ECSU BASEBALL ELIMINATED FROM LITTLE EAST TOURNAMENT Warriors' comeback bid falls short in 6-5 loss to top-seeded Southern Maine

GORHAM, Maine -- Junior lefty Travis Gilmore of the University of Southern Maine shut down the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team in an elimination game of the Little East Conference tournament for the second straight year as the Warriors were beaten 6-5 Saturday.

Top-seeded Southern Maine (31-11) advanced to face fourth-seeded Massachusetts Dartmouth (19-20) later Saturday in the double elimination tournament. UMass Dartmouth, which defeated both Eastern and Southern Maine earlier in the tournament, needed one win to capture the tournament title and gain the automatic bid to the NCAA Division III tournament. A win by Southern Maine Saturday would force a deciding game Sunday at noon.

Gilmore (4-0), who allowed only two hits when Southern Maine eliminated ECSU from the 1999 tournament, was not as dominant this time around, but allowed only six hits and carried a 6-3 lead into the eighth inning. He was replaced after issuing a one-out walk in the eighth and ECSU senior first baseman Jay Wetherell (MILFORD) greeted reliever Denny Webber with his second career home run to slice the margin to one run, 6-5. Webber, however, retired the next five batters in order to earn his second save.

Southern Maine, which had eliminated Keene State 12-8 Friday in a four hour and forty-four minute, 14-inning contest, broke to a 6-0 lead against ECSU sophomore righty **Adam Czerwinski** (**SOMERS**) with two runs in the second and four in the fifth. Czerwinski, who lost for the first time in five northern starts, was replaced after the hosts opened the fifth with four straight singles.

Trailing 6-0, Eastern got two back in the sixth on two walks, an RBI single by junior centerfielder **George Dixon** (STAMFORD) and a throwing error and reached Gilmore for another in the seventh on an RBI double by junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta** (BROCKTON, MA). Wetherell's two-run home run in the eighth pulled ECSU to within a run but Webber shut down the Warriors the rest of the way.

In three tournament games, Tempesta was 9-for-15 with four runs scored and four RBI.

Eastern, whose only two one-run losses in 11 contests have come to Southern Maine, awaits a possible at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. The 42-team field will be announced Monday.

ECSU FALLS INTO LOSERS' BRACKET IN LITTLE EAST BASEBALL Warriors beaten by UMass Dartmouth, need three wins to capture championship

GORHAM, Maine — The University of Massachusetts Dartmouth scored four runs in the sixth inning to wipe out a two-run deficit and the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team left 15 runners on base in dropping a 7-4 decision in the winners' bracket of the 2000 Little East Conference tournament Friday.

Second-seeded Eastern (29-9) faces top-seeded University of Southern Maine (30-11) in an elimination game Saturday at noon, with that winner needing to defeat unbeaten UMass Dartmouth (19-20) twice in the double elimination tournament to gain the title and with it, the automatic bid to the NCAA Division III tournament. One win Saturday by UMass Dartmouth in the 3:30 p.m. start gives the Corsairs their first conference title. If UMass loses Saturday, the championship game is schedule to be played Sunday at noon.

After ECSU lost to UMass Friday morning, once-beaten Southern Maine remained alive in the tournament by eliminating third-seeded Keene State (21-16-1) 12-8 in a 14-inning game which took four hours and 44 minutes to play and postponed the start of Friday's scheduled third game until Saturday. Southern Maine had dropped an opening 7-1 decision to UMass Dartmouth Thursday while ECSU had posted an 8-7, 11 inning verdict over Keene State.

UMass Dartmouth 7, Eastern Conn. 4

Junior lefty Eric Taylor (3-3), who allowed 12 hits in a complete-game 4-2 regular-season loss to Eastern April 29, allowed 13 hits this time around but survived several jams before giving way to junior righty Brian Ronayne with his team leading 7-3 and the bases loaded and two out in the ninth. Ronayne hit pinch hitter Morgan Thompson (NORWALK) to force in one run but recorded his second save of the year by getting ECSU sophomore rightfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) to line out to Doug Kelsch in right field to end the game.

Solo home runs off Taylor by sophomore leftfielder John Hedde (STONINGTON), Holowaty and sophomore first baseman John Kubachka (GLASTONBURY) helped ECSU junor righty Bryan DePaulo (WATERBURY) to carry a 3-1 lead into the sixth before the Corsairs scored four runs on five hits and an error. Mike Dougan put the Corsairs ahead for good 5-3 with a two-run, bases loaded double that chased DePaulo.

Trailing 7-3, Eastern threatened in the eighth by loading the bases for Kubachka on two walks and a single after there were two out. A diving catch by UMass centerfielder Jason Orlando on Kubachka's deep drive preserved the lead for Taylor, however.

In the ninth, ECSU hoped to rally for the second straight day, scoring once when Ronayne hit Thompson but leaving the bases loaded for the third time when Kelsch grabbed Holowaty's sharp drive.

Hedde, making his first tournament start, snapped a scoreless tie when he drilled his fourth home run of the season over the fence in dead center field on the first pitch of the fourth inning. With two outs, Holowaty made it 2-0 when he homered for the fifth time this year over the right-centerfield fence. Mike Rahme's leadoff home run in the bottom of the inning cut the lead in half but Kubachka restored the two-run margin with an inside-the-part home run -- his team-leading 11th home run of the year -- leading off the fifth.

