching the team's second complete game this year, Olson allowed only a one-out RBI double in the second by Mike Mastropietro and a two-out single by Drew Hall in the seventh. After Mastropietro's double, Olson did not allow a hit to the next 21 batters. He fanned the side to open the first inning and got all three outs via the strikeout route after issuing a leadoff walk in the fifth.

## ECSU BASEBALL REMAINS UNBEATEN IN LITTLE EAST Warriors sweep Keene State in battle of conference unbeatens

KEENE, NH -- Sophomore designated hitter **Matt Hebert** (**BURLINGTON**) drove in seven runs and scored six with five hits -- including his third and fourth home runs of the season -- as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team defeated Keene State College 20-7 and 7-6 in ten innings in a Little East Conference doubleheader Saturday.

Eastern (15-9, 6-0), last year's regular season and conference tournament champion, remains unbeaten in the conference in handing the Owls (14-9) their first two conference losses after four wins. The wins also snap a two-game losing streak for Eastern, ranked sixth in New England.

Hebert highlighted a five-run first inning in the opener with a three-run home run as the Warriors banged out 21 hits to make a winner of senior lefty **Adam Murphy** (**LEBANON**). The loss was the first after four wins for Keene starter Matt Lavatori.

In the nightcap, a grand slam by Keene State's Adam Lawrence helped stake the Owls to a 5-0 lead but the Warriors battled back to tie the game 5-5 with a four-run fifth inning. In the tenth, junior Jay Wetherell (MILFORD) drove in the go-ahead run with a no-out, RBI single to right. Pinch hitter Keith Millen (VERNON) had walked to open the inning and pinch runner Steve Stonoha (DERBY) -- who recorded second save in the first game -- moved all the way to third on an errant pickoff attempt.

Senior righty Scott Czerwinski (SOMERS) gained his first career save in the second game. Czerwinski, making his first relief appearance since 1996, came on in the tenth with the tying run on second base and one out. Czerwinski picked Keith Jacobson off second for the second out, then struck out Derek Bell looking to end the game.

In the first game, sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) was 4-for-5 with five RBI and three runs scored. Tempesta had two doubles and also reached when hit by a pitch. Hebert was 3-for-5 with four runs and four RBI while sophomore catcher Anthony DeCicco (JOHNSTON, RI) was 3-for-5 with two RBI and two runs scored.

Sophomore Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE), senior Scott Gomarko (ROCKY HILL), Hebert and freshman Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) each had two hits in the nightcap, Gouin and Hebert homering and Gomarko doubling twice.

Eastern travels to face Western Connecticut State University in a noon conference game Sunday.

## ECSU BASEBALL DROPS SECOND CONSECUTIVE HOME DECISION Warriors thumped by Wheaton College 17-5 in first meeting between teams

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- The Wheaton College (MA) baseball team wiped out a one-run deficit with three runs in the fifth and six in the sixth in handing Eastern Connecticut State University its second consecutive loss 17-5 Thursday at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

In the first-ever meeting between the teams, Eastern (13-9) scored four runs on seven hits in the first two innings but was limited to just one run and one hit the rest of the way by four Wheaton (19-7) pitchers. ECSU is ranked sixth in New England, Wheaton fifth.

ECSU senior righty **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**), a 20-game career winner, carried a 5-4 lead into the fifth inning but the Lyons struck for three runs in that inning and chased Czerwinski with a six-run sixth. Czerwinski (2-2), the first of six ECSU pitchers, allowed ten of Wheaton's 15 hits and nine runs. ECSU's pitchers walked 11 and hit four batters, with eight of those baserunners eventually scoring.

The loss was ECSU's second straight at home in as many days after nine northern-opening wins and the final 12-run margin was the worst loss to a New England opponent since April 21, 1996 when the Warriors were beaten 17-4 at the University of Southern Maine. The top three hitters in the Wheaton lineup combined for eight hits and five RBI and scored five runs. Junior rightfielder Jason Hoye had four hits and three RBI and scored twice while leadoff hitter Phil Desilets reached safely five times with two hits, two hit-by-pitch and a walk. He drove in two runs and scored one.

Eastern took a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the first on a two-run bases loaded single by freshman rightfielder Nick Scheets (MILFORD) and a sacrifice fly by sophomore DH Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON). Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) picked up his 100th career hit in that inning, a single to left, and scored the team's second run.

