ECSU ELIMINATED FROM LEC MEN'S SOCCER PLAYOFFS

Owls score two goals in span of 3:26 in 3-0 semifinal round win

KEENE, NH -- The Keene State College men's soccer team scored two goals in a span of 3:26 early in the match on the way to a 3-0 shutout of Eastern Connecticut State University in the semifinal round of the Little East Conference playoffs Friday.

The three-goal loss was the second this season for fourth-seeded Eastern (8-9-2) against Keene State (15-4) and snapped a four-game ECSU winning streak. The win vaulted top-seeded Keene State into the tournament final, where it edged visiting second seed Plymouth State College 1-0 in overtime Sunday. Keene and Plymouth had shared the regular-season championship, with Keene having beaten the Panthers 2-1 Oct. 2 at Keene, NH to earn the playoff's top seed and home field advantage. Plymouth had advanced to the final by blanking visiting third seed UMass Boston 4-0 Friday.

Keene, ranked 21st in Division III and third in New England, scored before the match was 11 minutes old against Eastern, then made it 2-0 at 14:14. The Owls added an insurance goal with three minutes left. Senior back Chris Brunette and sophomore Mark Bailey gave Keene the 2-0 lead, with junior forward Lakota Denton, the conference's top scorer, and junior back Gerry Boggis each assisting on both goals.

ECSU sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** amassed ten saves -- equalling his second-highest total in a match this season. In the second half, Craig made eight saves -- four of them outstanding ones to keep the Warriors within striking distance: three minutes into the half, Craig robbed Keene State freshman forward Justin Hickman on a point-blank shot with a leaping grab; with 17 minutes left, he made a save on junior midfielder Mike Norton's header; with 11 minutes left, he came up with a diving save when Bailey's through-ball sprung Denton for a breakaway attempt, and with 3:30 left, Craig tipped freshman forward Jeff Duarte's unchallenged 15-yarder over the crossbar.

Eastern's best opportunity to score came with five minutes left when senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** skimmed the top of the crossbar on a 25-yard free kick. Keene State senior keeper Matt Andrulot needed only six saves -- none of them difficult -- to record his fifth shutout and lower his conference-leading goals-against average to 1.10.

The match was the final one in the careers of ECSU seniors Cioffi, **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)**, **Nick Ghiglia (BRISTOL)**, **Ted Buck (STORRS)**, **Tony Manfre (ELLINGTON)** and **Michael Fritch (TORRINGTON)**.

PETAWAY LIFTS ECSU MEN'S SOCCER PAST WESLEYAN 2-1 *Freshman midfielder scores game-winner with 1:20 left in regular-season finale*

MIDDLETOWN, Conn. -- Freshman midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** scored on a rebound with 1:20 left as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team concluded its regular season with its fourth straight win, 2-1 Wednesday.

Wesleyan (6-7) had tied the match with 15:29 left on senior midfielder Marcus Harley's first goal of the season but Petaway prevented overtime when he scored his second goal of the season into an open net when he one-timed the rebound of a shot by junior forward **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** which caromed off the left post.

Senior forward **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)** had given ECSU (8-8-2) a 1-0 lead with his third goal of the season just eight minutes into the match when he steered in the rebound of a shot by Petaway. Wesleyan junior goalkeeper Mark Penrod dove to knock Petaway's shot from the right wing wide of the goal but Bazzano came charging in from the left wing and tucked it into an open net.

ECSU sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** had a string of 341:04 scoreless minutes snapped when Harley scored on a bicycle kick but came through with eight saves, one coming in the final 30 seconds when he tipped a shot by sophomore forward R.T. Treveloni over the crossbar following a Wesleyan corner kick. Craig was also aided by the defensive saves of ECSU backs **Lorenzo Durante (DERBY)** and sophomore **Ryan Smith (MADISON)**, who cleared balls off the line in the first half.

Eastern's fourth straight win snaps a five-game losing streak at the hands of Wesleyan, which lost for the third straight time.

Eastern visits Keene State College Friday at 6 p.m. in the semifinal round of the Little East Conference playoffs. Eastern is seeded fourth in the tournament. Keene State, the regular-season conference co-champion, is seeded first. The tournament final is scheduled for Sunday at noon, with the winner advancing to the NCAA Division III tournament.

