ESPOSITO, DIPIETRO PITCH EASTERN BASEBALL PAST UMD Led by Koch, Garofalo, Warriors collect 25 hits in Little East Conference sweep

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Freshman righty **Joe Esposito (EAST HAVEN)** won his fifth straight decision in the opener and junior lefty **Ryan DiPietro (KENSINGTON)** struck out his 300th career batter in the nightcap in sparking the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 7-0, 8-1 Little East Conference sweep of the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth Sunday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked 13th nationally, Eastern (23-7, 8-1 little east) improved its northern record to 17-2 and its home record to 14-2 and is now 17-2 against UMass Dartmouth (9-21, 3-7 little east) in nine years of regular-season conference play.

In search of its fourth straight regular-season title, Eastern has opened up a 2 ½ game lead in the conference over Keene State and Rhode Island College, both at 5-3. The University of Southern Maine (4-3) fell three games off the pace and into a tie for fourth place with Western Connecticut State University after being swept by the host Colonials Sunday. Each conference team is scheduled to play 14 regular-season conference games. The No. 1 seed in the final regular-season standings hosts the six-team, double-climination conference tournament, which is scheduled for May 11-14.

Esposito (5-1) and DiPietro (5-1) pitched the first seven innings of their respective games. Esposito lowered his northern ERA to 1.10 in 32 1/3 innings by combining on a shutout. He scattered five hits while striking out eight and walking two. He has allowed runs in only one of his last six games — giving up four in 7 2/3 innings in a 20-5 win over Southern Maine last Saturday.

DiPietro, who had a 16-game regular-season winning streak broken last Saturday in an 8-0 loss to Southern Maine, allowed one (earned) run on seven hits while fanning ten and walking one. DiPietro's first five outs came by strikeout. He ended the third inning by fanning cleanup hitter Chris Waymon for his seventh of the game and the 300th of his

career. He becomes only the second Eastern pitcher to fan as many as 300 batters in a career, joining eventual major leaguer John Caneira, who struck out 547 between 1971 and 1974.

Seven of Eastern's 25 hits in the doubleheader went for extra bases, with nine batters collecting at least two hits, four scoring at least two runs and four driving in at least two runs.

Senior shortstop **Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI)**, senior leftfielder **Jason Pekrul** (**BERLIN**) and sophomore centerfielder **Randy Re (DANBURY)** continued their torrid hitting in the doubleheader. Koch went 4-for-7 with two RBI to raise his batting average in the last six games to .579 (11-for-19) with four doubles, 11 RBI and five runs; Pekrul, batting leadoff, was 3-for-9 with a run scored and is now batting .409 (9-for-22) in his last five games; and Re was 3-for-7 with three runs scored and an RBI and is batting .500 (12-for-24) with three doubles, three home runs, ten runs scored and seven RBI during a six-game hitting streak.

Junior utility player Marc Garofalo (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) was 4-for-4 with four RBI and three runs scored in the first game. Batting cleanup, Garofalo drove in the first run of the game with a single and later scored in the first inning, singled in the third inning, tripled in two runs and scored in the fifth and followed Re's leadoff home run in the seventh with his third homer of the year.

In the second game, first-year sophomore second baseman Alex Cardona (WEST HAVEN) had two hits, scored two runs and hit a three-run home run to left in the seventh inning.

Koch is second on the team in batting this year with a .373 average, with Garofalo at .354, Re at .330 and Pekrul at .328.

Eastern visits Trinity College Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. for a non-conference game. Trinity is ranked first in New England, Eastern third.

EASTERN BASEBALL RALLIES PAST BRIDGEWATER STATE 10-7

Warriors tie the game with three in sixth, Galemba hits go-ahead HR in seventh

BRIDGEWATER, Mass. – The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team tied the game with three runs in the sixth inning and senior designated hitter Leon Galemba (FAIRFIELD) hit a go-ahead home run leading off the seventh in a 10-7 non-conference win over Bridgewater State College Wednesday afternoon at Alumni Park.

With its seventh straight win over Bridgewater (18-8), No. 13 nationally-ranked Eastern (21-7) improves to 15-2 up north. Eastern is ranked third in New England, Bridgewater seventh.

Trailing 7-4, Eastern tied the game in the sixth on RBI singles by junior rightfielder Greg Sullivan (NEEDHAM, MA) and sophomore catcher Matt Cooney (ARLINGTON, MA) with none out and a ground ball by senior leftfielder Jason Pekrul (BERLIN). Galemba put Eastern ahead for good when he hit a 1-0 pitch over the left field fence for his third home run of the year and sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY) added two insurance runs with his teamleading fourth home run of the year with two out in the eighth.

As the second of five Eastern pitchers, junior righty Alex Narus (PROSPECT) won his first game at Eastern. Narus, who won two games at Division I Manhattan in 2003, replaced left-handed starter Matt Cremins (STOUGHTON, MA) while the Bears were taking a 7-4 lead with four unearned runs in the fourth. Narus recorded the final out of the fourth when Re threw out Christian Perry at home on a single by Steve Smith and scattered three hits until giving way to junior righty Brian Wendell (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) with two on and one out in the eighth and Eastern leading 10-7. Wendell got a strikeout but then walked the bases loaded before junior lefty All-America Ryan DiPietro (KENSINGTON) came on to strand three runners when he got a comebacker to the mound.