Sophomore righty Brendan Durrigan (4-1) pitched into the eighth inning to record the win as the first of four Wheaton pitchers. After Tempesta's RBI double in the second, ECSU was held hitless until junior leftfielder Alex Krajewski (MANCHESTER) had an opposite-field single to right leading off the ninth.

Eastern returns to Little East Conference play Saturday with a noon doubleheader at Keene State College.

# ECSU BASEBALL ROLLS PAST WESTERN NEW ENGLAND COLLEGE 28-1 Warriors pound out 25 hits, improve northern record to 9-0 with victory

MANSFIELD, Conn. - Six players collected three hits each and three freshmen combined for 11 RBI as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored in double figures for the fourth consecutive game in a 28-1 victory over Western New England College Sunday at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

The win is the ninth straight up north this year and 15th straight at home over a two-year span for Eastern (13-7), ranked sixth in New England. It's been 12 years since an ECSU team opened its northern season with more consecutive victories (the 1987 team won its first 12). The Golden Bears drop to 8-7 overall after losing to Eastern for the 29th consecutive time.

Eastern, which picked up 35 hits in two Little East Conference wins over Massachusetts Boston Saturday, racked up 25 hits against five Western New England pitchers, driving junior righty Paul Heering (2-2) from the box in a nine-run first inning. Leading 12-1, Eastern sent 16 batters to the plate in scoring 11 times in the fifth on eight hits, two walks and two hit batsmen. In their last four games, the Warriors are averaging 18.5 runs.

Six players had three hits each, led by senior second baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) who drove in three runs to give him 11 RBI in the last three games. Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) had three hits to give him 99 in his 66-game career and also scored four times and drove in four runs. Two of Tempesta's hits, one run and all four of his RBI came in the first inning, when he drove in two runs with his second home run of the season and later added a two-run single. Sophomore leftfielder Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE) came off the bench to hit his first career home run — a two-run shot in the ninth.

Three Four freshmen combined to drive in 11 runs: third baseman Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN) drove in four runs with three singles and a sacrifice fly; catcher Troy Timney (BRATTLEBORO, VT) plated four with a pair of two-run singles and rightfielder Nick Scheets (MILFORD) picked up three RBI with a two-run double and sacrifice fly. Scheets scored four times and finished with two doubles, giving him a team-high nine in 19 games.

Lefty David Olson (WATERFORD) became the second ECSU freshman to record his first collegiate win in as many games. Olson allowed four singles over the first six innings while fanning two and walking two. Three ECSU pitchers stopped Western New England College on five singles as the staff extended its streak of preventing an extra base hit to 28 innings.

As a team, the Warriors set a program record with four sacrifice flies.

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Senior right-handed pitcher **Scott Czerwinski (SOMERS)** became the eighth pitcher in Eastern Connecticut State University history to record 20 career victories as the Warriors remained undefeated up north with a 12-7 victory over Worcester State College Wednesday.

Czerwinski (2-1) pitched the first five innings, allowing four runs (three earned) and six hits while fanning eight and walking two. Czerwinski becomes the first pitcher to record 20 wins since Norm Worthington in 1990. He has lost six games in 36 career appearances.

Eastern (10-7) has won all six of its northern games to date and has won its last 14 straight at home. Worcester State is 8-6.

Czerwinski, junior righty Steve Stonoha (DERBY) and sophomore lefty Curt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD) combined to strike out 16 Worcester State batters. Stonoha and Sinatro each fanned four batters.

Trailing 1-0, Eastern scored five times on six hits against Worcester starter Adam Dupont (2-1) and put the game away with a five-run fourth inning. Eight of ECSU's 15 hits were good for extra bases, with five starters each collecting at least two hits.

Senior centerfielder Derek Karcich (CLINTON) had a double and triple and scored twice while sophomore DH Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) had two hits -- including his second home run of the year. Hebert also scored twice and drove in a run. Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) moved to within eight hits of 100 in his career. Tempesta had two hits, including a double, scored once and drove in three runs with a single in the second and two-run double in the fourth. Senior first baseman Keith Millen (VERNON) had two hits, scored twice and drove in two runs while freshman rightfielder Nick Scheets (MILFORD) had two hits, two RBI and scored a run.