ZIMMITTI LIFTS ECSU MEN'S SOCCER PAST UMASS DARTMOUTH

Warriors qualify for Little East Conference playoffs, open play Friday

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior midfielder **Geoff Zimmitti's** (HEBRON) fifth goal of the season with just over four minutes left in regulation powered the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team past the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth 1-0 Saturday and into a Little East Conference playoff berth.

The Eastern (7-8-2, 3-3-1) victory, coupled with Western Connecticut State University's 4-1 loss at Keene State College Saturday, lifts the Warriors into a tie for fourth place in the final conference standings and gives them the final seed in the first-ever Little East Conference playoffs. Based on its regular-season win over Rhode Island College, ECSU earned the berth over over the Anchormen, who share fourth place with ECSU in the final conference standings.

In semifinal-round play Friday, Eastern visits top-seeded and nationally-ranked Keene State at 6 p.m. while second-seeded Plymouth State College hosts third-seeded Massachusetts Boston at a time not yet announced. The winners meet Sunday at noon in the final, with the champion receiving a berth in the NCAA Division III tournament. Keene defeated ECSU 4-1 when the teams met in Willimantic two weeks ago.

Against UMass, which lost its eighth straight match, Eastern dominated play with a final 16-3 margin in shots but could not break through until Zimmitti beat Corsair senior keeper Eric Plant from 15 yards with his second goal in as many matches and fourth game-winner. In addition to the advantage in shots, the Warriors collected 15 of the 18 corner kicks in the match.

Sophomore keeper **Doug Craig** (NIANTIC) made one save in extending a streak of consecutive shutout minutes to 266:33. He has not given up a goal in his last three starts.

In improving its 11-year conference regular-season record to 7-1-3 against UMass Dartmouth (6-11-1, 1-5-1), Eastern won its season-high third straight match. All three of its regular-season conference wins have come by 1-0 scores.

The Warriors wrap up the regular season Wednesday when they travel to face Wesleyan University at 3 p.m.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER DUMPS BRIDGEWATER STATE 4-1

Goal total for Warriors most in last 30 matches

BRIDGEWATER, Mass. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team scored three goals in the second half en route to a 4-1 victory over Bridgewater State College Tuesday.

The goal total is the most for Eastern (6-8-2) in the last 30 matches, since a 4-0 shutout of visiting Teikyo Post last Sept. 23. With the loss, Bridgewater (4-9-2), a member of the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference, falls to 0-8-1 against non-conference opponents.

The Warriors scored their first two goals on mistakes by the Bridgewater defense. Junior midfielder **Geoff Zimmitti (HEBRON)** and senior forward **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)** gave ECSU a 2-0 lead when Bridgewater keeper Zach Smith mishandled balls. First-year sophomore forward **Jeff Patten (BRISTOL)** made it 3-0 when he scored on a rebound of a shot by junior midfielder **Jan Trzcinski (MIDDLETOWN)** which bounced off Bridgewater reserve keeper Scott Sullivan. Junior forward **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** rounded out the scoring in the final five minutes when scored his sixth goal of the season after outracing a defender down the left wing.

Sophomore keepers **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** and **Scott Santo (ANSONIA)** combined in goal for ECSU. Craig, who shut out Rhode Island College in Saturday's 95-minute win, made five saves over the first 86 minutes and left with a 3-0 lead. Santo made one save over the final 14 minutes, allowing the Bridgewater goal with nine minutes left on a header by John Rezende off a corner kick. /6

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER REMAINS IN LEC TOURNAMENT HUNT

Cioffi's overtime goal lifts Warriors to 1-0 win over Rhode Island College

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore keeper **Doug Craig** (NIANTIC) came up with ten saves in one of his sharpest career outings and senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi** (WILLINGTON) ended a scoreless battle five minutes into overtime with the only goal of the match as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team posted a key Little East Conference victory over Rhode Island College Saturday.