Dougan, Ronayne and Guy Furtado each had two hits for UMass, with Ronayne also reaching twice on walks (one intentional). The Corsairs, who have beaten ECSU three times in four conference tournament games, played errorless defense and have committed only one error in two tournament games.

ECSU junior shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) continued to swing a hot bat, collecting three hits to give him seven hits in 11 tournamen at-bats. Junior centerfielder George Dixon (STAMFORD) was 4-for-5 with a double but did not contribute to any of the team's runs.

ECSU BASEBALL OPENS PLAY IN LITTL EAST THURSDAY Warriors face Keene State-Western Conn.winner in tourney at Gorham, ME

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team chases its second Little East Conference tournament title in four years when it opens play in the four-team, double elimination portion of the tournament Thursday at Gorham, ME.

Both Eastern (28-8) and host and top-seeded University of Southern Maine (29-10) advanced to the double-elimination portion of the tournament after drawing first-round byes. Eastern faces the winner of a Tuesday play-in game between sixth-seeded Western Connecticut (8-20) and third-seeded Keene State (20-14-1) Thursday at noon. Southern Maine, the defending tournament champion, meets the winner of the other Tuesday play-in game between fifth-seeded Rhode Island College (10-23) and fourth-seeded UMass Dartmouth (16-20) Thursday at 3:30 p.m.

The tournament continues with three games Friday beginning at 9:30 a.m. and concludes Saturday with the championship round, which gets underway at noon.

For the first time, the tournament champion receives an automatic berth in the 42-team NCAA Division III tournament, which gets underway May 18. Twenty-nine teams will qualify for the championship automatically. Only five non-winners of automatic-qualifying conferences will be selected nationwide for the NCAA tournament.

The Warriors finished with at least a share of the regular-season conference title for the fourth time in the four-year history of the conference. ECSU won 12 of its 14 regular-season conference games for the fourth straight season.

Eastern defeated both Keene State and Western Connecticut during the regular season, sweeping Keene State 7-2, 3-2 April 15 at Mansfield and taking single games from Western, 5-2 at home April 2 and 19-0 at Danbury last Wednesday.

As a team, Keene State has the top pitching earned run average (3.49) in the conference pitchers and features the top two pitchers in junior righty Matt Lavatori (6-2, 1.62) and senior righty Bill Williams (4-3, 2.17). During the regular season, ECSU sophomore lefty **David Olson (WATERFORD)** outdueled Lavatori in the first game of the doubleheader while sophomore righty **Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS)** outdueled Williams in the nightcap.

Williams, the conference leader with 96 strikeouts, allowed only three singles in eight innings in the loss to ECSU while fanning 11. He carried a 2-1 lead into the eight before the Warriors scored two uncarned runs.

Eastern, which won the 1998 conference tournament title en route to the national championship, leads Division III in fielding (.969) and is second in the conference in batting (.329), ERA (3.60) and scoring (7.97 runs per game).

Sophomore first baseman **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) leads the conference in batting (.474), hits (63), RBI (54) and doubles (16) and is second in home runs (10) while sophomore rightfielder **Jared Holowaty** (**COLUMBIA**) is the conference leader in runs (51). Junior right-handed pitcher **Michael Chadwick** (**SOUTH KINGSTOWN**, **RI**) is rated sixth in the conference in ERA (2.91) and Olson is seventh (3.33).

ECSU BASEBALL SWEEPS RIC IN LITTLE EAST FINALE Warriors finish with share of LEC regular-season title for fourth straight year

MANSFIELD, Conn. - Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) and John Kubachka (GLASTONBURY) each had a double and home run and combined for 11 hits, nine RBI and nine runs scored as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team swept Rhode Island College 14-2, 11-2 Saturday in Little East Conference action Saturday.

Eastern (28-8) finishes with a share of the conference regular-season title for the fourth year in the conference's four-year history, posting its fourth straight 12-2 record. ECSU shared last year's title, won the 1998 crown outright and won the LEC South Division championship in 1997. Eastern and regular-season co-champion University of Southern Maine receive first-round Little East Conference tournament byes and move into the four-team, double elimination portion of the tournament, which gets underway Thursday at Gorham, ME.

Eastern completes its home season with 14 wins in 16 games and has beaten the Anchormen the last 12 times the teams have met.

In the doubleheader, Tempesta had five hits and scored five runs while driving in four, walking once and reaching on a hit-by-pitch. Kubachka had six hits, drove in five and scored four. George Dixon (STAMFORD) added two hits in each game and also drove in two runs and scored two while Matthew Hebert (BURLINGTON) had a double and home run, drove in a run and walked once in the opener.

Junior righty Bryan DePaulo (WATERBURY) and sophomore righty Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS) started and earned victories. DePaulo (3-1) allowed three hits ' and both runs in the opener. He fanned four and walked four over the first six innings. Czerwinski (4-1) gave up seven hits and one run in the nightcap. He retired the first two batters of the sixth before giving way to freshman righty Matt Fortin (TOLLAND). Czerwinski struck out three and walked two.

Mike Bento had two hits in the opener for Rhode Island (10-23) and worked into the sixth inning of the nightcap on the mound.

