**ECSU MEN'S SOCCER ELIMINATED BY KEENE IN LEC TOURNAMENT**  
*Owls shut out Warriors for second time this season, 7-0; advance to semis*

KEENE, NH -- Eight Keene State College players contributed to the scoring as the Owls eliminated Eastern Connecticut State University from the 2000 Little East Conference playoffs with a 7-0 victory in play-in action Tuesday.

Third-seeded Keene State (15-5), ranked seventh in New England, advances to the tournament semifinals Friday when it visits second-seeded Massachusetts Dartmouth. The tournament's sixth and final seed, Eastern concludes its season with a 4-16 record. Keene had blanked Eastern 8-0 when the teams met in the regular season two weeks ago at Keene, NH.

Keene, which had a seven-game winning streak snapped Saturday with a loss in its regular-season finale, scored its first three goals in the final 17 minutes of the first half and added two more in an a span of seven minutes early in the second half.

Seven different players scored one goal each for Keene, with John Cortese adding a pair of assists. Lakota Denton, ranked second in the conference in scoring, contributed two assists.

First-year junior keeper **Kevin Asklar (MARLBOROUGH)** made seven saves while working the first half in his first collegiate start. Keene outshot ECSU 32-10, with Owls' keeper D.J. Nordmark making six saves -- none of them difficult -- to record his seventh shutout.

**ECSU SHUT OUT IN REGULAR-SEASON FINALE 1-0**

*Late goal lifts UMass Dartmouth to Little East Conference victory*

NORTH DARTMOUTH, Mass. -- Sophomore forward Tore Terrasi scored the only goal of the match with eight minutes left to carry the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth men's soccer team to a 1-0 Little East Conference victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Saturday in the regular-season finale for both teams.

Following an injury stoppage of play, freshman midfielder David Fonseca's through ball sprung Terrasi, who lifted a 12-yarder over ECSU junior keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** for the only goal of the match. The loss was the tenth this year by shutout for Eastern (4-15, 2-5). The conference win was the fifth against a loss and a tie for UMass (14-4-1), which reversed last year's 1-5-1 conference ledger. The Corsairs are ranked ninth in New England.

Both teams entered play assured of a spot in the conference playoffs, which get underway with play-in games Tuesday. Eastern will be seeded sixth in the six-team field and will travel to face the No. 3 seed, which will be either UMass Dartmouth or Keene State College. Eastern will face UMass if Keene wins or ties Western Connecticut State University tonight and will meet Keene if the Owls lose to the Colonials.

Eastern, which had beaten UMass the last five times the teams had met, managed only two shots in the second half. Sophomore keeper Jorge Fonseca, the conference leader in goals-against average, needed only four saves -- none in the second half -- to record his fifth shutout of the year.

David Fonseca was credited with seven of his team's 13 shots but could not break through with a goal. Craig stopped Fonseca's point-blank header early in the second half and also knocked Fonseca off the ball on a breakaway with 20 minutes left in a scoreless match. Fonseca also hit the post three minutes into the second half after taking a crossing pass.

ECSU freshman forward **Gary Burns (WINDSOR)** had two of ECSU's seven shots and was unable to convert two prime chances, one in each half. He volleyed a 12-yarder wide midway through the first half and one-timed a shot wide from close range following a cross from the right wing by sophomore midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** 11 minutes into the second half.

*Cardinals score first three goals of match as Warriors fall in home finale*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Ten different players contributed a goal or assist as the Wesleyan University men's soccer team routed Eastern Connecticut State University 5-1 Thursday.

Wesleyan (6-5) scored the first three goals of the match to take a 3-0 lead with 18 minutes left in the first half and added two more in the second half.

Ten different Wesleyan players collected at least one point, led by freshman Tivon Sidorsky, who scored twice. Freshman Rick Ferri added a goal and assist and sophomore Padraig Hughes two assists.