Junior DH Jeff Decoteau had two of Worcester's eight hits. Decoteau drove in two runs while junior third baseman Jason Richards drove in three runs with a sacrifice fly in the first and two-run single in the fifth.

Eastern returns to Little East Conference play Saturday, facing Massachusetts Boston in a noon doubleheader scheduled to be played at Massachusetts Dartmouth in North Dartmouth, MA.

# ECSU BASEBALL SWEEPS LITTLE EAST OPENING DOUBLEHEADER Murphy's complete game in opener sparks two wins over Plymouth State

MANSFIELD, Conn.— Senior lefty **Adam Murphy** (**LEBANON**) pitched the program's first complete game in 33 games in the opener to spark the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to identical 9-2 victories over Plymouth State College Saturday in the Little East Conference openers for both schools.

Ranked eighth in New England, Eastern (8-7) remained unbeaten up north with its third and fourth wins in four days and has now won its last 13 games at home. Plymouth (4-8-1) has lost to ECSU on the Warriors' home field 30 times in 31 tries since 1974.

Murphy (1-2) scattered four hits in pitching his second career complete game, fanning seven and walking two. The only runs allowed by Murphy, who limited the Panthers to one single over the first four innings, came on a fifth-inning home run by Plymouth State catcher Mike Ryan. Murphy became the first ECSU pitcher to record a complete game since Scott Chiasson lost a 4-3, 11-inning decision at Plymouth State last April 25.

In the nightcap, junior righty **Stephen Stonoha** (**DERBY**) picked up his second career win when he allowed only two singles in three-and-two-thirds inning of relief. Stonoha retired the first nine batters he faced after relieving freshman lefty **David Olson** (**WATERFORD**) with one out and one runner aboard in the fifth inning with the game tied at 1-all.

In the doubleheader, senior first baseman Keith Millen (VERNON) drove in five runs and had three hits; senior second baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) plated three runs and scored twice while contributing three hits, including his first home run of the season in the first game.

Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) had four hits and scored four runs. Tempesta doubled and hit his first career home run in the second game.

Freshman third baseman **Inaki Ormaechea** (NEW BRITAIN) drove in two runs, scored twice and had three hits while freshman rightfielder **Nick Scheets** (MILFORD) drove in two runs and scored two with two hits.

Eastern used five-run outbursts in each game to put each one away. Leading 2-0 in the first game, the Warriors scored five times on four hits, a walk and error in the third inning -- two runs coming on Podlesney's home run to left -- to move out to a 7-0 lead.In the second game, Eastern broke a 1-1 tie with two runs in the fifth and tacked on five in the sixth on five hits, getting RBI from five different players.

Plymouth State senior starting pitchers Adam DeChristopher (0-2) and Ben DuBois (2-1), both named to last year's LEC tournament all-tournament team, were saddled with the losses. DuBois had not allowed an earned run in pitching two seven-inning complete games this year and extended that consecutive scoreless inning streak to 17 until Tempesta led off fourth inning of the nightcap with a double and scored on a ground out by Scheets.

All-Little East Conference outfielder Mike Bence led Plymouth with three hits in two games.

Having struggled defensively this year with a .922 fielding average, ECSU committed just one error in the doubleheader.

# ECSU BASEBALL RALLIES PAST MASS COLLEGE IN 9-8 VICTORY Warriors tie game with six runs in ninth, Tempesta RBI wins it in 11th

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rallied for six runs in the ninth inning -- tying the game on a two-out infield throwing error -- and won its 16th consecutive home-opener in the 11th inning, 9-8 over Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts Friday at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

With one out, senior first baseman Keith Millen (VERNON) singled in the third run of the inning and a walk to Holowaty loaded the bases and chased Mass. College starter Ken Haney. Tempesta then plated the fourth run of the inning when he forced Millen at third for the second out. Podlesney followed with his infield single to shortstop which was thrown away, allowing Holowaty to score from second and Tempesta from first.

Sophomore lefty Curt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD), the third of three ECSU pitchers, didn't allow a hit over the final two innings in gaining his second win without a loss.

Podlesney had three hits, Tempesta, Scheets and Holowaty two each. Scheets drove in two runs with two doubles and Tempesta and Holowaty scored twice each.