ECSU BASEBALL ROUTS WESTERN CONN. IN LITTLE EAST 19-0 Warriors move into first-place tie in conference with Southern Maine

DANBURY, Conn. -- Three Eastern Connecticut State University pitchers combined on a one-hitter and five players had two or more hits as the Warriors routed Western Connecticut State University 19-0 Wednesday night in Little East Conference action.

By winning, Eastern (28-6, 10-2) pulls into a tie for first place in the conference with idle University of Southern Maine and moves one step closer to a share of its fourth conference regular-season title in the four-year history of Little East basebal competition.

Already assured of a first-round bye when the conference tournament gets underway next week as one of the top two regular-season finishers, Eastern remains in the hunt to host the conference tournament for the third straight year. With two conference games remaining for both Eastern and Southern Maine, ECSU must win the conference outright in order to host, due to its two regular-season losses to Southern Maine.

Leading 4-0, the Warriors chased former ECSU sub-varsity pitcher Greg Palanzo (1-4) when they scored seven times in the fourth on four hits and four Western (6-18, 2-8) errors. In the game, ECSU collected 18 hits and was aided by six Western errors.

ECSU junior righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) pitched the first six innings of the combined shutout and one-hitter, allowing only a second-inning single to Martin Acevedo while fanning nine and walking three. In his last three starts covering 25 innings, Chadwick has given up only one earned run (0.36 ERA) on 17 hits while fanning 29 and walking seven. Chadwick (4-2) lowered his season's ERA to 2.91 in 52.6 innings -- tops among ECSU starters.

Freshman second baseman Morgan Thompson (NORWALK) was 3-for-5 with two runs and an RBI in his first start while sophomore leftfielder Nick Scheets (MILFORD) was 3-for-6 (two doubles) with three runs and two RBI. Sophomore rightfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA), junior shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) and sophomore third baseman Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN) each had two hits. Holowaty scored four times as the leadoff batter and also

THREE-RUN FIFTH INNING CARRIES TUFTS BASEBALL PAST ECSU 5-2 Svencer, Brown combine on six-hitter as Warriors drop fourth in last six

MANSFIELD, Conn. — The Tufts University baseball team broke a tie with three runs in the fifth inning and went on to a 5-2 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Tuesday, sending the Warriors to their fourth loss in their last six outings.

Ranked eighth in New England, Tufts (22-11) scored three times in the fifth inning on two hits, a walk, sacrifice fly and throwing error to defeat the Warriors for the third straight time. ECSU (25-8), ranked third in New England and tied for 18th nationally, lost at home for the second straight game after 12 opening victories.

In the fifth inning, an infield throwing error with runners on first and second allowed Tufts to go ahead 3-2. Todd Boutwell followed with an RBI single and Dan Callahn drove in the third run of the inning with a sacrifice fly to right.

Nick Svencer and Zack Brown combined on a six-hitter for Tufts, with Brown preserving the win with two scoreless innings. Svencer gave up only five hits over seven innings while fanning five and walking four.

An RBI single by Joe Surprenant in the second inning and a home run by Boutwell in the third staked Tufts to a 2-0 lead before the Warriors tied the game in the third on a sacrifice fly by senior first baseman Jay Wetherell (MILFORD) and an infield RBI single by junior shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA).

NORTH DARTMOUTH, Mass. -- Junior shortstop Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA) drove in six runs with a grand slam and four doubles as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team swept the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth 21-10 and 4-2 Saturday in a Little East Conference doubleheader.

In snapping a season-high three-game losing streak, Eastern (25-7, 9-2) keeps pace in the race for the conference regular-season title, remaining in a two-way tie for first with the University of Southern Maine, which swept Keene State College Saturday. UMass Dartmouth is 14-18 overall, 7-5 in the conference.

Trailing 8-7 in the first game, Eastern scored 12 runs in the seventh inning to break the game open. The Warriors sent 16 batters to the plate in the inning, collecting nine hits, two walks and two hit batters against five pitchers. In that inning, sophomores

Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) and Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN) and freshman Morgan Thompson (NORWALK) each had two hits.

In the second game, sophomore righty **Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS**) equalled his season high with nine strikeouts while allowing only eight hits without a walk over the first eight innings en route to his third win in four decisions.

Holowaty led a 22-hit attack in the opener by going 5-for-6 — including his 100th career hit — with five runs scored and four RBI. Holowaty hit his third and fourth home runs in the game. Ormaechea was 4-for-5 with three runs scored, Thompson 3-for-3 with two RBI and three runs scored, Tempesta 3-for-5 with six RBI, including a grand slam and two doubles; and sophomore **John Kubachka** (GLASTONBURY) 3-for-7 with a double and two RBI.

On the day, Tempesta was 6-for-10 with a home run and four doubles. Kubachka raised his average to .463 by going 6-for-10.

In the opener, Kubachka had an RBI double and two-run home run -- his team-leading ninth of the season -- and junior **George Dixon** (**STAMFORD**) a sacrifice fly to give ECSU a 4-0 lead, which Czerwinski carried into the ninth. Czerwinski was removed after allowing three hits to open the inning but senior righty **Stephen Stonoha** (**DERBY**) picked up his third save of the season by getting two fly outs and a comebacker with the bases loaded.

