**EARLE PACES EASTERN MEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY AT NE CHAMPIONSHIP**

*In career finale, senior finishes a career-high 133rd; Warriors 32<sup>nd</sup> in 43-team field*

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. – Eastern Connecticut State University senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** recorded his best career finish at the New England Division III Men's Cross Country Championship Meet Saturday, placing 133<sup>rd</sup> to lead the Warriors to a 32<sup>nd</sup> place finish among 43 teams over 8,000 meters at the Veterans Memorial Golf Course.

Running in his final career race, Earle was timed in 28:26 in placing 133<sup>rd</sup> in a field of 303 and leading all Eastern runners at the stripe for the eighth straight race. Sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)** was 182<sup>nd</sup> overall in a time of 29:18, just 52 seconds behind Earle. Earle's best previous finish in this race came in 2002, when he placed 143<sup>rd</sup> in a field of 268. Last year, Curley was 222<sup>nd</sup> among 280 finishers.

Tufts University's five scoring runners were among the first 20 finishers as the Jumbos eased to a 56-point win over Wesleyan University to claim the team title. Keene State College, like Eastern a member of the Little East Conference, was third, seven points better than Williams College. Wesleyan senior Owen Kiely won the individual title with a nine second win over Neal Holtschulte of Williams.

Eastern's five scoring runners finished in the same order as they did in the Oct. 29 conference championship meet. Behind Earle and Curley were freshmen **Jim Varano (PLAINVILLE)**, **Jim Condren (SOUTHINGTON)** and **Sean McLaughlin (BRANFORD)**. Varano (30:15) was 216<sup>th</sup> overall, Condren (30:28) 223<sup>rd</sup> and McLaughlin (30:39) 228<sup>th</sup>.

**NOLAN TOP EASTERN FINISHER AT NEW ENGLAND XC CHAMPIONSHIP**

*Junior 153<sup>rd</sup> overall at women's meet; Warriors 32<sup>nd</sup> in field of 41 teams*

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. – Eastern Connecticut State University junior **Erin Nolan (TOLLAND)** placed 153<sup>rd</sup> overall among 281 finishers at the New England Division III Women's Cross Country Championship Meet Saturday to lead the Warriors to a 32<sup>nd</sup>-place finish among 41 teams over 6,000 meters at Veterans Memorial Golf Course.

A second-year runner, Nolan (25:34) was followed at the finish by teammates **Terry Frechette (LEDYARD)**, **Jessie Marshall (YANTIC)**, **Amy Zawistowski (MANCHESTER)** and **Allie Willets (CLINTON)**. A freshman, Frechette (26:52) was 188<sup>th</sup> overall, Marshall (27:14) 202<sup>nd</sup>, Zawistowski (27:56) 216<sup>th</sup> and Willets (28:05) 223<sup>rd</sup>.

Williams won the team and individual titles. Led by individual champion Caroline Cretti, Williams placed its first four runners among the top 12 and all five among the top 25 to defeat runner-up Colby College by 33 points. Cretti managed an 11-point win over Keene State's Jennifer Adams in the race for the individual New England championship.

In this race last year, Nolan led all Eastern runners by finishing 160<sup>th</sup> in a field of 268 while Marshall was 229<sup>th</sup>, Zawistowski 237<sup>th</sup> and Willets 259<sup>th</sup>.

**EARLE, CURLEY LEAD EASTERN MEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY**  
*Both improve positions from a year ago at Little East/NE Alliance Championship*

WESTFIELD, Mass. – Eastern Connecticut State University senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** and sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)** paced a pack of 11 finishers at the Little East Conference/New England Alliance Men's Cross-Country Championship Saturday in a race run over 5,000 meters at Stanley Park.

In the Little East competition, Earle was 17<sup>th</sup> and Curley 25<sup>th</sup> among 49 finishers. In a field of 110 in the New England Alliance scoring, Earle was 26<sup>th</sup> and Curley 47<sup>th</sup>. Earle moved eight spots from a year ago in the LEC meet and 12 spots in the alliance; Curley improved his place from a year ago by ten spots in the LEC and 18 in the alliance competition. Earle has led Eastern runners at the finish for seven straight races, a streak which began in this race a year ago.

