**ECSU, WCSU SPLIT LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE DOUBLEHEADER**  
**Colonials clinch crown with first-game win over Warriors**

DANBURY, Conn. -- Sherry Robitaille, Rebecca Tabellione and Wendy Patenaude combined for nine hits, eight runs scored and six RBI to lead the Western Connecticut State University softball team to a 13-4 five-inning victory over Eastern Connecticut State University in the first game of a doubleheader Wednesday which clinched the Little East Conference crown for the Colonials.

In the second game, Eastern (18-20) scored 11 runs in the first two innings off little-used freshman pitcher Nicole Moulton and held on to hand Western (29-10) its only conference loss 13-12.

Western, which opens play in the NCAA Division III Northeast Regional tournament Friday, wins the conference title with an 8-1 record while Eastern finishes second at 8-2 (Western had one game wiped out due to rain). Western was the pre-season favorite to win the title while ECSU, which concluded its season yesterday, was picked for fifth in the six-team conference. It marked the first season of conference softball play.

Freshman third baseman Michelle Cunningham (BARNSTABLE, MA) led ECSU with four hits and four runs scored in the doubleheader while freshman second baseman Michelle DePault (COVENTRY) had three hits and walked twice and freshman rightfielder Kristy Pabon (SOUTHINGTON) three hits, three RBI and two runs. Senior centerfielder Collene Gregory (SHARON), senior shortstop Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON), freshman leftfielder Kelly Rodman (WALLINGFORD), sophomore catcher Nina Polando (SWANSEA, MA) and freshman DP Jenn Spring (NEWINGTON) each added two hits. Rodman also walked twice and Gregory scored three times.

Gregory became the 22nd ECSU player to collect 100 career hits when she doubled to right during ECSU's seven-run first inning in Game 2. She had also reached on an infield single in the fifth inning of Game 1.

Marchetti was 2-for-7 on the day and finished with a single-season record batting average of .459 (exceeding Trish Wodatch's mark of .439 in 1986). She entered the doubleheader second all-time in career batting average at .370, one percentage point behind Lynn Rocheleau (.371). She concluded her career in second place, at .368.

**ECSU SOFTBALL WINS TWICE BY SHUTOUT AT ANDERSON INVITE**  
*Warriors blank Cazenovia, Salem State in final home games of season*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Freshman Holly Silva (WATERFORD) and sophomore Kristine Suhanosky (MILFORD) tossed back-to-back shutouts for the second time this year as the host Eastern Connecticut State University softball team concluded its home season by winning twice in the Anderson Memorial Invitational.

Silva (9-7) allowed only two singles and was backed by a ten-hit attack in ECSU's 8-0, 5 inning decision over Cazenovia College (2-10). Suhanosky (8-12) pitched a complete-game seven-hitter and freshmen Christy Pabon (SOUTHINGTON) and Michelle DePault (COVENTRY) delivered RBI singles in the second inning in the Warriors' 2-0 win over Salem State College (12-17).

In the other tournament game, Salem State defeated Cazenovia 14-6 in five innings.

Senior centerfield Collene Gregory (SHARON) was 3-for-5 with a walk and two runs scoreg for Eastern in the doubleheader, moving to within two of her 100th career hit. Freshman leftfielder Kelly Rodman (WALLINGFORD) was 3-for-6 with two runs scored, freshman third baseman Michelle Cunningham (BARNSTABLE, MA) 2-for-6 with two RBI, a run scored and a double. Sophomore catcher Nina Polando (SWANSEA, MA) and freshman first baseman Cindy Baker (CROMWELL) each drove in two runs.

Against Salem State, Eastern scored twice in the second inning on four hits. Gregory led off the inning with a single and later scored from third on Pabon's only hit of the day. Pabon then made it 2-0 when she scored from second on DePault's RBI single.

Becki Baker (12-14) of Salem State allowed only six ECSU hits while fanning three. She did not walk a batter and hit one. Laurie Gillis had two of Salem's seven hits.

Eastern closes out its season Monday with a Little East Conference doubleheader at Western Connecticut State University at 3:30 p.m. The doubleheader has been postponed twice previously.

**BRIDGEWATER STATE SWEEPS ECSU SOFTBALL 4-3, 10-2**  
**Region's top-ranked team needs three in fifth to win first game**

BRIDGEWATER, Mass. -- Rebecca Antunes drove in two runs with a single in a three-run fifth inning as the Bridgewater State College softball team rallied for a 4-3 first-game victory over Eastern Connecticut State University Thursday en route to a sweep of a doubleheader.

In the nightcap, the Bears scored eight runs over the first three innings and cruised to a 10-2 victory in a contest stopped in the bottom of the sixth inning due to the eight-run rule.

Bridgewater, the top-rated team in the NCAA Division III Northeast Region, improves to 27-3 while ECSU drops to 15-19.

