ECSU MEN'S SOCCER CLOSES REGULAR SEASON WITH FOURTH STRAIGHT WIN
Brasher scores only goal in win over Connecticut College

NEW LONDON, Conn. -- Senior Jason Brasher's team-leading 17th goal of the season was the difference as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team blanked Connecticut College 1-0 Wednesday.

Eastern (10-10-1) closes its regular season with four straight wins after winning for the sixth time in its final seven outings. Conn College closes the regular season at 8-6.

Brasher, an all-New England forward from Rowayton, nailed a 20-yarder under the crossbar on a long pass from Harwinton sophomore Kirk Richards less than 12 minutes into the match. The goal was Brasher's fifth and gave him 12 points during the four-match winning streak.

Conn College outshot Eastern 9-5. ECSU junior keeper Ken Monde posted his second full-match shutout in his last three starts, stopping five shots. Conn senior Lou Cutillo made two saves.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER WINS FIFTH IN LAST SIX

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team broke open a close match with two goals in a two minute span in the second half in shutting out Western New England College 3-0 Monday.

The win was the third straight and fifth in the last six outings for Eastern (9-10-1). Western New England finishes at 6-8-1.

Junior Matt Deary of Stonington scored his first goal of the season in the 74th minute and senior Jason Brasher of Rowayton tallied his team-leading 16th two minutes later as the Warriors broke open a one-goal advantage.

Senior Demian DeVega of Mystic had given ECSU a 1-0 lead three minutes into the match when he scored on a breakaway on keeper Chris Edge's goalie punt. Sophomore Kirk Richards of Harwinton was credited with assists on each of the two second-half goals.

Edge (4 saves), of Plainville, and junior Ken Monde (1) of Wethersfield combined on the shutout. Monde worked the final five minutes.

Eastern closes out the regular season Wednesday at Connecticut College at 3 p.m.

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior Stephen Federocko broke a tie with 22 minutes remaining to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-1 victory over American International College Thursday.

The win is the third in the last four outings for Eastern (7-10-1) while the Yellow Jackets fall to 1-14-1.

Senior Jason Brasher scored his team-leading 13 goal of the year less than two minutes into the second half before sophomore Peter Larkin tied the match nine minutes later. Federocko knocked in the goal-ahead goal with a head ball on an assist from junior Matt Deary in the 68th minute.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER EDGES TEIKYO POST UNIVERSITY 2-1
Teikyo Post transfer Carter scores game-winner

WATERBURY, Conn. -- Eastern Connecticut State University sophomore transfer Kenny Carter broke a scoreless second-half tie with a goal against his former team in leading the Warriors to a 2-1 win over Teikyo Post University Wednesday.

The win is ECSU's first on the road after five losses, dating back nearly one month. The Warriors are 5-9-1, the Eagles 5-5-2.

Carter, a starting defender at Teikyo Post last fall, broke a scoreless tie ten minutes into the second half when he blasted a 25-yarder under the crossbar for his first goal at Eastern and second on the collegiate level.

Senior forward Jason Brasher notched his team-leading 12th goal of the year 20 minutes later to give ECSU a 2-0 lead before the hosts got one back on a deflection with six minutes remaining.

Junior Stephen Federocko set up Carter's goal and gained an assist when he fed the ball to Brasher on the latter's breakaway goal in the 74th minute.

Junior Ken Monde (one save) and sophomore Chris Edge (two) shared keepers' chores for Eastern. Junior Jim Johanson made nine saves for Post, which was outshot 17-11.

The Eastern defense limited state scoring leader Phil Caporrella of Post scoreless and to just three shots.

The Warriors return to Little East Conference action Saturday, travelling to face unranked Plymouth State College (2 p.m.). Eastern snapped an 11-match losing streak to Plymouth with a scoreless tie last season but has not beaten the Panthers since 1972. ECSU is unbeaten in LEC play this year (2-0-1) and shares the conference lead with UMass Dartmouth.

UMASS DARTMOUTH, ECSU MAINTAIN SHARE OF LEC LEAD

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Senior Jason Brasher's 11th goal of the season with less than seven minutes left in overtime lifted the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-2 tie with the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth Saturday in a battle of Little East Conference leaders.

The teams maintain a share of the conference lead -- both clubs now 2-0-1 in the LEC. UMass Dartmouth is 6-2-1 overall, Eastern 4-9-1.

UMass Dartmouth led twice in the match but Brasher, the conference scoring leader, scored his second goal of the afternoon with 6:42 left in overtime to pull ECSU even. The Warriors have not lost to the Corsairs in the last 11 matches (7-0-4). It is the third straight year the teams have played to a tie.