Five Little East Conference institutions were joined by five members of the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference (MASCAC) to comprise the New England Alliance Meet.

Keene State College maintained its dominance in both races, winning both for the ninth straight year since joining the conference in 1997. The Owls eased to a 35 point win over the University of Southern Maine to claim the LEC crown and took the alliance championship by a 58-point margin over the Huskies.

**Jim Varano (PLAINVILLE)** was Eastern's top freshman finisher, placing 32<sup>nd</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup>, respectively, in the conference and alliance scoring.

## **NOLAN REPEATS ALLIANCE XC HONORS AT WOMEN'S MEET**

*Sophomore's 16<sup>th</sup>-place finish in New England Alliance scoring lands her all-NEA honors*

WESTFIELD, Mass. –Sophomore **Erin Nolan (TOLLAND)** became the first Eastern Connecticut State University female to earn All-New England Alliance honors in consecutive years since 1998 Saturday at the Little East Conference/New England Alliance Women's Cross-Country Championship in a race run over 3,000 meters at Stanley Park.

In a time of 20:37, Nolan ran to a 16<sup>th</sup>-place finish in a field of 86 to win All-New England Alliance recognition for the second straight year. As a freshman, she placed 20<sup>th</sup> in a field of 87 to become the second Eastern freshman in as many years to gain all-alliance recognition. The alliance recognizes the Top 20 finishers with all-alliance honors while the first seven conference finishers earn All-Little East Conference laurels.

As a team, the Warriors equaled their second-highest finish in nine years of alliance competition. Eastern placed fifth in a ten-team alliance field and fifth in a five-team conference field.

Keene State College remained the only winner of both titles this decade, taking both championships for the sixth straight year. The Owls overpowered Westfield State College by 37 points to claim the alliance crown and was 27 points better than the University of Southern Maine in conference scoring.

Nolan, who was also 12<sup>th</sup> in a field of 39 Little East Conference runners, becomes the program's ninth all-alliance honoree in nine years. A total of six different individuals have won the honor, but only Nolan and Monica Gallagher (1997-1998) have performed the feat in consecutive seasons. Marcy Johnston (2000, 2002) was also twice named all-alliance.

Following Nolan at the tape were freshman **Terry Frechette (LEDYARD)** and junior **Jessie Marshall (YANTIC)**. Frechette was 29<sup>th</sup> overall in the alliance meet and 19<sup>th</sup> in the alliance. Marshall was 32<sup>nd</sup> in the alliance and 21<sup>st</sup> in the conference.

Also scoring points and helping the Warriors to their highest alliance finish since 2000 were sophomore **Allie Willets (CLINTON)** and freshman **Sarah Bryden (BROAD BROOK)**. In the alliance, Willets was 42<sup>nd</sup> overall, Bryden 44<sup>th</sup>.

**IN MEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY, RIC TRIMS EASTERN, 28-29**

*Warriors breeze past Mitchell College to gain split of home meet*

MANSFIELD, Conn. – The Eastern Connecticut State University men's cross-country team placed its five point-getters in front of Rhode Island College's fifth-place finisher but the Anchormen had just enough to edge the Warriors, 28-29 Saturday morning in a race run over 7,000 meters at Mansfield Hollow State Park.

In Eastern's (1-1) only home cross-country meet of the season, Rhode Island managed to gain the one-point win when senior Tim Goodwin finished in seventh place as his team's No. 4 finisher, ahead of Eastern's No. 4 finisher, junior **Mark Lewis (WINDSOR)**.

Mitchell College (0-2) also competed in the tri-meet but its five runners rounded out the field of 21 by finishing in the final five places.

Eastern senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** led Eastern at the finish for the seventh straight race, placing second overall behind individual champion Eric Lonergan. Earle led through the early portion of the race before the Rhode Island junior pulled away for a 27 second win. Eastern sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)** was fourth overall, freshman **Jim Varano (PLAINVILLE)** sixth and Lewis eighth.