Senior shortstop Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON) was 3-for-4 for Eastern in the first game. Trailing 3-1, Bridgewater scored three times in the fifth on three hits and an ECSU error. Antunes drove in two runs with a single while Jen Goodwin doubled in another.

Susan Brady won her 11th straight decision for Bridgewater in the nightcap. She allowed only four hits while striking out three. She did not walk a batter. Eleven of Bridgewater's 19 hits on the day were doubles.

Eastern travels to face Western Connecticut State University Friday at 3:30 p.m. in a Little East Conference doubleheader.

### ECSU SOFTBALL MOVES INTO FIRST PLACE IN LITTLE EAST

**Warriors trounce Rhode Island College twice 12-2, 21-6 to move one game up**

PROVIDENCE, RI -- The Eastern Connecticut State University women's softball team, picked to finish fifth in the six-team Little East Conference, moved into sole possession of first place by trouncing Rhode Island College 12-2, 21-6 Wednesday. The second game was called after five innings.

Eastern (15-17) takes over sole possession of first place, one game ahead of idle Western Connecticut State University. The Warriors, who were picked to finish only ahead of the University of Southern Maine in the pre-season coaches' poll, have won seven of eight in conference play while pre-season favorite Western Connecticut is unbeaten with a 4-0 record with six conference games remaining. Eastern meets Western Friday in a doubleheader at Danbury in its final conference games.

Eastern, which defeated Rhode Island College (12-18/0-10) for the 22nd and 23rd consecutive times, pounded out 37 hits in the doubleheader, eight good for extra bases. Seven starters had at least four hits and eight scored at least three runs.

Senior shortstop Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON) and sophomore catcher Nina Polando (SWANSEA) each had five hits and five RBI in the doubleheader. Polando scored four runs, Marchetti three. Freshman leftfielder Kelly Rodman (WALLINGFORD), senior centerfielder Collene Gregory (SHARON), freshman third baseman Michelle Cunningham (BARNSTABLE, MA), freshman first baseman Cindy Baker (CROMWELL) and freshman rightfielder Christy Pabon (SOUTHINGTON) each had four hits. Among Cunningham's hits were two doubles and a home run, the home run giving her five this season and tying her for the season record. Marchetti had a triple in each game while Gregory scored four runs and drove in four.

Leading 3-2 in the seventh inning of the first game, Eastern scored nine times on eight hits and three errors to make a winner of sophomore Kristine Suhanosky (MILFORD). Suhanosky pitched a complete-game four-hitter, fanning two and walking two.

Eastern, which has won half of its 24 northern games, travels to face Bridgewater State College Thursday in a 3 p.m. doubleheader rescheduled from April 10. Bridgewater is the No.-1 ranked team in the Northeast Region.

**EASTERN SOFTBALL DROPS DOUBLEHEADER TO RIVAL ITHACA**

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Ithaca College exploded for 18 runs and 28 hits in sweeping Eastern Connecticut State University 8-3, 10-1 Saturday in college softball

Ithaca (15-6), ranked in a tie for second in the NCAA Northeast Region, extended its winning streak to eight while ECSU falls to 12-16. ECSU, which committed seven errors on the day, has lost five straight.

Ithaca jumped on top early in both games, taking an 8-0 lead in the first game and scoring five runs in the first three innings of the nightcap. Junior Nicki Swan (10-5) pitched a six-hitter en route to her sixth straight win in the first game and sophomore Rebecca Laformara (5-1) spaced two hits in easing to the second-game victory.

Senior Jennifer Hoselton and Swan each had two hits and drove in two runs in the first game. Eastern was led by freshman rightfielder Christy Pabon (SOUTHINGTON), who collected three of Eastern's six first-game hits. Freshman second baseman Michelle DePault (COVENTRY) drove in two runs with a fifth inning double.

In the second game, five Ithaca players had two or more hits in a 17-hit attack, led by junior Marie Kelly's four. Hoselton had three hits, including an RBI double. Senior shortstop Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON) had both of ECSU's hits. Marchetti broke up Laformara's bid for a no-hitter and shutout with an RBI double in the fourth. Marchetti also had a seventh inning single off Laformara, who only allowed five baserunners.

Eastern travels to Massachusetts Dartmouth Sunday for a 1 p.m. Little East Conference doubleheader.

### ECSU SPLITS LITTLE EAST SOFTBALL DOUBLEHEADER

**Cunningham drives in five runs with two homers in second-game win**

NORTH DARTMOUTH, Mass. -- Freshman third baseman Michelle Cunningham (BARNSTABLE, MA) broke a second-game tie in the seventh inning with her second home run of the game to lift the Eastern Connecticut State University softball team to an 11-9 win over the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth in Little East Conference action Sunday.