The Corsairs, unbeaten in their last nine conference matches (7-0-2) dating back to 1989, broke through late in the first half on sophomore Julio Pinto's seventh goal of the season. Eastern tied the match early in the second half when Brasher stuck in a loose ball from six yards.

In overtime, junior Francis Koczalka was credited with the go-ahead goal for UMass Dartmouth midway through the first 15-minute overtime session when his crossing pass from the wing deflected off an ECSU defender and into the net. The goal was Koczalka's first of the season.

Brasher's tying goal followed a hard shot by junior teammate Mike Surber, which was stopped but could not be held by Corsair sophomore keeper John Semedo.

Eastern outshot the visitors 31-8. Semedo made 15 saves while ECSU junior Ken Monde (4) and senior Sean Lester combined for five saves.

Eastern travels to Teikyo Post Wednesday (4 p.m.).

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER BEATEN BY ALBERTUS MAGNUS 2-1
Warriors outshoot AMC 23-3; Falcons score on first two shots

NEW HAVEN -- Albertus Magnus College managed only three shots but scored on its first two shots of the match in holding off Eastern Connecticut State University 2-1 Thursday in men's soccer.

The loss is the eighth in the past nine matches for Eastern (4-9) while the Falcons improve to 6-3-1.

Eastern outshot AMC 23-3 but the Warriors missed a penalty kick and had a goal denied after being whistled for offside, both occurring early in the second half.

The Falcons scored on their first two shots -- both coming in the opening 15 minutes -- and held off the Warriors, who outshot the hosts 15-0 in the second half.

Freshman Silverio Vitiello and sophomore Milton Ortega each scored in the early moments on short chip shots before ECSU senior Jason Brasher notched his team-leading ninth goal with just over four minutes left in the match to cut the deficit to 2-1.

Sophomore keeper Mike Zeoli made ten saves for the Falcons. Junior Ken Monde and sophomore Chris Edge split time in goal for Eastern. Neither was called upon for a save.

The Warriors host UMass Dartmouth Saturday (11 a.m.) in a battle of unbeaten (2-0) Little East Conference teams.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER FALLS TO NEW HAVEN 3-2

WEST HAVEN, Conn. -- The University of New Haven men's soccer team scored the final two goals of the first half in edging Eastern Connecticut State University 3-2 Tuesday.

The loss was the seventh in the last eight outings for Eastern (4-8) while the Division II Chargers improve to 3-5-2.

Trailing 1-0, Eastern scored twice in four minutes before New Haven countered with two late first-half goals. Neither team scored in the second half.

Senior Jason Brasher scored his team-leading eighth goal of the season in the 11th minute to tie the match 1-1 and senior Demian DeVega gave ECSU a 2-1 lead four minutes later. Brasher beat UNH freshman keeper Lou Raba on a breakaway following a through-ball from junior back Matt Deary. DeVega tucked in a rebound of Brasher's shot, which Raba stopped but could not control.

Senior Abou Cissokho gave the Chargers a 1-0 lead in the ninth minute and broke a 2-2 tie exactly three minutes after teammate John Camara tied the match for UNH with eight minutes left in the first half.

New Haven held a slim 17-16 edge in shots. ECSU freshman Matt Morse made four saves in his second collegiate start while junior Ken Monde made two while working the final 31 minutes. Raba made seven saves.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER SNAPS SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK
Improves to 2-0 in Little East Conference

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Glastonbury natives Mark Landers and Jason Sellman each scored once as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team snapped a six-game losing streak with a 3-0 Little East Conference victory over the University of Southern Maine Saturday.

Eastern (4-7) improves to 2-0 in the conference while Southern Maine (1-6) falls to 0-2 with its fifth straight loss overall.

Landers' second goal of the season in the 13th minute gave ECSU a 1-0 halftime edge and senior Demian DeVega of Mystic made it 2-0 three minutes into the second half with his first goal in two years. Making his collegiate debut, Sellman scored on his first shot -- a corner kick which eluded the reach of Southern Maine keeper Tim Mower.

Freshman keeper Matt Morse of Milford recorded the shutout in his first collegiate start. Morse stopped three shots. Freshmen Kevin Martin (7) and Mower combined for eight saves for Southern Maine. Martin allowed two goals while working the first 85 minutes.

Eastern outshot Southern Maine 18-5.

MATUKAITIS RECORDS 100TH CAREER POINT
ECSU women's soccer extends unbeaten streak to five

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior striker Lisa Matukaitis became the fifth

player in New England Division III women' soccer history to record 100 career points in leading Eastern Connecticut State University to a 3-0 win over the University of Southern Maine Saturday in a Little East Conference match.