Senior righty Ben O'Brien (MONTVILLE) faced four batters in the ninth – striking out two – to record his fourth save of the year – third in his last six appearances.

Sullivan and Galemba each had three hits in Eastern's 14-hit attack while Re and Pekrul had two each. Sullivan drove in a run with a triple and later scored when the Warriors scored twice to tie the game 3-3 in the second. He finished with three RBI and scored two runs while Re scored three times and drove in two and Galemba scored twice. During a six-game hitting streak, Sullivan is 8-for-19 (.421) with six runs scored. In the last three games, Re is 8-for-13 (.615) with seven runs scored, six RBI and three stolen bases.

Junior infielder **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)** was hitless in six plate appearances that ended his 14-game hitting streak. Mehrbach flied out three times, lined out and grounded out once and had a sacrifice bunt.

Bridgewater freshman leftfielder Steve Smith was 4-for-5 to extend his hitting streak to all 26 games this year. Senior shortstop Ryan Fitzgerald was 2-for-5 with three RBI and two runs scored. Fitzgerald's third home run of the season gave the Bears a 3-1 lead in the first inning.

Eastern hosts Massachusetts Dartmouth Saturday at 2 p.m. in a Little East Conference doubleheader.

EASTERN BASEBALL OUTSLUGS SUFFOLK 11-10

Warriors rally from early deficit to post 34th straight 20-win season

MANSFIELD, Conn. – **Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI)** drove in two runs with a two-strike, opposite-field single to right to spark a three-run seventh inning that helped carry the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to an 11-10 win over Sufolk University Monday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked 13th nationally and third in New England, Eastern (20-7) recorded its 34th straight 20-win season with its fifth straight victory over Suffolk (16-10). The Rams, 12-4 up north, are ranked in a time for eighth in New England.

Suffolk scored three runs in the top of the seventh to tie the game 8-8 but the Warriors went ahead for good by scoring three times in the bottom of the inning. Freshman righty Greg DiMarco (0-1) took over on the mound for Suffolk to start the seventh but Eastern loaded the bases on a leadoff double by sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY), a walk to junior DH Ryan DiPietro (KENSINGTON) and a sacrifice bunt fielder's choice by junior righfielder Greg Sullivan (NEEDHAM, MA). Koch, a senior shortstop, then doubled down the right field line on an 0-2 pitch to plate Re and DiPietro with the go-ahead runs and Sullivan scored from third to make it 11-8 when sophomore catcher Matt Cooney (ARLINGTON, MA) grounded into a double play.

Both teams bounced back from deficits to tie the game 8-8. Trailing 4-0, the Warriors scored three times in the bottom of the fourth to tie the game on an RBI double by DiPietro, sacrifice fly by Koch and an infield ground ball. Trailing 5-4, Eastern scored four times in the bottom of the sixth to move out to an 8-5 lead. Koch's RBI double tied the game and junior first baseman **Chris DeSantis** (SHREWBURY, MA) gave Eastern a three-run lead when he drove a 1-2 pitch from starter Rony Mercado over the right field fence.

Re reached safely four times with three hits and a walk and scored two runs while DeSantis and Koch each drove in four runs with two hits. Sullivan scored the tying run in the fourth, the first run in the four-run sixth and the last run in the seventh which proved to be the margin of victory.

Senior first baseman and cleanup hitter Tamayo Manzanillo drove in six runs for Suffolk by collecting five of his team's 17 hits. He gave the Rams a 1-0 lead with an RBI single in the first, doubled and scored leading off the third, gave Suffolk a 5-4 lead with an RBI single in the sixth, tied the game 8-8 with a two-run, two-out single in the seventh, and hit a two-run home run with one out in the ninth to cut Eastern's lead to one. The hit was the only one allowed by winning pitcher **Brian Wendell (SOUTH KINGSTOWN**, RI), who had come on to end Suffolk's three-run seventh by getting an inning-ending foul out to third. Wendell (2-0), a junior righty, put the tying run on first with a walk after Manzanillo's home run in the ninth but forced a game-ending double play, began by Koch at short.

For Eastern, junior infielder Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH) hit safely in his 14th straight game when he doubled and scored the team's first run on DeSantis' two-out single in the third.

Senior centerfielder and leadoff hitter Mike Maguire had four hits and scored two runs. Batting behind Maguire, sophomore second baseman Dave DeMaria had two hits, scored twice and drove in two runs while junior rightfielder Trevor Grimshaw reached safely four times and scored two runs. He had two singles and was hit by pitch twice.

In 16 northern games, Eastern has won 14 and is batting .377 and averaging 14.6 hits per game. Among regulars, Mehrbach is batting .472 up north (.446 overall) and Koch .429 (.363 overall).