With the win, ECSU (5-8-2, 2-3-1) keeps its hopes alive for finishing among the top four teams and earning a spot in the LEC post-season tournament, which gets underway Nov. 5. With the win Saturday, Eastern moves into a two-way tie for fifth place with Rhode Island (6-6-2, 2-3-1), both clubs with five points. Western Connecticut holds down fourth place with six points but must visit LEC co-leader Keene State College Saturday on the final day of the conference's regular season. ECSU closes out its conference season Saturday when it hosts UMass Dartmouth (6-7-1, 1-4-1). ECSU would be awarded the fourth seed in the tournament if it finishes in a tie with either Western or Rhode Island, based on its regular-season wins over those opponents.

On Saturday, the Warriors snapped an overall six-game winless streak (0-4-2) this year and a two-game losing streak to Rhode Island when Cioffi drilled a 12-yarder under the crossbar after gathering a pass from freshman midfielder **John Petaway** (CHESHIRE). Senior midfielder **Nick Ghiglia** (BRISTOL) initiated the scoring run when he knocked down a Rhode Island clearing pass in the middle of the field and chipped a pass to Petaway on the right wing. Petaway took on a defender, gaining a stride on him before sending the ball across the goal mouth to Cioffi, who was unmarked on the far left post. Cioffi wheeled away from a defender and spun to unleash a quick shot from 12 yards which went just under the crossbar. The goal was the team-leading sixth of the season for Cioffi, who had previously scored the only goal of the match just 28 seconds into a home win over Western three weeks ago. The shot was Eastern's only one in overtime.

Craig, whose other full shutout this season had come against Western, made 10 saves against Rhode Island -- one shy of his season-high. Three of the saves came on one-on-one situations.

The loss follows two straight shutout wins for Rhode Island. Sophomore keeper Carlos Pinhancos has not allowed a goal in regulation time in three straight matches.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER DROPS 4-1 LITTLE EAST DECISION TO KEENE

Denton leads league-leading Owls with goal and three assists

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior forward Lakota Denton had a goal and three assists as the Keene State College men's soccer team remained unbeaten in the Little East Conference with a 4-1 victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Tuesday.

The win is the sixth straight overall for Keene State (11-2) and fifth without a loss in the Little East conference. Eastern had its winless streak extended to six matches (0-4-2) in falling to 4-8-2, 1-3 in the conference. Keene entered played ranked third in New England, 20th in Division III.

Denton, a first-team all-conference selection a year ago, gave the Owls a 1-0 lead in the 14th minute, then assisted on the his team's final three goals. Junior midfielder Mike Norton scored both of Keene's goals in the second half, his team-leading ninth and ten goals of the season. Sophomore forward Robby Carson added a goal and two assists for the Owls.

With Eastern trailing 2-0, junior forward Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR) came off the bench to cut the deficit in half with his fifth goal of the season 14 minutes before the end of the first half. Norton got that one back seven minutes into the second half and added the clincher in the final seven minutes. Senior midfielder Tony Manfre (ELLINGTON) assisted on Lieder's goal, his first point of the season.

The win was the 400th in 30 seasons at Keene State for Owls' head coach Ron Butcher.

Cioffi's second penalty kick goal of season provides equalizer

GORHAM, Maine -- Senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** converted a penalty-kick goal for the second time in four matches to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team into a 1-1 Little East Conference overtime tie with the University of Southern Maine Saturday.

With ECSU (4-7-2, 1-2-1) trailing 1-0 with seven minutes left in the first half, the Warriors were awarded a penalty kick when Southern Maine (4-6-3, 0-3-1) was whistled for a foul in the box. Cioffi, who scored on a penalty kick a week ago against the University of Massachusetts Boston, made it 2-for-2 in scoring his team-leading fifth goal of the season.

Southern Maine, 1-5-1 in its last seven outings, took a 1-0 lead in the 20th minute when sophomore forward Darby Higgins scored his team-leading eighth goal of the season on an assist from senior Jim Hopkins. The tie extends ECSU's winless streak to 0-3-2.

ECSU sophomore **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** made six saves while Southern Maine sophomore Chad Bouchard, making only his second start of the season, made four. Eastern hosts conference leader Keene State College Tuesday at 4 p.m.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER SHUT OUT BY TRINITY COLLEGE 6-0

Bantams score four goals in second half in most lopsided win in series

HARTFORD, Conn. -- Senior forward Mike Wilson sparked a second-half onslaught with two goals, Trinity College scoring three times in 15 minutes in the stanza in a 6-0 shutout of Eastern Connecticut State University Wednesday.