In the first game, Kelly Roy drove in four runs with three hits as the Corsairs (19-9,5-5) handed ECSU (13-17, 5-1) its first conference loss 8-2. The first-game victory was UMass' fifth straight overall and ECSU's sixth straight loss overall.

The Warriors scored five times in driving starting pitcher Shannon O'Malley out of the box in the first inning of the second game but UMass battled back, tying the game 8-8 with three runs on five hits in the bottom of the sixth.

In the seventh, the Warriors batted around, the first five batters reaching safely. Cunningham, who had hit a two-run home run on the first pitch from reliever Elisa Paparo (11-7) in the first inning, slammed a three-run home run off Paparo with no one out in the seventh, plating senior shortstop Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON) and senior centerfielder Collene Gregory (SHARON) ahead of her.

Freshman Holly Silva (WATERFORD) allowed 17 hits in going the distance in the second game for Eastern but did not walk a batter and stranded eight runners. After UMass had tied the game 8-8, Silva retired Roy on a fly ball to right to end the inning with the go-ahead run on third. It was the only time Roy was retired on the day. She finished 6-for-7 with four doubles.

On the day, freshman second baseman Michelle DePault (COVENTRY) was 5-for-8 with four runs scored and a walk and had 12 putouts and two assists without an error in the field. Cunningham was 4-for-7 with five RBI and two runs scored. In addition to tying a program record with two home runs, Cunningham also doubled in the second game, leaving her one shy of the game record of 11 total bases (set by Marchetti earlier this year).

Freshman first baseman Cindy Baker (CROMWELL) also had three hits on the day for ECSU while Gregory had two hits and a walk, scored three runs and drove in two. For UMass, Jill Cross was 5-for-8 with two runs and two RBI in the doubleheader, Maureen Maloney 5-for-9 with five RBI and four runs scored. In the second game, Maloney was 4-for-5 with four RBI and three runs scored from the leadoff slot.

Eastern travels to unbeaten conference leader Western Connecticut State University Tuesday at 3:30 p.m. in a doubleheader rescheduled from April 16.

NORTH ADAMS, Mass. -- Sophomore Kristine Suhanosky (MILFORD) pitched a complete-game five-hitter in the opener and the Eastern Connecticut State University softball team went on to split a doubleheader with North Adams State College Thursday.

Senior centerfield Collene Gregory (SHARON) backed Suhanosky's pitching by driving in three runs in ECSU's 6-2 first-game win. Kate Sampson tossed a complete-game two-hitter in the nightcap to lift the Mohawks to an 8-0 win in the nightcap in a game stopped after five innings.

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- Kristine Suhanosky (MILFORD) and Holly Silva (WATERFORD) limited the Johnson & Wales University softball team to seven hits as Eastern Connecticut State University swept a doubleheader 13-0, 8-0 Tuesday.

### ECSU SOFTBALL SALVAGES ONE WIN AT SAINT JOSEPH'S INVITE

*Eight players collect at least two hits in 10-8 win over Elms College*

STANDISH, Maine -- Senior Collene Gregory (SHARON) and freshman Cindy Baker (CROMWELL) each went 3-for-3 to highlight a 19-hit Eastern Connecticut State University softball attack as the Warriors trimmed Elms College 10-8 in eight innings Sunday to salvage one win at the Saint Joseph's College Invitational.

In ECSU's first game Sunday, Cindy Komszik pitched a complete-game five-hitter and Dani Bernier drove in five runs with a single, double and home run to pace host Saint Joseph's (22-6) to a 9-3 victory.

Against Elms (5-7), Eastern scored twice in the top of the eighth inning to break an 8-8 tie en route to its first win after five straight losses. Freshman Michelle DePault (COVENTRY) scored on the front end of a double steal for the first run of the eighth and sophomore Nina Polando (SWANSEA, MA) drove in freshman Kelly Rodman (WALLINGFORD) with a double for the second run. DePault and Rodman had opened the inning with singles.

Gregory and Baker each had three hits for Eastern (9-11) while DePault, Rodman, Polando, senior Sarah Marchetti (TORRINGTON) and freshmen Michelle Cunningham (BARNSTABLE, MA) and Christy Pabon (SOUTHINGTON) each had two.

The teams combined for 12 runs in the final three innings. ### ECSU SOFTBALL SWEEPS LITTLE EAST CONFERENCE DOUBLEHEADER

*Warriors rally from 7-0 deficit in win nightcap*

WILLIMANTIC, Conn. -- The Eastern Connecticut State University softball team rallied from a seven-run deficit to win the nightcap and post a doubleheader sweep of Plymouth State College in the first Little East Conference games ever for both teams Friday.

DePault and Rodman -- the 1-2 hitters in the order -- each had four hits in the doubleheader, as did Marchetti.