BRIDGEWATER STATE RALLIES PAST EASTERN CONN. BASEBALL 6-2 Two-out ninth inning home run ties game, Bears score four in 12th on one hit

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Sophomore desiganed hitter Neil Brazie hit a two-out, game-tying home run in the ninth inning and the Bridgewater State College baseball team scored four runs in the 12th inning without the ball leaving the infield in a 6-2, 12-inning decision over Eastern Connecticut State University Thursday.

The loss is the first after 12 home wins this year for Eastern (23-7), which has lost a season-high three straight games. Bridgewater (22-3) is ranked seventh nationally, second in New England, Eastern is rated ninth nationally, first in New England.

The loss spoiled a ten-inning pitching effort by ECSU junior righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI), who carried a 2-0 lead into the ninth. Chadwick retired the first two batters in the ninth before Justin Twieraga reached when his fly ball to right was misplayed. Brazic then tied the game when he lofted an 0-1 pitch over the left field fence -- his second home run of the season. Brazie, the team's cleanup hitter, had fanned twice and popped to third prior to the ninth inning.

Bridgewater pitchers Mike Marini and Tim Hart escaped jams in both the tenth and 11th inning before the Bears scored four times in the 12th without the ball leaving the infield. Two walks and a hit batsmen loaded the bases with one out. Bridgewater then scored twice when Tony DeMeo's ground ball to first was thrown away at home and a double steal and Mike Sanborn's bunt single with a runner coming from third scored two more.

Chadwick equalled his career high of 12 strikeouts. He did not walk a batter and allowed only eight hits in pitching a career-high ten innings. Marini also pitched the first ten innings for the Bears, allowing only six hits while fanning eight and walking three. He also hit a batter.

Eastern had taken a 2-0 lead with single runs in the first and sixth and Chadwick sailed through the middle innings before the error and the game-tying home run in the ninth. Junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta** (**BROCKTON**, **MA**) drove in the first run for Eastern with a ground ball to short and he scored the second run on a throwing error after reaching on a walk.

Junior centerfielder **George Dixon (STAMFORD)** had three hits for Eastern, including a leadoff triple in the second which did not produce a run. Junior catcher **Matt Hebert** (**BURLINGTON**) had two hits.

Eastern returns to Little East Conference play Saturday at Massachusetts Dartmouth in a noon doubleheader.

ECSU BASEBALL SWEPT BY SOUTHERN MAINE 4-3, 11-5 Three teams now locked in first-place tie in Little East Conference

GORHAM, ME -- Jason Dority had a game-tying RBI double in the ninth inning and Shaun Richardson ended the game with a sacrifice fly as the University of Southern Maine baseball team rallied for a 4-3 Little East Conference win over Eastern Connecticut State University Tuesday on the way to a sweep of a doubleheader.

In the second game, sophomore lefty **David Olson** (**WATERFORD**) was driven from the mound during a five-run third inning as the hosts recorded an 11-5 victory — their 12th win in their last 13 games.

Eastern (23-6), Southern Maine (21-9) and Massachusetts Dartmouth are all locked in a three-way tie for first place in the conference, each with a 7-2 record. UMass Dartmouth missed out on a chance to stand alone in first place by dropping a 5-4 decision to Keene State Tuesday.

Junior centerfielder **George Dixon's (STAMFORD)** fifth home run of the season was a solo shot and gave the Warriors a 3-1 lead in the seventh inning of the first game but Southern Maine got one back in the bottom of the seventh following a leadoff double by Tyler Delorme and won the game in the ninth.

The loss is the first by a run after eight wins by that margin this year for Eastern, ranked first in New England and ninth nationally.

The loss spoiled the seven-inning pitching effort of ECSU junior righty **Bryan DePaulo** (**WATERBURY**). DePaulo allowed only five hits while fanning seven and walking three and was lifted with a 3-2 lead after the seventh inning.

Olson brought a lifetime record of 10-1 into action in the second game but didn't survive the third inning. He gave up seven hits and six runs before giving way to senior righty **Stephen Stonoha** (**DERBY**) when Southern Maine move out to a 8-3 lead with five runs on six hits in the third inning. Pat Toomey and Jody Curcuru, the 3-4 batters in the Southern Maine lineup, combined for six hits and three runs scored in the game. Curcuru drove in two and Toomey had a double and triple.

In the doubleheader, senior first baseman Jay Wetherell (MILFORD) was 5-for-9 with three doubles, three runs scored and an RBI. Dixon had three hits, scored twice and drove in two runs. First-game losing pitcher Matt Fortin (TOLLAND) appeared in both games and was reached for only one hit in four innings.

Eastern hosts Springfield College Wednesday at 7 p.m. The Warriors are 12-0 at home this season.

CHADWICK PITCHES ECSU BASEBALL PAST TRINITY 4-1 Junior pitches first career complete game for Warriors, now 12-0 at home

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Junior righthanded pitcher **Michael Chadwick** (**SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI**) scattered eight hits while fanning eight batters en route to his first career complete game as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team edged Trinity College 4-1 Wednesday night.

Trinity (17-6), ranked fourth in New England, reached Chadwick (3-2) for a run in the first on a sacrifice fly by cleanup hitter Brian Powell but the Warriors answered with single runs in the second, third, seventh and eighth. Eastern (23-4), now 12-0 at home and 15-2 up north, is ranked first in New England, ninth nationally.