MEHRBACH POWERS EASTERN BASEBALL TO LITTLE EAST SPLIT

Junior infielder extends hitting streak to 13 in 8-0 loss, 20-5 win over USM

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Junior infielder Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH) had six hits and drove in four runs in extending his hitting streak to 13 games and sparking the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a Little East Conference doubleheader split with the University of southern Maine Saturday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

All-New England junior righty Tip Fairchild (Monmouth, ME) stymied Eastern on six hits in the first game in pitching his first shutout of the year in Southern Maine's (13-6, 3-1 little east) 8-0 first-game win that snapped Eastern's 11-game winning streak.

In the second game, the Warriors pummeled five Southern Maine pitchers for 22 hits and freshman **righty Joe Esposito (EAST HAVEN)** won his fourth straight decision in a 20-5 victory that was the Warriors' 13th win in 15 northern games. It was the most runs scored in a regular-season conference game between the two teams and the most against Southern Maine for Eastern since it won 23-3 in the 1987 NCAA Division III Northeast Regional Tournament championship round at the old Alumni Field.

On Saturday, the top three teams in the conference all split doubleheaders. In addition to this split, Keene State College split with Massachusetts Dartmouth. Eastern, which has won the last three regular-season conference titles outright, leads Keene State (4-1) by one game, with Southern Maine a half-game behind Keene. Each team is scheduled to play 14 regular-season conference games.

Mehrbach raised his team-leading batting average to .458 by going 6-for-9 on the day and matched sophomore centerfielder **Randy Re (DANBURY)** with four RBI. Mehrbach, who was 12-for-18 in four games this week, had three of Eastern's hits in the opener against Fairchild (4-1) and three more to go along with four RBI in the nightcap. In the second game, he had RBI singles in the third, fifth and seventh innings and a run-scoring sacrifice fly in the fourth.

Eleven players had hits in the doubleheader for Eastern, ranked 13th nationally in Division III. Batting eighth in the order, senior shortstop **Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI)** drove in three runs and scored four with four hits in the second game. He singled and scored in the third, doubled and second in the fourth, drove in a run with a single and scored in the sixth and drove in two runs with a double and scored in the seventh.

In the second game, No 1-2-3 hitters Jason Pekrul (BERLIN), Mehrbach and Re each had three hits and combined to drive in ten runs and score six. Batting ninth, sophomore catcher Matt Cooney (ARLINGTON, MA) was 3-for-3 with two runs scored and two RBI. Re hit a there-run home run in the third, junior rightfielder Marc Garofalo (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) a solo home run leading off the second and junior first baseman Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) a solo home run leading off the fifth.

Esposito, who has not lost since March 6, extended a personal streak of innings without allowing an earned run to 31 before the Huskies broke through for a run in the sixth on two walks, two singles and a sacrifice fly. Esposito gave up seven hits and four (earned) runs before giving way to junior righty **Brian Wendell (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI)** with two out in the eighth. Esposito fanned eight and walked three.

All-America junior lefty **Ryan DiPietro** (KENSINGTON) lost the opener, ending a string of 16 straight regular-season victories. DiPietro was lifted with one out in the seventh. He allowed five runs (three earned) on eight hits with four strikeouts and three walks. His strikeout total moves him to within seven of becoming the second pitcher in program history with as many as 300 career strikeouts. The loss was only the third against 25 career wins for DiPietro, whose losses have all come to teams which have won Division III national championships.

With the first-game win, Southern Maine stopped a five-game losing streak at the hands of Eastern, which has won ten of the last 14 meetings with the former two-time national champions. Southern Maine broke a scoreless tie with three runs in the top of the sixth and went on to score all of its runs in its final four at-bats. Fairchild opened the sixth with a single and scored the first run of the game. Sophomore first baseman Joe McGhee (Walpole, MA), sophomore catcher Max Arsenault (Boothbay, ME) and freshman centerfielder Eddie Skeffington (Everett, MA) contributed run-scoring singles in the inning.

With one out in the fourth inning of the first game, Eastern junior rightfielder Greg Sullivan (NEEDHAM, MA) recorded his 100th career hit in his 106th career game with a single up the middle.

EASTERN BASEBALL POUNDS SPRINGFIELD FOR 11th STRAIGHT Warriors improve northern record to 12-1 with 14-2 victory over Pride

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. – Twelve players contributed a hit in a 17-hit attack as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rolled to a 14-2 non-conference win over Springfield College Wednesday afternoon at Berry-Allen Field.

Ranked 13th nationally, Eastern (18-6) won its 11th straight game and upped its northern record to 12-1. The road game was only the Warriors' second since March 25.

Sixteen of Eastern's hits were singles, the Warriors scored eight unanswered runs in their first three at-bats. Redshirt freshman righty **Trey Bongiovanni (MERIDEN)** won his third game in his fourth decision. In his first collegiate start (eighth appearance), Bongiovanni stopped Springfield (8-13) on five hits and one (earned) run. He fanned two and walked two over a season-high six innings.