Joe Bateman, Jose Alicea and Jose Diaz each drove in two runs for the Mohawks, Bateman plating two runs in the first inning with a home run and Diaz adding a two-run home run to center which gave Mass. College an 8-2 lead ini the eighth.

## ECSU BASEBALL LOSES FINAL GAME IN CALIFORNIA Warriors drop 5-1 decision to Claremont-Mudd, finish trip 3-5

POMONA, CA — Junior right-handed pitcher Pete Wucetich pitched a complete-game five-hitter to lift the Claremont-Mudd-Scripps baseball team to a 5-1 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Saturday.

Eastern (4-7) concludes its California trip with a record of 3-5 after dropping its last two games. The win was only the second in 11 meetings for the Stags (13-12-1) over the Warriors.

For Eastern, sophomore lefthanded pitcher Curt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD) allowed only two singles while pitching the final three-and-two-thirds innings. He fanned one and didn't walk anyone.

The Warriors entered play averaging 3.6 errors per game but committed only one on an infield throwing error on a relay to home plate in Claremont's two-run fifth inning.

DeCicco had two of ECSU's hits and also threw out two attempted base stealers.

The loss denied 31st-year ECSU head coach **Bill Holowaty** of his 900th career coaching win, all at ECSU. Holowaty has won 899 games, lost 343 and tied four.

## ECSU BASEBALL OUTSLUGS NORTH CENTRAL COLLEGE 12-9 Warriors drop 9-1 decision to No. 3 ranked Chapman in second game

POMONA, CA — Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta's (BROCKTON, MA) two-out RBI single in the top of the seventh inning snapped a 9-9 tie and senior second baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) drove in five runs with a single and triple to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 12-9 win over North Central College Friday in a game played on the campus of Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges.

Eastern trailed 9-6 but scored six runs in its final three at-bats. The Warriors tied the game 9-9 on the sixth on a two-out bases-clearing triple by Podlesney and went ahead for good with two runs in the seventh. Tempesta snapped the tie with a two-out RBI single in that inning and senior first baseman **Keith Millen (VERNON)** followed with a pinch RBI single which drove starting pitcher Ray Napientek (1-1) from the mound and gave ECSU an 11-9 lead.

The win was the 899th against 342 losses and four ties in the 31-year coaching career of ECSU head coach Bill Holowaty, who is the winningest coach in New England Division III history.

In the makeup of a game postponed from Thursday, senior righty Jeff Blitstein (6-0) scattered six singles in a complete-game effort to lift No. 3 nationally-ranked Chapman University (19-2) to a 9-1 victory over the No. 24-ranked Warriors (4-6) Friday in a game also played at Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges.

Sophomore left-handed pitcher Curt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD) was credited with his first win at ECSU in his fifth appearance. Sinatro allowed a two-run, two-out bases-loaded double after replacing sophomore righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) in the fourth inning but settled down without allowing a hit until giving way to senior righty Brian Rivers (BRIDGEWATER, MA) with ECSU leading 11-9 in the bottom of the seventh. Rivers was credited with his first save at ECSU in allowing only one hit and one walk while fanning four over the final two-and-one-third innings.

# ECSU BASEBALL OUTSLUGS NORTH CENTRAL COLLEGE 12-9 Nick Tempesta's two-out RBI single in seventh snaps tie in Warriors' victory

POMONA, CA -- Sophomore shortstop Nick Tempesta's (BROCKTON, MA) two-out RBI single in the top of the seventh inning snapped a 9-9 tie and senior second baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) drove in five runs with a single and triple to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 12-9 win over North Central College Friday in a game played on the campus of Claremont-Mudd-Scripps Colleges.

Eastern (4-5) trailed 9-6 but scored six runs in its final three at-bats. The Warriors tied the game 9-9 on the sixth on a two-out bases-clearing triple by Podlesney and went ahead for good with two runs in the seventh. Tempesta snapped the tie with a two-out RBI single in that inning and senior first baseman **Keith Millen** (VERNON) followed with a pinch RBI single which drove starting pitcher Ray Napientek (1-1) from the mound and gave ECSU an 11-9 lead.

The win was the 899th against 342 losses and four ties in the 31-year coaching career of ECSU head coach Bill Holowaty, who is the winningest coach in New England Division III history.