Senior **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** scored his team-leading third goal of the season for Eastern (4-14), which concluded its home season. Freshman **Dwight Anderson (KINGSTON, JAMAICA)** picked up his first point with an assist.

Eastern closes out its regular season Saturday at Massachusetts Dartmouth in a Little East Conference match and opens play in the conference playoffs Tuesday at a site and against an opponent not yet determined.

**PETAWAY LIFTS ECSU MEN'S SOCCER PAST BRIDGEWATER STATE**  
*Warriors even home record with 2-1 overtime decision over Bears*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore midfielder **John Petaway (CHESHIRE)** scored his second goal of the season 13 minutes into sudden death overtime as the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team rallied for a 2-1 win over Bridgewater State College Tuesday.

Trailing 1-0 at halftime, Eastern (4-13) tied the match on senior forward **Chris Lieder's (SEYMOUR)** third goal of the season midway through the second half. In overtime, a crossing pass into the box bounced off a Bridgewater State defender to the feet of Petaway, who punched his game-winning goal into an open net from eight yards. It was his first goal since Oct. 7 and the second game-winning one of his career and evened ECSU's home record this year at 4-4.

Bridgewater (3-12), which had a two-game winning streak snapped, took a 1-0 lead when senior forward Kyle Shave volleyed a ten-yarder inside the left post on a pass from junior midfielder Jason Hanscom for his team-leading sixth goal of the year. ECSU tied the match 20 minutes into the second half when Lieder beat Bridgewater senior keeper Brian Murphy with an open 15-yarder on a pass from junior midfielder **B.J. Wencil (BURLINGTON)**. It was Wencil's first career point.

First-year junior keeper **Kevin Asklar (MARLBOROUGH)** was credited with his first career win. Asklar replaced junior **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** in net to start the second half and recorded one overtime save. The save was a deflection of a shot by Bridgewater's Mathew Pearce which carried past and hit the left post one minute into overtime. Hanscom's shot on the rebound rode wide of the right post. Two minutes before Petaway's game-winning, Hanscom hit the right post when he one-timed the crossing pass of a corner kick.

**ECSU MEN'S SOCCER LOSES TO RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE 4-1**  
*Despite loss, Warriors qualify for Little East Conference playoffs*

PROVIDENCE, RI -- Senior forward Tim Brown scored three second-half goals and assisted on the fourth to carry the Rhode Island College men's soccer team to a 4-1 Little East Conference win over Eastern Connecticut State University Saturday.

Despite the loss, Eastern (3-13, 2-4) qualified for next month's conference playoffs as one of six playoff seeds. Tournament contender UMass Boston was eliminated from contention after losing to conference co-leader Keene State 2-0 Saturday. Rhode Island (8-7-1, 2-3-1) qualified for the playoffs with the win, moving a point ahead of ECSU into fifth place in the eight-team conference. Regular-season conference play ends next Saturday.

ECSU senior forward **Chris Lieder (SEYMOUR)** had scored his second goal of the season with 61 seconds left in the first half to lift the Warriors into a 1-0 lead but Brown scored twice in a four-minute span in the opening minutes of the second half to give his team the lead for good. After assisting on the team's third goal in the 70th minute, Brown completed the hat trick with 11 minutes left in the match.

**KEENE STATE MEN'S SOCCER DRUBS ECSU 8-0 IN LITTLE EAST**  
*Ranked seventh in NE, Owls ease to eighth straight win over Warriors*

KEENE, NH -- Freshman Peter Peralta had three goals and an assist to help power the Keene State College men's soccer team to an 8-0 Little East Conference win over Eastern Connecticut State University Tuesday.

With its fourth straight win, Keene (11-4, 4-1) keeps pace with conference-leading Plymouth State College, remaining two points behind the Panthers. ECSU (3-12, 2-3) had won three of its last four entering play. The Owls are ranked seventh in New England and have beaten ECSU the last eight times the teams have met.