The top seven players in the order who came to bat had at least one hit and combined for 12 hits, scored eight runs and drove in seven. Junior second baseman Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH) extended his hitting streak to 11 games with his 13th multiple-hit game of the year. Mehrbach, who is batting .600 (15-for-25) in his last six games, was 3-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored. Adding two hits each were redshirt freshman Jared Nelson (WILLIMANTIC), junior first baseman Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) and junior third baseman Marc Garofalo (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI). Nelson was a late-inning replacement for Mehrbach. Sophomore catcher Matt Cooney (ARLINGTON, MA) stroked his first career home run leading off the second inning.

Staked to an 8-0 lead, Bongiovanni pitched four scoreless innings before the Pride scored their first run in the fifth after there were two out on a walk and two singles. Right-handed Springfield College junior ace Jon Davis (3-3) was knocked from the box in the third inning after allowing eight runs (seven earned) on seven hits.

BEHIND 16-HIT ATTACK, EASTERN WINS TENTH STRAIGHT, 7-3

Top four hitters in lineup collect ten hits, score four runs and drive in four

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Junior infielder **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)** extended his hitting streak to ten games with his 12th multiple-hit game of the year to pace the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 7-3 win over Babson College Monday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked 13th nationally and second in New England, Eastern (17-6) won its tenth straight game, improving its northern record to 11-1 and home record to 10-1. The game was a re-match of last year's NCAA Division III New England Regional Tournament second-round game, won 8-0 by Eastern here over Babson (9-10).

Eight of ten batters who came to the plate contributed a hit to a 16-hit attack for Eastern, which is batting .382 up north.

Batting 1-2 in the lineup, senior leftfielder Jason Pekrul (BERLIN) and Mehrbach each had three hits, scored two runs and drove in one while No. 3 hitter Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) and cleanup hitter Marc Garofalo (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) each had two hits. DeSantis drove in two runs with singles in the first and third. Sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY) reached safely with two hits and a walk and drove in runs with singles in the third and fourth innings. Senior shortstop Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI) also reached three times with two singles and a walk, scored two runs and drove in one.

Mehrbach, namd the Offensive Player-of-the-Week in the Little East Conference today, has hit safely in 21 of 23 games this year and reached safely in all but one. By going 3-for-5, he raised his team-leading batting average 15 points to .4.4. This year, he has had four hits in a game twice, three hits three times and two hits seven times.

Sophomore lefty **Matt Cremins (STOUGHTON, MA)** allowed only one unearned run on ten hits while fanning two and walking two over the first six innings to gain his first win of the season and second of his career. It was the first win as a starter for Cremins (1-2), who was making his fourth career start. He also won his first home game and lowered his earned run average from 2.95 to 2.31.

Babson, which is 9-5 up north, got three hits from sophomore shortstop and leadoff hitter Billy Schmitt (Fairview, NJ) and two hits from sophomore first baseman Ryan Campell (Manchester, NH), freshman leftfielder Jay Verrill (Auburn, ME) and freshman third baseman John Hudspeth (Mount Laurel, NJ). Babson had five freshmen in its starting lineup, among them starting right-handed pitcher Sam Whelan (Milton, MA).

SURGING EASTERN BASEBALL TEAM BOUNCES ALBERTUS, 20-4 Fourteen players contribute hit, run or RBI as Warriors win ninth straight

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Fourteen different players contributed a hit, run or RBI in a 22-hit attack as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team downed Albertus Magnus College 20-4 Sunday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

The win is the ninth straight for Eastern (16-6) and tenth in 11 northern games in the last 13 days. The Warriors completed a 6-0 week with the victory over Albertus (4-11), which has lost four straight.

Nine of Eastern's hits went for extra bases, with the Warriors tying a program record with four triples. Four pitchers combined on a five-hitter with 12 strikeouts.

Sophomore second baseman Alex Cardona (WEST HAVEN), who was the starting shortstop at Albertus last year, doubled and triple and finished with season-highs for hits (4), RBI (4) and runs (2) as one of seven players with two or more hits. Freshman rightfielder Dan Olmstead (CLINTON, NY) came off the bench to go 3-for-3 with three runs scored. Others picking up two hits were redshirt freshman infielder Jared Nelson (WILLIMANTIC), sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY), senior DH Leon Galemba (FAIRFIELD), senior pitcher Ben O'Brien (MONTVILLE) and junior catcher Hector Colon (HARTFORD). The at-bats were the first in the career of O'Brien while Colon had a triple and first career home run, drove in three runs and scored two in his first career start.

Junior infielder Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH) doubled and scored in the second inning to extend his hitting streak to nine games. Mehrbach has hit safely in all but two games this year and is batting .429 in 11 northern games.

Sophomore righty Sam Iverson (NEW MILFORD) pitched the first five innings to gain his third win in fourth decisions. He fanned four and walked three and allowed five hits and three runs (two earned) to post his seventh career win in eight decisions. Junior righty Brian Wendell (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) pitched the final two innings, fanning the first five batters her faced.

Eastern plays its 11th home game in 12 northern contests Monday at 4 p.m. when it hosts Babson College. Eastern defeated Babson 8-0 in the second round of last year's NCAA Division III New England Regional Tournament here.