No. 24 nationally-ranked Eastern was scheduled to play No. 3 Chapman University later Friday in a game which got underway at 5:30 ET at Claremont-Mudd.

Sophomore left-handed pitcher Curt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD) was credited with his first win at ECSU in his fifth appearance. Sinatro allowed a two-run, two-out bases-loaded double after replacing sophomore righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) in the fourth inning but settled down without allowing a hit until giving way to senior righty Brian Rivers (BRIDGEWATER, MA) with ECSU leading 11-9 in the bottom of the seventh. Rivers was credited with his first save at ECSU in allowing only one hit and one walk while fanning four over the final two-and-one-third innings.

## UC-SAN DIEGO SCORES THREE UNEARNED RUNS IN FIRST IN 7-2 WIN Tritons play perfect defense, turn three double plays in baseball win over ECSU

LA JOLLA, Calif. — The University of California-San Diego scored three unearned runs in the first inning and went on to a 7-2 baseball victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Wednesday.

## ECSU BASEBALL SPLITS FINAL TWO GAMES AT SALISBURY INVITE Warriors defeat Old Westbury 10-6, shut out by host Salisbury 9-0

SALISBURY, MD. -- Senior lefty **Adam Murphy (LEBANON)** won his tenth career game and sophomore centerfielder **Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE)** dove in two runs in his first career start as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team won its first game of the season, 10-6 over SUNY-Old Westbury Saturday morning at the Salisbury State University Invitational.

In the second game, Eastern committed five errors and Salisbury State (7-2) pulled away with five runs in the ninth inning to post a 9-0 shutout of the Warriors.

In his first appeareance of the season, Murphy (1-0) won his tenth career game in his third varsity season, allowing two (earnred) runs and six hits while fanning four and walking five over the first five innings. Gouin, who appeared in one game as a freshman in 1998, drove in two runs with a single in the sixth inning to give ECSU a 10-4 lead. Senior Scott Gomarko (ROCKY HILL) had three hits for Eastern, including a double, while senior Keith Millen (VERNON) had two hits and junior Alex Krajewski (MANCHESTER) two hits and an RBI.

For Salisbury, sophomore righty Bobby Hamel (1-0) didn't allow a hit until freshman Nick Scheets' (MILFORD) one-out single in the fifth inning and the Sea Gulls picked up 11 hits off five ECSU pitchers. Hamel scattered three hits while fanning one and walking two until being lifted with one out in the eighth and Salisbury leading 4-0. Freshman Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN) and sophomore Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) had ECSU's other hits.

Sophomore righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) allowed three runs (two earned) on six hits while fanning four and walking one over the first five innings in suffering the loss in his first decision. Charles Walter had three hits for Salisbury.

Eastern is idle until opening play at the California Invitational March 20 against CSU-Hayward at 3 p.m. (ET) at Los Angeles.

ECSU BASEBALL DROPS SEASON-OPENER AT SALISBURY STATE 7-5 Sea Gulls score five times in seventh to defeat defending national champions

SALISBURY, MD -- Kevin Lindsay, Dane Schriver and Brian Burden stroked consecutive run-scoring hits to highlight a five-run seventh inning and lift the Salisbury State University baseball team to a 7-5 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Friday in the Warriors' 1999 season debut at the Salisbury State University Invitational.

The game was originally scheduled to be played Saturday but was pushed up a day due to expected rain on Sunday.

Senior right-handed pitcher **Scott Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**) pitched the first five innings for Eastern and left with a 2-1 lead but the Sea Gulls (6-2) scored five times in the seventh off junior righthander **Jay Wetherell** (**MILFORD**) and sophomore lefty **Curt Sinatro** (**WEST HARTFORD**) on five hits and two ECSU errors to move out to a 6-2 lead.

An ECSU error opened the seventh inning for Salisbury and with one out Lindsay, Schriver and Burden each drove in runs to give Salisbury a 4-2 lead.

Sophomore second baseman Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA), senior third baseman Lance Podlesney (MARLBORO, MA) and freshman rightfielder Jason Holowaty (COLUMBIA) each had two hits for Eastern, Podlesney scoring twice and driving in a run. Senior first baseman Keith Millen (VERNON) also scored twice for ECSU.

Burden had three hits and two RBI for Salisbury while Schriver had a double and triple and two RBI. Lindsay had two hits, two runs and an RBI.