A total of 11 Eastern runners completed the race.

The constant rain of the past week forced race officials to abbreviate the original 8,000 meter layout. The race was run in steady rain.

Eastern competes in the Little East Conference/New England Alliance Championship Oct. 29 at Stanley Park in Westfield, MA.

**EARLE, CURLEY PACE EASTERN M-CROSS COUNTRY AT EARLEY**

*Both post best times in this race in leading Warriors to 12<sup>th</sup> place in field of 23*

WESTFIELD, Mass. – Senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** and sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)** both ran their fastest time at the Ninth Annual James Earley Cross-Country Invitational in pacing the Eastern Connecticut State University men's team to a 12<sup>th</sup>-place finish Saturday at Stanley Park.

Earle led the Warriors at the finish for the sixth straight race dating back to last October 30, leading all Eastern runners in this race for the second straight season. Earle finished 29<sup>th</sup> overall in a field of 239 in a time of 28:36. Last year, he placed 81<sup>st</sup> in a field of 245 and in 2001, was 66<sup>th</sup> among 220 finishers. He was timed in 29:42 in each of those races.

Curley also finished among the Top 100 in this race, finishing 79<sup>th</sup> in a time of 29:53. Last year, he was 171<sup>st</sup> in a time of 33:08, an improvement of three minutes and 15 seconds.

In all, ten Eastern runners completed the race. Also contributing to the team's point total were freshman **Jim Varano (PLAINVILLE)**, sophomore **Zak Taylor (HAMPTON)** and freshman **Jim Condren (SOUTHINGTON)**. Varano was 115<sup>th</sup> overall, Taylor 119<sup>th</sup> and Condren 127<sup>th</sup>.

As a team, Eastern finished 12<sup>th</sup> among 23 teams which scored points. Bowdoin College placed its five scorers among the top 11 in easing to the team title with a 58-point win over Massachusetts Maritime Academy.

Eastern hosts Rhode Island College Saturday at 10:30 a.m. at Mansfield Hollow State Park in its only home meet of the season.

*Nolan, Marshall and Willets record their fastest times in this race*

WESTFIELD, Mass. – Juniors **Erin Nolan (TOLLAND)** and **Jessie Marshall (YANTIC)** and sophomore **Allie Willets (CLINTON)** all recorded their fastest times in this race for the Eastern Connecticut State University women's cross-country team Saturday at the Ninth Annual James Earley Cross Country Invitational at Stanley Park.

Nolan led Eastern's eight finishers over the 5,000 meter layout, placing 49<sup>th</sup> in a field of 223 in a time of 20:50. She was 72<sup>nd</sup> among 213 finishers a year ago in a time of 21:44. Marshall was 102<sup>nd</sup> this year in a time of 22:09, an improvement of 49 seconds from a year ago and 62 seconds from her freshman season. Willets placed 127<sup>th</sup> in a time of 22:51, cutting 44 seconds off her time in 2004.

Freshman **Terry Frechette (LEYDARD)** followed Marshall by ten seconds for Eastern, finishing 108<sup>th</sup> in a time of 22:19. Rounding out Eastern's scorers was first-year junior **Sarah Bryden (BROAD BROOK)**, who was 135<sup>th</sup> overall in a time of 22:57.

As a team, Eastern placed 15<sup>th</sup> among 20 teams which scored points. Bowdoin College's five scorers were among the first 15 finishers as the Polar Bears cruised to a 62-point win over Trinity College.

**EASTERN CROSS COUNTRY COMPETES AT RAY DWYER INVITE**

*Men and women both fifth; Earle is men's top finisher for fifth straight race*

WARWICK, R.I. – Senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** led the Eastern Connecticut State University men's cross country team at the finish for the fifth straight race and the men's and women's teams both placed fifth at the Ray Dwyer Invitational at Goddard Memorial State Park Saturday.

The seven-team men's field was won by Division II Bryant College (37 points), which edged the U.S. Coast Guard Academy (47). The Community College of Rhode Island (88) was third, followed by host Rhode Island College (96), Eastern (127), Johnson & Wales University (139) and Mitchell College (200).