MEHRBACH, ESPOSITO LEAD EASTERN BASEBALL TO LEC SWEEP

Warriors rally in first game, ride Esposito's three-hitter in nightcap vs. UMB

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Junior infielder **Zach Mehrbach** (**LYME**, **NH**) raised his teamleading average to .414 by going 6-for-9 with three RBI and two runs scored and freshman righty **Joe Esposito** (**EAST HAVEN**) pitched a complete-game shutout in the nightcap to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team to a 6-4, 7-0 Little East Conference sweep of the University of Massachusetts Boston Saturday night at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked No. 17 nationally, Eastern (15-6, 5-0) has won eight straight and improved to 9-1 up north. UMass (10-8, 1-2) had a three-game winning streak snapped and is 0-18 all-time against Eastern.

Mehrbach, who has hit safely in all but two games this year, recorded his tenth and 11th multiple hit games of the year in the doubleheader. He was 2-for-4 with a double, two RBI and a run scored in the first game and 4-for-5 with a run scored and RBI in the second game.

Esposito (3-1) pitched a three-hitter and fanned a career-high 12 – just four less than his season total entering the game -- and walked only two in pitching the team's first complete-game shutout this year. With the help of two double plays, Esposito faced just four batters over the minimum of 27. He did not allow a hit after a leadoff single in the fifth, facing only 17 batters over the final five innings. Beginning with an inning-ending double play in the fifth, he retired 13 straight until Darwin Gonzalez reached on a one-out error in the ninth.

Since allowing four earned runs in 2 1/3 innings in losing his debut a month ago, Esposito is 3-0 in five appearances with a 0.31 ERA in 28 2/3 innings. He has 26 strikeouts and seven walks and has given up only 11 hits in that span. He has not allowed an earned run in his last four appearances and in his last 25 2/3 innings.

In the first game, Eastern scored four runs in the eighth inning to wipe out a 4-2 deficit. Mehrbach drove in the tying and go-ahead runs with a single through the right side to help make a winner of junior All-America lefty Ryan DiPietro (KENSINGTON). DiPietro (4-0) won his 25th career game in 27 decisions and 16th straight regular-season win by giving up only one earned run through the first seven innings. He allowed seven hits and fanned seven with two walks. Senior righty Ben O'Brien (MONTVILLE) earned his third save with two hitless innings. In the

eighth, UMass put two runners aboard on errors but O'Brien got an infield pop to end the threat.

Sophomore catcher Matt Cooney (ARLINGTON, MA) was 4-for-7 in the doubleheader and drove in two runs while senior DH Leon Galemba (FAIRFIELD) was 3-for-6 with two runs scored. Galemba hit his second home run of the year — an opposite-field solo shot in the second inning — to give Eastern an early 2-0 lead in the first game but the two Eastern errors led to three unearned runs in the fourth when the Beacons surged to a 3-2 lead.

Stellar relief allows Warriors to erase four-run first inning deficit

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Three relief pitchers limited Framingham State College to three hits and sophomore centerfielder **Randy Re (DANBURY)** hit a game-tying two-run home run after a dropped foul ball prolonged his at-bat as the No. 17 nationally-ranked Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team rallied to a 6-4 victory Thursday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

The win is Eastern's (13-6) sixth straight in a seven-day period and improves the Warriors northern record to 7-1. Framingham (6-5) has lost all 13 games against Eastern in this series.

Framingham State senior catcher Matt Vaccaro (Shrewsbury, MA) hit a two-out grand slam off Eastern junior righty Alex Narus (PROSPECT) in the first inning but Eastern got stellar relief pitching the rest of the way, tied the game on Re's two-run home run in the bottom of the fourth and went ahead for good on junior first baseman Chris DeSantis' (SHREWSBURY, MA) two-out single in the fifth.

With Eastern trailing 4-2 in the fourth, junior righty Justin Koutros (EAST PROVIDENCE, RI) rescured Narus by getting two ground balls to strand two runners and went on to his first collegiate win in his fourth appearance. Koutros, freshman lefty Andrew LeBrun (STONEHAM, MA) and senior righty Ben O'Brien (MONTVILLE) shut out Framingham, allowing only one hit each while striking out three and walking two. O'Brien replaced Koutros with a runner aboard and Eastern leading 6-4 in the eighth and survived an infield error to get out of the inning. In the ninth, he struck out the potential tying run to end the game and record his second save of the year.

Down 4-0, Eastern got two runs back in the bottom of the first on three hits – including junior third baseman Marc Garofalo's (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) RBI single – and two Framingham errors. In the fourth, Re hit his second home run – a two-run blast to left-center that tied the game – after a dropped fly ball in the left field foul area prolonged his time at bat. DeSantis was 3-for-3 and also reached with a walk while Mehrbach and Garofalo each had two hits. Garofalo scored twice.

EASTERN BASEBALL DOWNS AMHERST 7-1, NOW 6-1 UP NORTH No. 17 Warriors score six runs in first two innings in NCAA tourney re-match

MANSFIELD, Conn. – The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored three runs on three hits and an error in each of its first two at-bats in defeating Amherst College 7-1 Wednesday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium for its sixth win in seven northern games.

