ECSU CLOSSES REGULAR SEASON WITH EIGHTH STRAIGHT WIN

SPRINGFIELD, MA -- Senior forward Demian DeVega of Mystic collected a hat trick and freshman Pete Ronga of Bellmore, NY had three assists to lead the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 5-0 win over Western New England College Monday in the Warriors' final regular-season match.

Eastern (14-5), riding an eight-game winning streak, opens in the ECAC New England Division III tournament Wednesday at Middlebury College.

DeVega, who has 11 goals and five assists during the winning streak, gave ECSU a 1-0 lead five minutes into the match and added two second-half goals. Ronga had three assists, senior keeper Ken Monde of Wethersfield and senior Michael Chirgwin of Mansfield two each.

Monde made three saves in posting his third shutout in as many starts. David Eggleston and James Everhart combined for ten saves for Western New England (3-12).

ECSU WINS SECOND STRAIGHT LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE MEN'S SOCCER TITLE  
Warriors defeat UMass/Boston 6-1 for seventh straight victory

BOSTON, MA -- Senior Stephen Federocko's go-ahead goal 14 minutes into the second half sparked a five-goal explosion as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team won its second straight Little East Conference title with a 6-1 victory over the University of Massachusetts-Boston Saturday.

Eastern's win, coupled with host UMass/Dartmouth's 2-1 win over the University of Southern Maine Saturday, gives the Warriors the University's first outright regular-season conference title in a men's sport. The men's soccer team had shared last year's crown with UMass/Dartmouth.

The Warriors (13-5, 4-1) got two goals and an assist from junior Scott Wolchesky of Willington, two goals from senior Demian DeVega of Mystic, a goal and assist from freshman Pete Ronga of Bellmore, NY and two assists from senior Mike Surber of Mansfield.

Federocko, from Eatontown, NJ, broke a 1-1 tie 14 minutes into the second half when he outraced UMass' Frantz Bernadeau on the left wing and fired a low shot inside the far post for his fourth goal of the season.

DeVega's 11th goal of the season had given ECSU a 1-0 lead midway through the first half before the Beacons (13-5-1, 3-1-1) knotted the match two minutes into the second half. DeVega has eight goals and five assists during the team's current seven-game winning streak.

Eastern outshot UMass 19-10 and scored on five of its nine second-half shots. Junior keeper Chris Edge of Eastern and Hawk of UMass each made four saves. Hawk entered play boosting the conference's lowest goals-against average (0.86).

ECSU UPENDS PREVIOUSLY-UNBEATEN CONN COLLEGE 2-0

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Senior forward Demian DeVega scored a goal and assisted on another and junior keeper Chris Edge made nine saves as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team blanked previously-unbeaten Connecticut College 2-0 Thursday.

The loss is the first for Conn (10-1-2), ranked 19th nationally and third in New England Division III. The win is the sixth straight for unranked Eastern (12-5). The Warriors had been the last team to defeat Conn in the regular season, shutting out the Camels 1-0 last Oct. 30 at New London. Conn had been the only unbeaten men's soccer team in any division in New England.

DeVega, from Mystic, scored his tenth goal of the season on a head ball off sophomore Alex Patino's free kick 17 minutes into the match. DeVega has six goals and five assists during the team's six-game winning streak. The assist was the team-leading 11th for Patino.

Senior Mike Surber from Mansfield added an insurance goal with five minutes left in the match on assists from DeVega and senior Mike Chirgwin.

The Warriors held a <sup>17-11</sup>~~17-10~~ advantage in shots, including a 12-1 margin in the first half. Edge made nine saves, eight in the second half. Matt Hackl made six saves for Conn.

Eastern travels to UMass/Boston Saturday with a chance to clinch a share of its second straight Little East Conference title.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER WINS FIFTH STRAIGHT

NEW LONDON, CT -- Senior forward Demian DeVega of Mystic had two goals and an assist in the second half in leading the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 4-1 win over the U.S. Coast Guard Academy Tuesday.

The win is the fifth straight for Eastern (11-5) and represents its longest winning streak since 1986. Coast Guard is 6-7.

DeVega assisted on junior Kirk Richards' go-ahead goal six minutes into the second half, then added his team-leading eighth and ninth goals later in the period. DeVega has five goals and three assists in the team's winning streak.