The complete game was the first in 20 career starts for Chadwick, who had pitched the first nine innings in a 9-6, ten-inning home loss to Amherst College last April 14. Until tonight, Chadwick's longest outing this season had been an eight-and-one-third-inning stint March 29 in a 3-2 home win over Wesleyan University. The strikeout total was a season-high for Chadwick, who also walked four and hit a batter -- but allowed none of of those free passes after the fourth inning. Over the final five innings, Chadwick faced only four batters over the minimum when he was reached for two singles in the sixth, one in the seventh and one in the ninth.

Junior centerfielder **George Dixon** (**STAMFORD**) broke a 1-1 tie with a leadoff homer in the third off Trinity starter and loser Brendan Moss (3-2) and Dixon made it 3-1 in the seventh when his infield single plated senior first baseman **Jay Wetherell** (**MILFORD**). Wetherell had doubled to open the inning, moved to third on an infield out and scored when Dixon legged out the ground ball to second. Junior catcher **Matt Hebert** (**BURLINGTON**) drove in the final run in the eighth when he squeezed in sophomore leftfielder **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) from third.

Wetherell's hit-and-run single in the second -- sending sophomore DH Nick Scheets (MILFORD) to third -- helped ECSU score its first run. With runners on the corners and no one out, Scheets trotted home when sophomore third baseman Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN) grounded into a double play.

After Dixon's fourth home run in the third, Moss settled down, allowing only one more run heading into the bottom of the eighth. In the eighth, Moss was ejected by home plate umpire Dan Salce after unloading a pitch which sailed behind the head of ECSU junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta** (**BROCKTON**, **MA**) and to the backstop. The wild pitch allowed Kubachka to take third and he scored on Hebert's squeeze bunt to the right of the pitcher's mound off relief pitcher Justin Olewnik.

Chadwick escaped trouble in the first and second innings. He left two runners aboard in the first after Powell's sacrifice fly and left the bases loaded in the second by getting a strikeout and ground ball.

Dixon, Scheets and Wetherell all had two hits in ECSU's eight-hit offense, with Wetherell also reaching with a fourth-inning walk.

The Warriors visit Wheaton College Friday at 3 p.m.

ECSU BASEBALL REMAINS UNBEATEN IN LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE

Four pitchers limit Keene State to nine hits; three errors paye way in second game

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore starters Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS) and David Olson (WATERFORD) stopped Keene State College on seven hits as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team swept the Owls 7-2, 3-2 Saturday in a Little East Conference battle of the top-ranked pitching and defensive teams.

Czerwinski (2-1) outducled Kcene State starter Matt Lavatori (3-2) in the opener, with relief help from freshman Matt Fortin (TOLLAND). In the second game, Keene's Bill Williams was betrayed by his defense as the Warriors rallied from a one-run deficit by scoring twice in the eighth on a leadoff single by pinch hitter Matthew Hebert (BURLINGTON) and three infield errors.

The teams entered play ranked 1-2 in the conference in pitching and defense. Eastern (21-4) stays perfect in seven conference games this year, boosting its four-year regular-season conference record to 43-6. Keene start falls to 11-11-1, 3-3 in the conference after dropping to 6-0 against Eastern in three years of conference play. The Warriors also remain unbeaten in 11 home games this year and improve to 13-2 up north.

Olson (5-0), who leads the conference in ERA, allowed only four hits and two runs in the first game before turning a 3-2 lead over to Fortin with two outs in the eighth. Fortin walked the tying run into scoring position but got a ground ball to end the inning and the Warriors chalked up the win by scoring four times on four hits in the bottom of the eighth.

After being credited with his second save of the season in the opener, Fortin earned his first collegiate win in the nightcap when the Warriors scored their two unearned runs off Williams in the eighth. Fortin was inserted as the third ECSU pitcher to start the eighth and ECSU trailing 3-2. In the bottom of the eighth, Hebert singled to open the inning, pinch runner Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE) moved to second on an error by Williams and scored when sophomore rightfielder Jared Holowaty's (COLUMBIA) ground ball was misplayed at second. Holowaty then stole second and raced home with the go-ahead run when the Owls threw the ball into the dugout when they tried to nail him at third on an infield ground ball.

Williams (2-2), rated fourth in the conference in ERA, shut ECSU down on four singles. He walked only two and fanned 11 -- the most by an opposing pitcher this season. For Eastern, ranked first in Division III, the second-game win leaves it at 8-0 in one-run decisions this season.

In the doubleheader, Holowaty was 6-for-9 with four runs scored and three RBI. He had three of the team's four hits against Williams. His second home run of the season came in the opener and was a three-run blast in ECSU's four-run eighth inning. Sophomore John Kubachka (GLASTONBURY) had three hits on the day, including a two-run home run -- his team-leading eighth of the season -- in the first inning of the opener.

MONTCLAIR SNAPS 12-GAME ECSU BASEBALL'S WINNING STREAK 9-3 Red Hawks build 9-0 lead after four en route to sixth straight victory

LITTLE FALLS, NJ -- Six different players drove in at least one run as the Montclair State University baseball team snapped Eastern Connecticut State University's 12-game winning streak with a 9-3 victory Wednesday at Yogi Berra Stadium.

AMHERST HANDS ECSU BASEBALL SECOND LOSS IN ROW

Lord Jeffs' ace Kevin Downes wins seventh straight pitching decision

AMHERST, Mass. -- Junior righty Kevin Downes allowed the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to score in only two innings as Amherst College handed the Warriors their second loss in as many days, 5-3 Thursday.