Eastern (4-7-1) is winless in its last four (0-3-1) matches while the Bantams (6-3) won for the second straight time after three consecutive losses. The outcome is the most lopsided in the 16-game history of the series, 11 of the previous matches having been decided by two or less goals.

Leading 2-0 at halftime, Trinity scored third times in a span of just under 15 minutes, with Wilson scoring the first and last. Sophomore forward Peter Zoppi scored the middle goal in the stretch -- his second of the match.

The shots in the match were nearly equal and Trinity junior keeper Tom Hambrick-Stowe was called upon to make 11 saves. However, none of the saves were difficult for Hambrick-Stowe, who has limited ECSU to one goal in earning the win in net the last three years.

First-year ECSU junior **Sherwane Hudson (HARTFORD)** made his first collegiate start in net, allowing two goals while making one save in the first half.

ECSU, ALBERTUS MAGNUS PLAY TO 2-2 TIE IN MEN'S SOCCER

Warriors squander early two-goal lead for second time this season

NEW HAVEN, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team scored the first two goals of the match inside the first 15 minutes for the second time this year but came away again without a win in a 2-2 overtime draw with Albertus Magnus College Monday.

Senior forward **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)** and freshman midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** gave ECSU (4-6-1) an early 2-0 lead but Albertus (6-5-2) got one back midway through the first half and gained the equalizer when senior midfielder Victor Crespo converted his third penalty kick of the season nine minutes into the second half.

The Warriors, who are unbeaten (5-0-3) against Albertus in the last eight meetings, outshot the Falcons 25-14 but Albertus senior keeper Gabe Demelo came up with 12 saves -- seven in the first half on 16 ECSU shots.

Two weeks ago, ECSU scored twice in the first 15 minutes to take a 2-0 lead in a Little East Conference match at Plymouth State but was beaten in the 12th minute of overtime, 3-2.

The goal by Bazzano was a one-timer off a pass from sophomore midfielder **Chris Bienkowski (WILLINGTON)** in the 14th minute and was his first goal of the season. Petaway scored his first collegiate goal one minute and 38 seconds later after stealing an Albertus clearing pass and ripping an 18-yarder from the right wing inside the left post.

Crespo set up Albertus' first goal midway through the half by sending a through ball from midfield to senior midfielder Kevin Guarino. Guarino's chip shot looped over the head of ECSU sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** and rolled into the net. Nine minutes into the second half, Crespo scored his team-leading 11th goal of the season when the Warriors were whistled for a foul in the penalty box. Crespo sent his shot inside the right post as Craig dove in the opposite direction.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER BEATEN BY WHEATON COLLEGE 5-1

Lyons remain unbeaten against Warriors in seven matches

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore forward Dan Antoniuk had a goal and two assists to spark the Wheaton College (MA) men's soccer team to a 5-1 win over Eastern Connecticut State University Wednesday.

Leading 1-0, the Lyons (6-3) got goals from Antoniuk and junior midfielder Adam Donroe 64 seconds apart late in the first half to push their advantage to 3-0.

Wheaton, ranked in a tie for ninth in New England, outshot ECSU 22-5 in remaining unbeaten against ECSU in seven matches all-time (6-0-1). The Lyons, last year's ECAC New England Division III champions, have outscored ECSU 18-2 in the series.

Led by Antoniuk, who has 14 goals and five assists in nine matches, eight different players figured in the scoring for Wheaton. Senior back Jeremy Hancock had a goal and assist and junior back Dave Jorge two assists.

With the Warriors trailing 3-0, senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** got Eastern (4-5) on the board 44 seconds before the half when he blasted a 25 yard direct kick past Wheaton senior keeper Greg Bates. Cioffi has scored two and assisted on two of the team's last four goals.

The loss snaps a two-game winning streak for Eastern, which returns to Little East Conference action Saturday at 1 p.m. at the University of Massachusetts Boston.