The U.S. Coast Guard Academy ran away from a six-team women's field, placing all five of its scorers among the top eight en route to collecting only 25 points. Southern Connecticut State University (72) was a distant second, with the University of Massachusetts Boston (90) third, and Bryant College (98) fourth. Eastern (103) was fifth, followed by Johnson & Wales University (128).

Earle, who ran over two minutes faster than he did a year ago in this race, finished 17<sup>th</sup> in a field of 71 competitors over the 8,000 meter layout in leading all Eastern runners for the fifth straight race, dating back to last year's Little East Conference/New England Alliance Meet Oct. 30.

Earle was followed for the second straight week by sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)**. Curley was 25<sup>th</sup> overall after chopping exactly five minutes off his time of a year ago. Curley finished 21<sup>st</sup> in a field of 32 a year ago. Junior **Mark Lewis (WINDSOR)** bettered his 2004 time by 44 seconds in finishing 46<sup>th</sup>. Three of Eastern final four competitors were freshmen.

For the women's junior **Jessie Marshall (YANTIC)** placed 14<sup>th</sup> in a field of 62 runners who finished the 5,000 meter layout, improving her 2004 time by nine seconds. She was Eastern's second finisher for the second straight week. Also finishing in the top half of the race was freshman **Terry Frechette (LEDYARD)**. She was 29<sup>th</sup> overall.

The Warriors compete at the James Earley Invitational at Westfield, Mass., Saturday, Oct. 8 at 11 a.m.

**EASTERN CROSS-COUNTRY OPENS AT UM DARTMOUTH INVITE**  
*Men 26<sup>th</sup> in field of 33; Women 28<sup>th</sup> among 35 scoring teams in first meet*

NORTH DARTMOUTH, Mass. – The Eastern Connecticut State University men's and women's cross country teams opened their 2005 season at the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual University of Massachusetts Dartmouth Cross Country Invitational Saturday, the men placing 26<sup>th</sup> in a field of 33 and the women finishing 28<sup>th</sup> among 35 scoring teams.

In men's competition, all four of this year's returns knocked significant times off their performance in the meet from a year ago. Over the five mile on-campus layout, senior **David Earle (BRANFORD)** led all Eastern runners at the finish for the second straight year while sophomore **Michael Curley (BRANFORD)** was second this year after finishing sixth on the team a year ago. Earle knocked 61 seconds off his time from a year ago while Curley dropped a remarkable 6:02 from last year's race which was run in heavy rain. Fifth a year ago, sophomore **James Hampton (COLCHESTER)** was Eastern's third finisher this year, improving his time by 2:18. Sophomore **Zak Taylor (HAMPTON)** knocked 67 seconds off his 2004 time, finishing as the Warriors' No. 5 runner.

Eastern's four veterans were joined by freshmen **Jim Varano (PLAINVILLE)**, **Nicholas Noheimer (WILLIMANTIC)** and **Sean McLaughlin (BRANFORD)**. Varano was fourth for Eastern, Noheimer sixth and McLaughlin seventh.

In women's competition, five of Eastern's finishers were running the race for the second time in their careers: juniors **Erin Nolan (TOLLAND)**, **Jessie Marshall (YANTIC)**, **Sarah Levy (GRISWOLD)** and **Ashley Behrent (COLCHESTER)** and sophomore **Jennifer Cody (EAST LYME)**. Nolan repeated as Eastern's highest finisher while Levy had paced all Eastern runners as a freshman in 2003. Nolan knocked 1:22 off last year's time, Marshall 1:56 and Behrent 1:10.

Also among Eastern's finishers this year was sophomore **Allie Willets (CLINTON)**, who did not compete in this race a year ago. Nolan (2004) and Levy (2003) are former All-New England Alliance performers.

The teams compete at the Ray Dwyer Invitational Saturday at 11 a.m. at Goddard Memorial State Park in Warwick, RI. Rhode Island College serves as host.