EASTERN BASEBALL WINS FOURTH STRAIGHT, DOWNS MONTCLAIR

Warriors break tie in top of ninth, Esposito leaves bases loaded in ninth in 2-1 win

LITTLE FALLS, NJ -- Freshman pinch hitter <u>Ed Kloepping</u> singled in a run to tie the game in the bottom of the eighth inning, but No. 17 Eastern Connecticut State University (11-6) tacked on a run in the top of the ninth and then escaped a bases-loaded jam to gain a 2-1 baseball win over Montclair State University (5-7) today at Yogi Berra Stadium.

Freshman righty Joe Esposito (EAST HAVEN) picked up his second win for the Warriors, after allowing just two hits over 1.2 innings with four strikeouts. The Red Hawks loaded the bases in the bottom of the ninth with two outs, on two walks and a DeCastro strikeout that was nullified by a wild pitch, but Esposito struck out Kloepping to end the game. MSU freshman starter <u>Tim Stringer</u> tossed the first six innings for the Red Hawks, fanning eight batters to go along with five hits, three walks and one run allowed.

ECSU senior outfielder **Jason Pekrul (NEW BRITAIN)** scored the game's first run in the top of the third inning when he led off with a double to left center, took second on a single by junior infielder **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)**, and then scored off an MSU double play. The score held up until the bottom of the eighth, when Montclair State 2B **Marc DeCastro** singled through the right side, took second on a wild pitch, and then scored on Kloepping's single through the right side to tie the game. It was Kloepping's second pinch-hit RBI single in as many games.

EIGHT-RUN FIFTH PROPELS EASTERN BASEBALL PAST WESTERN DiPietro (3-0) records 15th straight regular-season win in 14-1 LEC victory

MANSFIELD, Conn. – The Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored eight runs on nine hits in the fifth inning on the way to a 14-1 Little East Conference victory over Western Connecticut State University Sunday afternoon at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked 17th nationally, Eastern (10-6, 3-0 little east) has won three conference games in two days by a margin of 52-2 and has outhit its opponent 59-16 in those games.

EASTERN BASEBALL SWEEPS PLYMOUTH IN LEC OPENERS

No. 17 nationally-ranked Warriors collect 42 hits in 27-0, 11-1 victories over Panthers

MANSFIELD, CT – Three-time defending Little East Conference regular-season baseball champion Eastern Connecticut State University collected 42 hits and five pitchers limited Plymouth State University to eight hits as the Warriors posted 27-0, 11-1 victories in the conference openers for both programs Friday at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

Ranked 17th nationally, Eastern (9-6) raised its season batting average from .306 to .335 against six Plymouth (3-9) pitchers and the staff lowered its ERA from 5.02 to 4.40.

Led by junior third baseman **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)**, Eastern got hits from 17 and RBI from 12 different players. Mehrbach raised his average from .354 to .407 by going 7-for-11 with five runs scored and four RBI. He also reached once when hit by pitch. Senior leftfielder **Jason Pekrul (BERLIN)** was 4-for-9 with four runs scored. Pekrul's first hit of the day in the first inning of the opener – an infield single to short – gave him 100 hits in his four-year career. Other hitters contributing three hits on the day for Eastern were sophomore second baseman Alex Cardona (WEST HAVEN), senior shortstop Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI) and junior first baseman Matt Riemer (ELLINGTON). Riemer drove in four runs and Cardona and Koch three each. Redshirt freshman Trey Bongiovanni (MERIDEN), a shortstop, had his first hit and RBI. Also contributing their first career hits were freshman catcher Zack Lamkin (MIDDLETON, MA) and redshirt freshman second baseman Jared Nelson (WILLIMANTIC).

Twelve of Eastern's hits were doubles, with junior rightfielder **Marc Garofalo** (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) hitting his first home run of the season in the second game. On the day, Garofalo had two hits, scored four runs and drove in two.

Freshman righty Joe Esposito (EAST HAVEN) won his first collegiate game in his first third start, allowing only two singles through the first seven innings of the opener. WESTERN NE SNAPS LOSING STREAK AGAINST EASTERN BASEBALL

In a battle of 2004 NCAA qualifiers, Golden Bears end 30-game skid, 6-5

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Western New England College No. 9 hitter Garrison Ward hit a three-run home run in the fourth inning and freshman lefty Chris Anderson fanned six in three innings of relief to lift the Golden Bears to a 6-5 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Thursday evening at the Eastern Baseball Stadium.

In a battle of 2004 NCAA tournament qualifiers and current regionally-ranked teams, Western New England (7-1) ended a 30-game losing streak at the hands of Eastern (7-6). The Golden Bears' only previous win over Eastern in 34 tries had come by a score of 7-5 in 1976.

Eastern is ranked fifth in New England and 17th nationally, Western New England sixth in New England.

Ward, a sophomore centerfielder making his first career start, gave Western New England the lead for good, 5-3, with a three-run home run in the fourth and added an RBI double to give the Golden Bears a 6-4 lead in the sixth. Ward was 4-for-11 in his career without an extra-base hit prior to this game.