EARLY GOAL LIFTS ECSU MEN'S SOCCER PAST WESTERN CONN. 1-0

Cioffi scores with 28 seconds gone, Craig shuts out Colonials for second straight year

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Eastern Connecticut State University senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** cashed in his second goal of the season when Western Connecticut State University junior keeper Tim Luchsinger dropped a crossing pass just 28 seconds into play as the Warriors posted a 1-0 Little East Conference men's soccer shutout Saturday.

The win is the second in as many years for Eastern (4-4, 1-1) over Western (7-3-1, 1-1) after a ten-game winless streak (0-9-1). The Colonials, ranked ninth in New England, had a four-game winning streak snapped with their first shutout loss of the season.

Luchsinger, who would make three saves on point-blank shots in the final seven minutes to keep his team close, charged out to grab a crossing pass from ECSU freshman midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** in the opening seconds. After gaining possession, Luchsinger dropped the ball and Cioffi was there to slip it into the open net..

Eastern outshot Western 21-9 but Luchsinger came up 12 saves, eight in the second half. ECSU sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** made four saves to shut out Western for the second straight year. The shutout was the second straight for Craig, and ninth in 26 career starts.

Western's best opportunity to score came with ten minutes left in the first half but freshman midfielder Jason Borofsky pushed the ball wide of the left post from six yards while facing an open net. Eastern had several prime chances to increase its lead but Luchsinger made saves each time. With 6:34 left, Cioffi was alone after receiving a pass from junior midfielder **Geoff Zimmitti (HEBRON)** but Luchsinger deflected the shot. With 2:45 left, Luchsinger turned away Zimmitti's one-on-one opportunity, then recovered to stop a rebound shot by sophomore midfielder **B.J. Wencil (BURLINGTON)**.

A total of seven cautions and three red (ejection) cards were handed out in the match which included 32 fouls. The Warriors played a man short for seven minutes after senior forward **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)** was issued a red card with 21 minutes left, but with 14 minutes left, Western senior forward Chris Masso was also ejected. ECSU head coach Frantz Innocent had been ejected seven minutes into the second half for complaining loudly to referee Delfim Rainho.

Until yesterday, the outcome of an Eastern-Western match had not been decided by a 1-0 score since 1979 -- a span of 21 games. Yesterday marked only the third 1-0 final in 30 matches between the teams.

ECSU MEN'S SOCCER STOPS FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK

Warriors outshoot Massachusetts College 27-6 in 2-0 victory

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior midfielder **Geoff Zimmitti (HEBRON)** scored his third goal of the season and senior midfielder **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** picked up his first two assists of the season as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team snapped a four-game losing streak with a 2-0 win over Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts Wednesday.

The win is the third in the last four years for Eastern (3-4) over the Mohawks (4-4-1) and second straight by a 2-0 shutout over Massachusetts College at Willimantic. Mass College qualified for last year's ECAC New England Division III Tournament.

Zimmitti's goal came in the 14th minute and was his first since separating his shoulder in the second match of the season three weeks ago against Salve Regina. Cioffi started the play with a pass to freshman midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** on the right wing. Petaway carried the ball toward the end line before crossing to Zimmitti, who boomed an 18-yarder under the crossbar. The point was the first for Petaway.

Eastern, which held a commanding 27-6 advantage in shots, doubled its margin less than six minutes into the second half when senior back **Ted Buck (STORRS)** got his head on Cioffi's corner kick and sent it past Mass College junior keeper Aaron Majka.

Majka, who had posted three shutouts in five starts and a 0.77 goals-against average heading into play, came up with two standout saves on shots by ECSU senior back **Michael Fritch (TORRINGTON)** in the first half and by Zimmitti midway through the second to keep his team within striking distance. In the first half, Majka also got help from sophomore back David Warren, who stepped into goal to knock away a header by ECSU senior forward **Paul Bazzano (ROCKY HILL)** which was headed toward an open goal.

Sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** combined on the team's second shutout with sophomore **Scott Santo (ANSONIA)** and junior **Sherwane Hudson (HARTFORD)**. Craig made the trio's only two saves while working the first half.

Eastern looks for its first win in its second Little East Conference match Saturday when it hosts Western Connecticut State University at 1 p.m. Western is ranked ninth in New England.