Senior forward Mike Surber of Mansfield had two assists.

Eastern, which snapped a four-game winless (0-3-1) streak against Coast Guard, outshot the Bears 17-7. Junior Chris Edge made one save for Eastern while Matt White made seven for Coast Guard.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER WINS FOURTH STRAIGHT

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Kevin Boyle's first career goal with nine minutes left in overtime gave the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team a 3-2 Little East Conference victory over Plymouth State College Saturday.

The win is the fourth straight for Eastern (10-5) and third against one conference loss. Plymouth is 4-8-2 overall, 0-3-1 in the LEC after stretching its winless streak to seven (0-5-2).

Boyle, a senior from Manchester, headed in senior Mark Landers' corner kick with 9:18 remaining in overtime to give ECSU its second straight win over Plymouth since snapping an 0-11-1 streak against the Panthers.

Eastern played the final 12:11 of regulation and all of overtime one man down after senior Matt Deary of Stonington was ejected for an intentional hand ball in the box. Paul Andrew's successful penalty kick resulting from the infraction tied the match 2-2.

Landers, from Glastonbury, finished with two assists while senior Demian DeVega of Mystic had a goal and assist. Senior Tony Tigeleiro's first goal of the season in his first start had given Eastern a 1-0 lead in the ninth minute and DeVega made it 2-0 eight minutes later.

The Warriors outshot Plymouth 26-14. ECSU junior keeper Chris Edge of Plainville made four saves while Mike Goodwin made 12 for Plymouth.

## PLYMOUTH STATE CLINCHES CONFERENCE TITLE WITH WIN OVER ECSU

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Mary-Bridget Pawlik scored her 14th goal of the season midway through the first half as the Plymouth State College women's soccer team clinched its third straight Little East Conference title with a 1-0 win over Eastern Connecticut State University Saturday.

Plymouth (12-0-1), ranked second nationally in Division III, won all three of its conference matches for the third straight year. Eastern (9-6), ranked in a tie for seventh in New England, lost in conference play for the first time after one win.

ECSU senior keeper Cindy Walker of Waterford tipped a head ball by Kristin Mainella off the crossbar but Pawlik headed the rebound inside the right post in the 23rd minute for the only goal of the match.

Plymouth outshot ECSU 15-4. Sarah Seagrave made two saves for the Panthers while Walker stopped nine.

Eastern concludes its conference season Tuesday when it host UMass/Dartmouth at 3:30 p.m.

## ECSU MEN'S SOCCER WINS SECOND CONFERENCE MATCH

NORTH DARTMOUTH, MA -- Senior forward Mike Surber of Mansfield scored his second and third goals of the season in the second half to lead the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-0 win over the University of Massachusetts-Dartmouth Saturday in a Little East Conference contest.

The conference match was the first this year for Eastern (9-4). Southern Maine is 3-7 after losing its third straight conference match of the year.

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Senior striker Lisa Matukaitis of Southington scored her 60th career goal and added an assist in Eastern Connecticut State University's 3-0 women's soccer win over Bridgewater State College Saturday.

Eastern, ranked tenth in New England, improves to 6-2, 4-0 at home. Bridgewater, which received votes in the most recent New England poll, falls to 3-3.

Matukaitis, the New England Division III women's soccer career scoring leader, assisted on the first goal less than two minutes into the match and tallied her 60th career goal ten minutes into the second half. The goal was the 11th this year for Matukaitis, who has 139 career points. Senior back Patty Ciamei of Hawthorne, NY collected her first collegiate point when she set up Matukaitis for the breakaway goal.

Federocko carried over midfield and layed the ball off to DeVega on the left wing. First-year junior Scott Wolchesky of Willington and Federocko added insurance goals later in the first 15-minute overtime session. Wolchesky scored his first goal at Eastern after stealing the ball at midfield and unloading a 28-yard blast under the crossbar.

Thomas had taken a 1-0 lead in the 33rd minute when an ECSU defender lofted a clearing pass over the head of keeper Chris Edge and into the net.

Eastern outshot Thomas 27-4. Edge made three saves. Tim Chalmers stopped three shots for Thomas while working a scoreless first half. Luis Colin made eight saves for Thomas in place of Chalmers.