Anderson gained his second save with three hitless innings, fanning six without a walk. Anderson was summoned in place of All-New England junior righty Jason Connelly (3-0) with a runner on in the seventh and Western New England leading 6-5. Anderson committed an error on a bunt after replacing Connelly that moved the tying run to second, but retired the final nine batters in order – six by strikeout – to close out the win.

Trailing 1-0, Eastern tied the game when junior first baseman Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) doubled to lead off the inning and came home on senior DH Leon Galemba's (FAIRFIELD) single to center. Eastern took its only lead, 3-1 in the third on an RBI double by Garofalo and an infield ground ball that scored Re from third.

Western New England's four-run rally in the fourth began after there were two out and none on. A walk on a 3-2 pitch and a single began the rally and freshman first DH Travis Schwamb drove in the first run with a single to center. Ward hit the first pitch from Eastern starer Alex Narus (PROSPECT) over the left field fence to give the Golden Bears a 5-3 lead.

Western New England freshman third baseman Ryan Kravontka had three of his team's eight hits, driving in the first run of the game with a two-out single in the second. Eastern senior leftfielder **Jason Pekrul (BERLIN)** and Re each had two of Eastern's nine hits, Pekrul moving to within one of 100 in his four-year career. Four Eastern pitchers combined to strike out 11 batters, with sophomore lefty **Matt Cremins** (STOUGHTON, MA) fanning five in 2 2/3 innings and allowing a hit and walk.

Eastern hosts Plymouth State University Friday at 1 p.m. in a Little East Conference doubleheader.

EASTERN'S DIPIETRO, WENDELL COMBINE ON BASEBALL NO-HITTER DiPietro loses perfect game in eighth as Warriors blank Westfield State 7-0

MANSFIELD, Conn. – Junior lefty **Ryan DiPietro (KENSINGTON)** pitched seven perfect innings and settled for a combined no-hitter as the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team team opened its 2005 home season with a 7-0 victory over Westfield State College Tuesday afternoon at the ECSU Baseball Stadium.

DiPietro (2-0) retired the first 21 batters in order – allowing only three balls out of the infield – before Westfield State (4-7) freshman centerfielder Matt Tirrell reached safely when his fly ball was misplayed in right field. DiPietro then walked senior third baseman Matt Gurley on eight pitches and, after recording his 15th strikeout, was lifted in favor of junior righty **Brian Wendell (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI)**. Wendell hit the first batter he faced with his first pitch but escaped with an inning-ending double play. Wendell preserved the tenth no-hitter in program history (first combined) by striking out the side in the ninth.

DiPietro, the 2005 NCAA Division III national pre-season Player-of-the-Year, improved to 23-2 lifetime with his 14th straight regular-season win. Beginning with the last out of the fifth, he fanned seven straight before Tirrell opened the eighth with the fly ball to right. Until the eighth, Westfield's best chance for a baserunner came in the second inning, but Eastern (7-5) senior leftfielder **Jason Pekrul (BERLIN)** made a backhanded grab of sophomore catcher Chris Hebert's drive while racing toward the left field line for the final out of the inning.

Ranked 17th nationally and fifth in New England, the Warriors recorded 18 hits off three Westfield pitchers, with every player contributing at least one.

Eastern's 3-4-5 hitters of sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY), junior rightfielder Marc Garofalo (SOUTH KINGSTOWN, RI) and junior first baseman Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) combined for eight hits (including a double and triple), four RBI and three runs scored. Batting cleanup, Garofalo reached

safely four times with two singles and a triple and a walk. In the first inning, he drove in the first run with a two-out infield single and scored the second. on DeSantis' double to right-center. His two-run triple in the fourth made it 6-0. Re collected two of Eastern's seven infield singles and also singled down the third base line, stole a and base and scored in the eighth.

Batting eighth, senior shortstop **Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI)** had three hits – legging out two infield ground balls – and scored a run.

The home-opening win is the 21st in the last 22 years for Eastern and eighth straight over Westfield. In last year's 16-0 home-opening win over Westfield, DiPietro was the starting and winning pitcher, combining on a three-hitter. He fanned 12 and allowed only two hits and a walk over the first six innings.

Six pitchers can't stop Pioneers, who pull away from Warriors in 12 victory

HAYWARD, CA -- Cal State East Bay roughed up three Eastern Connecticut State University pitchers in the seventh inning by scoring five runs on four hits, two walks, a hit batter and an infield error in a 12-2 win Thursday afternoon.

EASTERN BASEBALL SPLITS TWO GAMES IN CALIFORNIA

No. 6 Warriors score five in eighth to down No. 4 Chapman

ORANGE, CA -- Senior righty **Ben O'Brien (MONTVILLE)** pitched five hitless innings and the Eastern Connecticut State University baseball team scored five runs in the top of the eighth inning to down Chapman University 10-7 in a battle of nationally-ranked teams Wednesday night at Hart Park.

Trailing 7-5, Eastern (6-3) rallied for five runs in the top of the eighth inning -- scoring the go-ahead run on a throwing error at third base – to hand Chapman (18-3) its first loss after eight straight wins. The Warriors were ranked sixth in the NCAA Division III pre-season poll, the Panthers fourth.