Downes (7-0) allowed ten hits (nine singles) and carried a 5-2 lead into the ninth before giving way to sophomore righty Dave Krauser, who chalked up his team-leading fourth save. Downes fanned six and walked four.

The loss is the second in as many days for Eastern (19-4), ranked first nationally in Division III. The Warriors lost their first northern game after 11 wins and had a 12-game winning streak snapped in a 9-3 loss Wednesday at Montclair State University.

ECSU BASEBALL BOMBS PLYMOUTH STATE IN LITTLE EAST 9-1, 14-1 Warriors now 11-0 up north, extend winning streak to 12 with sweep

PLYMOUTH, NH -- Sophomore first baseman **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) and junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta** (**BROCKTON**, **MA**) combined for 13 hits, ten runs scored, eight RBI and 24 total bases as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team swept Plymouth State College 9-1, 14-1 Saturday in a Little East Conference baseball doubleheader.

With the sweep, the No. 1 nationally-ranked Warriors (19-2, 5-0 Little East) extend their winning streak to 12 and remain perfect in 11 games played up north. The northern-opening start is program's third-best and is the best since 12-0 in 1987. The program record for consecutive wins to open the northern season is 17 in 1978, when the Warriors went on to capture 30 of 32 regular-season northern contests.

On Saturday, Kubachka raised his season's average to a team-leading .519 by going 7-for-9 with seven RBI and four runs scored. Among his hits were three doubles and his team-leading sixth and seventh home runs of the season. In the opening win, he was 4-for-5 with two home runs, a double, six RBI and two runs scored.

On the day, Tempesta was 6-for-9 with two doubles, six runs scored an an RBI. Sophomore utility player **Kevin Rival** (NEW BRITAIN) had four hits, iincluding two doubles, three runs scored and three RBI while sophomore outfielder **Jared Holowaty** (COLUMBIA) had three hits, four RBI and scored three runs. Tempesta is batting a team-leading .465 up north and with Saturday's performance raised his season's mark over .400 to .418.

Four ECSU pitchers limited Plymouth (6-9-1, 0-4 Little East) to eight singles. In the opener, junior righty **Bryan DePaulo (WATERBURY)** registered his first complete game at ECSU in his fourth start and raised his record to 2-0. He allowed only two hits and no earned runs while fanning eight and walking three. Sophomore lefty **David Olson (WATERFORD)** lowered his teamleading ERA to 1.33 by limiting the Panthers to one run on six hits in the first seven innings of the nightcap. Olson (4-0) fanned five and walked three.

Up north this season, Eastern is batting .324 with a staff ERA of 2.00 and has committed only three errors (.993).

The Warriors travel to face Montclair State University Tuesday at 4 p.m. It will be the first meeting between the clubs since ECSU downed the Red Hawks 16-1 in the 1998 national championship game at Salem, VA.

KUBACHKA'S HOME RUN LIFTS ECSU BASEBALL IN 11TH INNING Warriors rally twice to subdue '99 regional champion Brandeis 7-6

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Sophomore first baseman **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) hit a three-run home run with one out in the bottom of the 11th inning to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 7-6 win over Brandeis University Wednesday at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

The Warriors (16-2) had forced extra innings by tying the game on junior centerfielder **George Dixon**'s (**STAMFORD**) two-run single with one out in the bottom of the ninth inning but the Judges (7-10) regained a two-run lead in the 11th on a leadoff home run by Adam Zoldak -- his first of the season -- and ground ball by Steve Wahlbrink.

With one out in the 11th, losing pitcher Sean Ewers (0-1) walked sophomore DH **Justin Waz** (**DEEP RIVER**) and hit junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta** (**BROCKTON**, **MA**) before Kubachka launched his fourth home run of the season off the scoreboard beyond the left-center field fence. The hit was the only one of the game for Kubachka, who has hit safely in all 18 games this year and is batting .500 (33-for-66) with 55 total bases and 31 RBI.

The win is the ninth straight for Eastern, ranked first in Division III. The Warriors are unbeaten in eight home northern games and are 7-0 in games decided by one run. Brandeis is the defending NCAA Division III New England Regional champion.

Wahlbrink of Brandeis, a 1999 third-team all-America pitcher, carried a 4-2 lead into the ninth before the Warriors rallied to tie the game. Sophomore leftfielder Nick Scheets (MILFORD) opened the inning by doubling to right for his third hit of the game and moved to third on a one-out single to right by sophomore third baseman Inaki Ormaechea (NEW BRITAIN). Running for Ormaechea, junior Brian Gouin (SPRAGUE) moved into scoring position by stealing second before No. 9 hitter Dixon delivered a two-run single to right on a 1-2 pitch.

ECSU junior righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) allowed only one baserunner (walk) through the first three innings and led 1-0 before Brandeis tied the game on a two-out RBI single left by Jeremy Taro and went ahead 3-1 on a two-out RBI triple by No. 4 hitter Dave Cimini and RBI single by Taro. Senior righty Jay Wetherell (MILFORD), the fourth ECSU pitcher, got the final two outs of the 11th to record his first win this season.

Adam Zoldak, who doubled and scored Brandeis' first run in the fourth, finished with three hits, and two runs scored while leadoff hitter Jim Freethey walked twice and scored twice and stole three bases.