The eight-goal margin is the largest in defeat in the 40-year history of the ECSU program and the eight goals allowed are the second most in a match. Three of Keene's goal came in the final eight minutes.

**ECSU MEN'S SOCCER EDGES SOUTHERN MAINE IN OT**

*Todd Parness's first career goal 13:30 into OT lifts Warriors*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Freshman midfielder **Todd Parness's** (NORTH BRANFORD) first career goal on his fourth career shot 13 minutes and 30 seconds into overtime lifted the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 1-0 Little East Conference win over the University of Southern Maine Saturday.

Parness, who had seen just 12 minutes of action in regulation, one-timed the rebound of his own blocked shot from the right post inside the far left post from 12 yards as the Warriors (3-11, 2-2) remained unbeaten (7-0-2) all-time at home against Southern Maine. The loss is the seventh straight for the Huskies (3-11-1, 0-4) -- all by shutout -- and stretches their winless streak to eight (0-7-1).

Sophomore back **Travis Deprey** (BILLERICA, MA) and freshman forward **Kevin Zimmitti** (HEBRON) set up the winning goal following a re-start, Zimmitti sliding the ball from the left wing across the box to Parness.

Both teams had numerous chances to score in regulation. Senior forward **Chris Lieder** (SEYMOUR) came off the bench to take eight of the Warriors' season-high 35 shots. Lieder hit the post with shots once in each half while junior midfielder **Russell Ferreira** (TOLLAND) blasted a wide-open ten-yarder over the crossbar with 13 minutes left in the first half. Southern Maine junior keeper Drew Mazzeo also robbed ECSU junior midfielder **Brian Fitzgerald** (MARLBOROUGH) when he dove to his left to deny a 15-yarder three minutes into the second half.

Southern Maine's best opportunity came late in the second half, but with ECSU junior keeper **Doutg Craig** (NIANTIC) out of the net, sophomore midfielder Michael Stowe sent an 18-yard shot wide of the left post.

*Bantams score midway through first half, record fifth straight over Warriors*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore forward Morgan Sandell connected on a direct kick midway through the first half to power the Trinity College men's soccer team to a 1-0 win over Eastern Connecticut State University Wednesday.

The win is the fifth in as many years for Trinity (3-3-3) over Eastern (2-11). The Bantams snapped a three-game winless streak while ECSU lost after two straight wins.

*Warriors score twice in first half in win over Albertus Magnus*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Senior back **Mike Murphy (MONTVILLE)** and junior forward **Sal Emanuele (MIDDLEFIELD)** scored first-half goals to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-1 victory over Albertus Magnus College Monday.

### ECSU MEN'S SOCCER POSTS FIRST WIN OF SEASON

*Warriors edge UMass Boston in Little East Conference 2-1*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Sophomore back **Travis Deprey (BILLERICA, MA)** scored his first career goal with nine minutes left to carry the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team to a 2-1 Little East Conference win over Massachusetts Boston Saturday.

The win is the first overall this year for Eastern (1-10) and first after two conference losses. UMass Boston, which has never beaten ECSU in six meetings in Willimantic, falls to 7-4-1 overall. Both teams are 1-2 in the conference.

Deprey, who moved to forward after starting the match at stopperback, beat UMass keeper Orlando Torres at the left post when he volleyed a pass from freshman midfielder **Kevin Zimmitti (HEBRON)**. Senior forward **Jan Trzcinski (MIDDLETOWN)** also assisted on the goal, his first point of the season.

Sophomore midfielder John Petaway's first goal of the year had given ECSU a 1-0 lead just five minutes into action but Anthony Pastore followed 15 minutes later with his first career goal.

Junior keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** made eight saves -- only two in the second half -- to gain his first win of the season.

### **ECSU MEN'S SOCCER SHUT OUT BY WESTERN CONN. 4-0**

*Warriors lose Little East Conference match, drop ninth straight decision*

DANBURY, Conn. -- Freshman forward David Farero scored three times on breakaways as the Western Connecticut State University men's soccer team routed Eastern Connecticut State University 4-0 Sunday in Little East Conference action.