In the completion of a suspended game earlier Wednesday, the University of Redlands (6-12) scored three runs in the bottom of the seventh to snap a tie and snap the Warriors' four-game winning streak with a 9-5 victory.

The third of three Eastern pitchers, O'Brien (2-0) shut down Chapman over the final five innings without allowing a hit or a run.. O'Brien entered the game with two runs in and a runner on in the second and no one on in the fifth inning and the Warriors trailing 6-5. He gave up a run on a sacrifice fly that gave the Panthers a 7-5 lead, then held Chapman off the board until Eastern rallied for five runs on six hits and an error in the eighth.

Eastern reached three Chapman pitchers for 16 hits while three Eastern pitchers stopped the Panthers on five hits. Senior DH Leon Galemba (FAIRFIELD) and senior shortstop Tom Koch (WARWICK, RI) each had three hits while senior leftfielder Jason Pekrul (BERLIN) and Cooney each had two hits and drove in two runs.

Eastern All-America junior lefty **Ryan DiPietro** (KENSINGTON) allowed three hits over the first four innings and left with a 5-4 lead, giving way to first-year sophomore **Ron Isler** (NEWTOWN). Isler was lifted in favor of O'Brien after the first three Chapman batters reached in the fifth.

The Eastern-Redlands game Tuesday was stopped with Eastern batting in the sixth and the game tied 5-5. When play resumed Wednesday afternoon, the Bullodgs scored three times in the seventh, helped by two hit batsmen, a sacrifice bunt and an intentional walk.

Redshirt freshman righty **Trey Bongiovanni (MERIDEN)** – the second of four Eastern pitchers – was saddled with the loss.

Tuesday, Eastern had taken a 5-4 lead by scoring two runs in the top of the fifth on RBI singles by Garofalo and O'Toole against three Redlands pitchers. Garofalo had three of Eastern's 11 hits and two RBI, junior second baseman **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)** and DeSantis contributing two each.

Coming off a 19-0 loss to Salisbury University in its most recent game 12 days ago, Eastern scored four runs in the bottom of the eighth to erase a 4-1 deficit and defeat the Leopards (12-3) for the third straight time.

In the eighth, Pekrul drove in the first run with a ground ball and sophomore centerfielder Randy Re (DANBURY) tied the game 4-4 with a bases-loaded two-run double that moved junior second baseman Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH) to third. EASTERN BASEBALL WINS ONE OF THREE IN MARYLAND

On opening weekend, Warriors defeat Montclair, lose twice to host Salisbury

SALISBURY, Md. – David Sutton's bases-clearing double highlighted a ten-run third inning and the Salisbury University baseball team went on to a 19-0 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Sunday morning at Sea Gull Stadium.

The loss capped a three-game weekend trip for the No. 6 nationally-ranked Warriors (1-2), who split two games Saturday. No. 13 nationally-ranked Salisbury (9-1-1) erased an early four-run deficit to trim the Warriors 6-5 Saturday morning before Eastern bounced back behind All-America lefty pitcher **Ryan DiPietro** (**KENSINGTON**) to post a 9-4 win over Montclair State University (0-2) in an intra-region game Saturday afternoon.

Salisbury, which joined Eastern at last year's NCAA Division III national tournament but lost both of its games, completed a perfect weekend by outlasting Montclair State 16-13 later Sunday. The Sea Gulls have won eight straight this year and are 10-2-1 against Eastern in the last 13 meetings between the clubs. Traditionally, the Warriors are playing their first official games of the season at Salisbury.

Twelve different pitchers saw action for Eastern, half of them making their varsity debut.

Salisbury 19, Eastern Conn. 0

Facing seven first-year varsity Eastern pitchers, Salisbury pounded out 18 hits, seven of them doubles. Having played perfect defense in both of its games Saturday, Eastern committed three errors in helping the Gulls score ten times against three pitchers on just four hits. Salisbury chased Eastern freshman righty Joe Esposito (EAST HAVEN) by scoring twice and Sutton greeted first-year sophomore righty Scott Cavaioli (LEOMINSTER, MA) with a three-run double to make it 5-0. Greg Lemon later delivered a two-run single off freshman righty Brian Schilling (WEYMOUTH, MA). Esposito and Cavaioli were making their Eastern debut and Schilling was making his second appearance.

Junior first baseman Chris DeSantis (SHREWSBURY, MA) tied the game, 5-5, for Eastern with a ground ball in the sixth but Salisbury scored the go-ahead run in the bottom of the inning. Mike Johnson led off with a double, moved to third on a single and scored on the front end of a double steal.

The Warriors staked Iverson to a 4-0 lead in the second. Junior second baseman **Zach Mehrbach (LYME, NH)** and senior leftfielder **Jason Pekrul (BERLIN)** drove in runs in the inning, with the Warriors receiving help from an infield error.

As a late-inning defensive replacement, sophomore Eric O'Toole (WATERBURY) singled in his first varsity at-bat.