Tempesta was 2-for-4 to improve his average on the current nine-game winning streak to .500 (18-for-36). Ormaechea and Dixon also had two hits.

SCHEETS HOME RUN SPARKS ECSU BASEBALL TO TENTH STRAIGHT WIN Warriors unbeaten in nine northern games after 11-4 win over Westfield State

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Sophomore leftfielder **Nick Scheets**'s (**MILFORD**) first home run of the season highlighted a four-run third inning and sparked the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to its tenth straight win, an 11-4 victory over Westfield State College Thursday.

For Eastern (17-2), ranked first nationally in Division III, the win is the ninth in as many northern home games. The Owls are 7-11.

Cleanup hitter Josue Zamora had staked the Owls to a 4-1 lead with a two-run home run in the first and two-run single in the top of the third. The Warriors answered with four unearned runs in the third to take the lead for good 5-4 and added two more in the fifth. Eastern scored its four runs in the third on two hits — including Scheets's home run to right-center — along with a sacrifice fly, walk and run-producing double steal.

Sophomore DH John Kubachka (GLASTONBURY) hit safely in his 19th straight game when he drilled his team-leading fifth home run of the season in the seventh. Kubachka has had a home run in his last three games and four of his last five. His home run in the last three games have been his only hit of the game.

Eastern returns to Little East Conference play Saturday with a noon doubleheader at Plymouth State College.

TEMPESTA LEADS ECSU BASEBALL PAST MASS COLLEGE 8-3
Junior shortstop drives in four runs, throws out go-ahead run at plate in eighth

STONOHA SAVES ECSU BASEBALL WIN OVER WESLEYAN 3-2 Senior gets game-ending strikeout for second year vs. Cardinals

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Senior right-handed pitcher **Stephen Stonoha (DERBY)** needed three pitches to save Eastern Connecticut State University's 3-2 baseball win over Wesleyan University Wednesday.

Ranked first in New England, Eastern (11-2) improved to 6-0 in one-run games this year when Stonoha got Wesleyan cleanup batter Dave Bushnell on a swinging strikeout with the bases loaded to end the game.

Trailing 3-0 entering the ninth, Wesleyan (7-4) scored twice on a leadoff single and four walks. With the bases loaded, Stonoha replaced sophomore righty John Kubachka (GLASTONBURY), who had walked in two runs in relief of winning pitcher Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI). It is the first save this season for Stonoha, fourth of his career.

It marks the second straight year that Stonoha has preserved a one-run win over Wesleyan by getting a game-ending strikeout with the bases loaded. In last year's 7-6 win over New England's No. 1 ranked team -- a victory which gave ECSU head coach Bill Holowaty his 900th coaching triumph -- Stonoha came on to complete a walk with two pitches in the ninth before striking out No. 8 hitter Geoff Dailey.

The win is the sixth in as many years over Wesleyan for Eastern, ranked second nationally in Division III.

In search of his first career shutout, Chadwick (2-1) carried a 3-0 lead into the ninth but was lifted after the first two Wesleyan batters reached.

All three ECSU runs off Wesleyan freshman righty Rob Guglielmino (1-2) on four hits in the third. Junior centerfielder **George Dixon (STAMFORD)** followed a leadoff double by junior second baseman **Javy Madera (PONCE, P.R.)** with his team-leading third home run of the season — a first-pitch blast to dead center. With one out, junior shortstop **Nick Tempesta (BROCKTON, MA)** singled to left and with two outs, Kubachka drilled an opposite-field RBI double to right to make it 3-0.

Against Guglielmino, however, the Warriors managed only two hits the rest of the way.

Wesleyan threatened several times before the ninth but Chadwick got out of bases loaded jams in both the first and sixth innings with infield ground balls. In the eighth, Chadwick surrendered a one-out double but got an infield out and inning-ending strikeout.

OLSON PITCHES ECSU BASEBALL PAST U. OF REDLANDS 9-0 Warriors complete most successful California trip ever with 8-2 record

REDLANDS, CA -- Sophomore lefty **David Olson (WATERFORD)** allowed five hits in eight innings and sophomore leftfielder **Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA)** was 5-for-5 as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team closed out its most successful California trip with a 9-0 win over the University of Redlands Saturday.

Eastern (10-2) finishes its eight-day trip with an 8-2 record and a three-game winning streak. The win is the second over Redlands (9-14-1) in seven days, the Warriors nipping the Bulldogs 7-6 last Sunday in the third round of the California Invitational.

Others with multiple hits in the team's 15-hit attack were first baseman Kubachka, sophomore leftfielder **John Hedde** (STONINGTON) and sophomore DH Nick Scheets (MILFORD). Hedde and Kubachka each had two doubles. Hedde drove in three runs with an RBI double in the first and two-run double in the ninth and also scored twice. Rival had two sacrifice flies. Kubachka was 2-for-5 and closed out the trip with a .581 batting average (25-for-43).

Sophomore collects seven hits as Warriors win two one-run games

CLAREMONT, Calif. -- Sophomore first baseman **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) was 7-for-9 with four runs and four RBI to lead the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to two one-run wins Friday.