PLYMOUTH MEN'S SOCCER RALLIES PAST ECSU IN LITTLE EAST

Panthers erase two-goal deficit, score 12 minutes into overtime in 3-2 victory

PLYMOUTH, NH -- The Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team has had its share of success against Plymouth State College since the inception of the Little East Conference in 1989, having beaten the three-time defending conference champion Panthers four times and tied once.

Saturday, ECSU had an opportunity to extend that run of success, scoring twice in the first 15 minutes. Plymouth, however, pulling even with two goals within a span of five minutes beginning in the 32nd minute, then won the conference opener for both schools, 3-2, by scoring an "own" goal 12 minutes into sudden death overtime.

The loss is the fourth straight for Eastern after a 2-0 start while Plymouth (5-4) won for the third straight time following a 2-4 start. Plymouth has won 17 straight conference matches since Eastern shut out the Panthers 5-0 Oct. 26, 1996 at Willimantic.

Junior forward **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** scored his second and third goals of the season just over four minutes apart to give the Warriors a 2-0 lead before the match was five minutes old. The first goal was the team's first after a scoreless streak of 303 minutes and 35 seconds. Lieder, the leading scorer at Albertus Magnus College in both 1997 and 1998, beat Plymouth freshman keeper Brad Wilby on hard shots in capitalizing on one-on-one opportunities.

Playing without top scorer Antoine Moiboueyi (seven goals in seven matches) -- sitting out a one-game suspension after accumulating five yellow cards -- Plymouth got one goal back in the 32nd minute when sophomore forward Sal Friello came off the bench to head in a long crossing pass while stationed on the right post, then tied the match when senior forward Michael Soares beat ECSU sophomore keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** in the 37th minute. The game-tying goal came just moments after Craig stormed out to stuff a breakaway bid by Plymouth junior midfielder Jeremy Gasowski

Following a scoreless second half, Plymouth won the match late in the first overtime session when the ECSU defense sent senior midfielder Kevin Martin's crossing pass into its own net on a clearing attempt.

Plymouth outshot ECSU 22-15, forcing Craig to come up with a season-high total of 11 saves -- the most in his last 21 matches. Wilby, who regularly ranged far out of his net to grab loose balls, needed only three saves to record the win.

Former E.O. Smith teammates score twice and add an assist in 3-0 win

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Former E.O. Smith High School teammates **Ted Buck (STORRS)**, **Vincent Cioffi (WILLINGTON)** and **Chris Bienkowski (WILLINGTON)** combined for two goals and an assist to power the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 3-0 win over Salve Regina University Wednesday.

Eastern is 2-0 after its second home win in five days while the Seahawks fall to 1-2. The match was the first ever between the programs.

Junior forward **Geoff Zimmitti (HEBRON)** and Buck each scored first half goals and Cioffi put the game away with his team-leading 13th career goal midway through the second half. Zimmitti, however, suffered a possible *left* right shoulder separation with 26 minutes left in the match after being taken down while making a run inside the box.

ECSU sophomore keepers **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** and **Scott Santo (ANSONIA)** combined on the shutout. Santo, making his first collegiate appearance, made one save over the final 14 minutes. Craig's most difficult save came in the 18th minute and preserved a scoreless tie when Bill Glenney's hard shot toward the right corner of the net deflected back to the left, forcing Craig to make a diving stop to his right. Zimmitti gave ECSU a 1-0 lead a minute later.

Salve, ranked tenth in last year's final Metro Region poll and the 1998 Commonwealth Coast Conference (CCC) champion, had shut out Montclair State University 2-0 in its 1999 debut Saturday. Montclair is ranked in a tie for fourth in the first Metro Region poll.

Eastern travels to face Ramapo College of New Jersey Saturday at 1 p.m. The Roadrunners are ranked in a tie for fourth in the Metro Region.

LIEDER'S LATE GOAL LIFTS ECSU MEN'S SOCCER *First-year junior breaks tie with 1:44 left in win over Roger Williams*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior forward **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** came off the bench in the second half to score the game-winning goal with 1:44 left and lift the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-1 win over Roger Williams University Saturday in the opener for both teams.