Matukaitis, from Southington, entered play with 97 points in 40 career matches and scored her team-leading sixth and seventh goals in the second half. A two-time all-New England forward, Matukaitis reached and exceeded the 100-point plateau when she scored from 18 yards on a long pass from freshman Paula Quick of Guilford in the 58th minute.

Eastern (4-3-1) has won four and tied one in its last five matches. The match was its first this year in the conference. Southern Maine is 1-6-1 overall, 0-2 in the conference.

Senior Dawn Walmsley of Windham scored her first goal in two years in the 18th minute on an assist from senior Laura Oberstadt of Newtown. Walmsley and Oberstadt set a program record for career appearances with their 58th.

Junior Cindy Walker of Waterford made three saves and shared the shutout with freshman Jen Katz of Beverly, MA. Katz played the final minute.

Freshman Michele Moody made ten saves for Southern Maine, which was outshot 23-4.

ECSU SOCCER DROPS SIXTH STRAIGHT 3-0

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team outshot Fitchburg State College 35-12 but dropped its program-tying sixth consecutive match 3-0 Thursday.

Fitchburg (4-1-2) scored three first-half goals on its first four shots as the Warriors fell to 3-7. ECSU last lost six straight matches in the program's first season 30 years ago (1961).

Senior Jason Malone, the leading scorer in the Mass. State College Athletic Conference, scored his seventh and eighth goals of the season within six minutes midway through the first half. Sophomore Joe Cytacki had given Fitchburg a 1-0 lead in the ninth minute when he picked off a poor clearing pass by ECSU sophomore keeper Chris Edge and a blasted 15-yarder into an open net.

Malone's scored his first goal of the match when Eastern junior keeper Ken Monde lost his footing on the former's 25-yard free kick.

The win was the 100th in the nine-year coaching career of Fitchburg coach Malcolm MacPherson (100-34-15).

Eastern outshot Fitchburg 25-4 in a scoreless second half and held an overall 9-1 advantage in corner kicks.

Sophomore Eric Hubler made 14 saves for Fitchburg. Edge (1) and Monde combined for five saves. Freshman Matt Morse played the final four minutes in net without a save.

Eastern looks for its second Little East Conference win in as many outings Saturday when it hosts Southern Maine (3 p.m.).

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER BEATEN IN OVERTIME

DANBURY, Conn. -- Senior Phil Bergen broke an overtime tie with his fifth goal of the year to power Western Connecticut State University to a 2-1 men's soccer decision over Eastern Connecticut State University Sunday.

The win is the seventh against a loss and tie for Western, ranked seventh in New England. Eastern falls to 3-5 with its fourth straight loss. The setback was the third by a goal in five days for Eastern -- second in overtime.

Western sophomore Niclas Hjerth's fifth goal of the season broke a scoreless duel ten minutes into overtime but Eastern tied the match on junior Mike Surber's second goal of the season ten minutes later. Bergen, however, needed only 27 seconds to give the Colonials the lead for good when he drilled an 18-yarder past ECSU keeper Ken Monde.

Western held a 16-12 edge in shots but Western keeper Craig Welton was called upon for seven saves. Monde made two.

Surber's goal was only the second allowed by Western this year and first since the fifth minute of the team's second match this year.

Eastern travels to Trinity College Tuesday.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER LOSES TO ALBANY 1-0 ON PENALTY KICK

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior Marty Hearney's penalty kick goal with 20 minutes left in the match lifted the University at Albany to a 1-0 men's soccer victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Friday.

Hearney delivered the only goal of the match after ECSU was whistled for a hand ball in the penalty box. Hearey beat ECSU sophomore keeper Chris Edge with a hard shot inside the post.

The loss is ECSU's third straight and drops the Warriors to 3-4 (0-3 at home). Albany, which defeated ECSU for the fourth straight year, is 2-3-1.

Eastern, which held a slim 15-14 edge in shots, had several opportunities to score in the second half but Albany senior keeper Mike Baker came up with all four of his saves in the period. Baker tipped a hard shot by ECSU senior Demian DeVega over the crossbar with 11 minutes left, then made a diving save on an 18-yarder by Eastern senior Jason Brasher with 2:30 left.

Three Eastern keepers combined for six saves: junior Ken Monde 3, Edge 2 and freshman Matt Morse 1.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER LOSES IN OVERTIME AT MONTCLAIR STATE 3-2
Mansfield's Lester totals three points