In the opening 8-7 win over North Central College (4-5), Kubachka was 4-for-4 with two runs and two RBI and senior righty **Stephen Stonoha** (**DERBY**) allowed only one run in a career-high seven-and-one-third innings in relief. CLAREMONT, Calif. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team wasted 17 hits in dropping its first game of the season, a 9-7 decision to Pomona-Pitzer Colleges Wednesday.

Kubachka currently leads the team with a .536 average (15-for-28), while Rival is next at .522 (12-for-23) and Scheets third at .429 (12-for-28).

Eastern, ranked second nationally in Division III, visits tenth-ranked Chapman University Thursday. The Panthers have beaten the Warriors all five times the teams have met.

In his collegiate debut, Smith walked in the tying run but escaped further damage by inducing an inning-ending fly ball to center. Sinatro walked I batters while Smith issued two free passes.

Holowaty and Wetherell each drove in two runs for Eatsern while sophomore DH **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**) had two of the team's eight hits. Kubachka, who had five RBI in each of the team's first two tournament victories, is batting .600 (9-for-16) with 11 RBI and five runs scored in five games this season. Eastern trailed 5-4 before Kubachka hit a three-run home run to put the Warriors ahead 7-5 with no one out in the sixth and sophomore **Kevin Rival** (**NEW BRITAIN**) followed later in the inning with a pinch two-out, two-run home run to make it 9-5.

Rival was credited with his second career save when he stranded three runners by getting two strikeouts and a game-ending ground ball to second. Senor righty **Stephen Stonoha (DERBY)** won his fourth career game in as many decisions in relief of starter **Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS)**. Rival replaced Stonoha (1-0) with two runners aboard and ECSU leading 9-6 in the sixth. He hit the first batter he faced to load the bases, balked in the Bulldogs' seventh run of the game, and loaded the bases again with a walk before getting the final three outs.

Kubachka and sophomore rightfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) each had three hits and two runs scored for Eastern while junior catcher Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) and junior centerfielder George Dixon (STAMFORD) had two hits each. Both of Dixon's hits were doubles.

Mac Strang had three hits and two RBI for Pacific (1-8) while Matt Lengwenus had two hits and scored twice.

CHADWICK HURLS ECSU BASEBALL PAST OLD WESTBURY 5-0 Junior right-handed pitcher does not allow a hit in five-inning stint

MANSFIELD, Conn. -- Junior right-handed pitcher Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) did not allow a hit while working the first five innings as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team blanked SUNY-Old Westbury 5-0 Saturday in a game stopped after seven innings due to rain. The scheduled second game of the doubleheader was cancelled.

Chadwick, who fanned five, faced only three batters over the minimum in his first outing of the year. He allowed four baserunners, three on walks and one on an error. One of the baserunners was erased trying to steal second base. The Panthers (0-2) threatened to break through in the third when they had a runner on third with two out by Chadwick got No. 3 hitter Orel Wells to pop to second to end the inning. Freshman righty Matt Fortin (TOLLAND) allowed Old Westbury's only hit -- a one out single in the seventh -- in his debut. He fanned three and walked one.

Sophomore rightfielder Jared Holowaty (COLUMBIA) scored the first run of the game in the bottom of the first and drove in the second run with a single in the second inning. Junior catcher Matt Hebert (BURLINGTON) drove in Holowaty in the first with a ground ball and walked and scored the team's final run in the fifth. Freshman catcher Jeff Funaro (MILFORD) had his first hit, extra base hit and RBI with a double down the left field line in the fourth.

Eastern (2-0) is scheduled to play ten games in eight days in California beginning next Saturday.

CZERWINSKI, STONOHA LEAD ECSU BASEBALL PAST OLD WESTBURY Waz drives in three runs in first career start in season-opening 5-3 win

MANSFIELD, Conn. — Adam Czerwinski (SOMERS) and Stephen Stonoha (DERBY) combined on a six-hitter with 15 strikeouts as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team won its 17th straight home-opener with a 5-3 win over SUNY-Old Westbury Friday night.

Czerwinski, a sophomore righty, allowed three hits and two earned runs with a career-high nine strikeouts over the first five innings while Stonoha, a senior righty, limited the Panthers to three hits and one earned run while fanning a career-high six over the final four innings.

Sophomore DH Justin Waz (DEEP RIVER) drove in three runs with a tie-breaking two-run home run in the second inning and a sacrifice fly in the sixth. It was the first career start for Waz, who had driven in two runs in ten games off the bench last year.

In both the two-run first inning and two-run second inning, Eastern rallied after there were two out and no one on base.

The Panthers (0-1) tied the game in the second on solo home runs off Czerwinski but Waz hit a two-out, two-run opposite field home run to left to give ECSU the lead for good 4-2 in the second. Czerwinski, who struck out the first four batters he faced, allowed only one hit while fanning five and walking one over his final three innings.

Sophomore first baseman **John Kubachka** (**GLASTONBURY**), a first-year transfer from Wake Forest, had given ECSU a 1-0 lead with a two-out single to left-center in the first inning and the second run of the inning scored on an infield error. Waz and junior catcher **Matt Hebert** (**BURLINGTON**) each had two hits for the Warriors, who got hits from eight different players.

Eastern hosts Old Westbury in a 9:30 a.m. doubleheader Saturday. Junior righty Michael Chadwick (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) and junior lefty Matt Sinatro (WEST HARTFORD) are expected to open on the mound for Eastern.