The loss is the ninth straight for Eastern (0-9) and second in two conference contests. Western won for only the second time in six outings (2-3-1). The Colonials are 1-1 in the conference.

The Colonials scored all of their goals in a span of 18 minutes, beginning with Farero's team-leading sixth goal of the year in the 35th minute and concluding with his third goal of the match eight minutes into the second half. Long through balls sprung Farero for each of his goals.

The win was the first for Western over Eastern after losses each of the past two years.

### ECSU MEN'S SOCCER DROPS SEVENTH STRAIGHT DECISION

*Plymouth State scores twice in first half in 2-0 win in conference opener*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Junior forward Antoine Moiboueyi scored a pair of goals 15 minutes apart in the first half to power the Plymouth State College men's soccer team to a 2-0 win over Eastern Connecticut State University Saturday in the Little East Conference opener for both schools.

Ranked eighth in New England, Plymouth (5-2) was backed by Moiboueyi's team-leading fifth and sixth goals of the season in defeating the Warriors (0-7) for the fourth straight season. Eastern was shut out for the fourth straight match and for the fifth time this year.

Moiboueyi, who did not play in Plymouth's 3-2 overtime win over Eastern a year ago due to a red-card suspension, wasted no time giving the Panthers a 1-0 lead this time around. Fifteen minutes later, Moiboueyi made it 2-0 when he leaped to head in teammate Magnus Eriksson's long chip into the box, sending a looping shot over the head of Craig, who had raced out in an attempt to grab the pass.

Plymouth, which has allowed only three goals in its five wins, outshot ECSU 22-6. Junior keeper Scott Laine needed only two saves to record the shutout.

### ECSU MEN'S SOCCER DROPS SIXTH STRAIGHT DECISION

*Warriors shut out for third straight match, 2-0 at Westfield State*

### ECSU MEN'S SOCCER EDGED BY COAST GUARD 1-0

*Warriors beaten by that score for third time this season, fall to 0-5*

NEW LONDON, Conn. -- Junior forward Scott Cieplik scored on a breakaway in the 18th minute as the U.S. Coast Guard Academy handed the Eastern Connecticut State University men's soccer team its third 1-0 defeat this season Friday.

In addition to saddling ECSU (0-5) with its third 1-0 loss this year, Coast Guard (2-1-1) posted its third 1-0 victory over the Warriors in as many years. In all three, Coast Guard keeper Jim Wimberley has recorded the shutout in the Bears' net. ECSU junior keeper **Doug Craig (NIANTIC)** has absorbed all three losses. As a freshman in 1998, Craig made a career-high 13 saves in a 117-minute sudden death overtime loss to the Bears. Cieplik assisted on the only goal of that match.

Cieplik, who missed all of last year with a broken leg, scored his team-leading fourth goal of the year Friday after beating Craig from 15 yards with a hard shot under the crossbar. Junior forward Jake Smith took the ball away from an ECSU player at midfield and sent a long through ball to Cieplik, who carried for 20 yards before unloading what would be the only goal of the match.

Thirty-seven seconds after the goal, Eastern was awarded a penalty kick after senior midfielder **Geoff Zimmitti (HEBRON)** was taken down in the box but Zimmitti drove a ground ball just wide of the left post. Twice in the final minutes, Eastern had the ball in the box but couldn't gain the equalizer. Wimberley came up with his only difficult save on the night when he drove to his right to smother a header by ECSU sophomore midfielder **Ryan Smith's (MADISON)** with 2:20 left.

Leading 1-0, Coast Guard nearly added an insurance marker with 12 minutes left but Coast Guard junior midfielder Jared Trusz re-directed a hard head ball right at Craig, who made the save.

Wimberley made eight saves while Craig, who lowered his goals-against average to 1.89, came up with a season-high ten.
